A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to firefighters; modifying provisions

- 2 regulating employment and appointments; and providing for
- 3 an effective date.

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5 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 15-5-107, 15-5-108,
- 8 15-5-122(a)(intro) and 15-5-204(d) are amended to read:

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- 10 15-5-107. Employment and appointments generally;
- 11 requirements; veterans; grading; reexamination.

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- 13 Only those persons who are seventy-five percent (75%) or
- 14 more proficient may be certified for employment., and if
- 15 certified for employment in a fire department are adults
- 16 under thirty-three (33) years of age, except this age
- 17 requirement does not apply to any person employed as the

1 chief of a department A local fire commission may establish a higher required proficiency, in which case only those 2 3 persons meeting the higher standard shall be certified by 4 the commission for employment. The examination requirements 5 of this section shall not apply to a person meeting the conditions of W.S. 15-5-122(a) if the person is employed by 6 a police department. The age and examination requirements 7 of this section shall not apply to a person meeting the 8 9 conditions of W.S. 15-5-122 (a) if the person is employed by 10 a fire department. All other things being equal, persons 11 honorably discharged from the military service of the 12 United States shall be given preference for employment over 13 other candidates. Those examined shall be graded upon their 14 examinations and their approved ratings or grades entered in a register. Those Eligible applicants for the fire 15 16 department shall remain on the registers two (2) years, 17 except the hiring authority of each department may choose the option of a one (1) year register. Applicants for the 18 19 police department shall remain on the register one (1) 20 year, without reexamination and certification. 21 the commission, in its discretion, may require further 22 examination as to physical fitness, health and qualifications prior to certifying the applicant to the 23 24 governing body for employment.

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2 15-5-108. Employment and appointments generally;

3 manner of filling positions.

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5 If a position is to be filled in either department, the governing body or chief of the department shall request 6 7 from the commission the names of three (3) eligible persons, except in the case of police departments the names 8 9 of five (5) eligible persons. shall be requested. Upon 10 request, the commission shall certify for fire departments 11 the names of the three (3) and for police departments the 12 five (5) qualified applicants having the highest percentage 13 of proficiency, one (1) of whom shall be employed. If all persons certified are unsuitable for the position, the 14 commission shall certify additional names, but the reason 15 for certification of the additional names shall be stated 16 17 in the certificate. If there are no registered, eligible applicants, the commission 18 may allow provisional 19 employment, or it may authorize the appointive authority to 20 select a suitable person for examination, and if qualified, 21 that person shall be certified for employment.

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(d) No fireman is entitled to draw a disability 14

pension if the primary cause of the mental or physical 15

17 alcoholism, dope substance abuse or addiction or an injury

incurred as a result of the commission of a crime of a 18

voluntary nature, or a mental or physical condition which 19

20 existed at the time of his employment. Firemen employed in

21 violation of the maximum age requirement specified in W.S.

22 15-5-107 are not qualified to receive a disability pension.
