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16 **31-7-102. Definitions.**

1 2 (a) As used in this act: 3 4 (xxv) "License", "driver's license", "commercial 5 driver's license", or "instruction permit" or "intermediate permit" means any a license or permit secured by a person 6 7 from the division, in accordance with this act which grants the privilege to drive or operate a motor vehicle on the 8 9 public highways, streets and roads of this state; 10 31-7-108. Persons not to be licensed; investigation 11 12 by the division. 13 14 (a) No driver's license shall be issued to any person who is under the age of sixteen (16) seventeen (17) years, 15 except as provided in W.S. 31-7-110 and 31-7-117(c). 16 17 18 31-7-109. 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31-7-110. Instruction and temporary driver's permits. 1

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Any person who is at least fifteen (15) years of 3 4 age may apply to the division for an instruction permit. 5 The division, after the applicant has successfully passed all parts of the examination other than the driving test, 6 may issue to the applicant an instruction permit which 7 entitles the applicant while having the permit in his 8 9 immediate possession to drive a specified type or class of 10 motor vehicle for a period of one (1) year when accompanied 11 by a person at least eighteen (18) years of age who has 12 been licensed as a driver for the type or class of vehicle 13 being used for at least one (1) year holds a valid driver's 14 license, who is fit and capable of exercising control over the vehicle and who is occupying a seat beside the driver. 15 16 This subsection does not apply to motorcycle instruction 17 permits.

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19 (b) Any person at least fifteen (15) years of age may 20 apply to the division for a motorcycle instruction permit. 21 The division, after the applicant has successfully passed a 22 written examination and a vision test may issue to the applicant instruction permit which entitles 23 an the 24 applicant to drive a motorcycle for a period of ninety (90)

days without a passenger. If the applicant also passes a 1

The division, after applicant has successfully passed all parts of 14 examination other than the driving test, may issue to the 15 instruction permit which entitles 16 applicant an the 17 applicant while having the permit in his possession to drive a class "C" motor vehicle for a period 18 19 of sixty (60) days when accompanied by a person at least 20 eighteen (18) years of age who has been licensed as a 21 driver for a class "C" vehicle for at least one (1) year 22 holds a valid class "C" driver's license, who is fit and capable of exercising control over the vehicle and who is 23 24 occupying a seat beside the driver.

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2 (g) Any person, who is at least sixteen (16) years of 3 age and has held an instruction permit pursuant to 4 subsection (a) or (f) of this section, or in the case of an 5 applicant for an intermediate motorcycle permit an instruction permit pursuant to subsection (b) of this 6 7 section, or a similar permit from another jurisdiction and has completed practice driving of at least fifty (50) 8 9 actual driving hours, including at least ten (10) hours of 10 night driving, may apply to the division for an 11 intermediate permit that entitles the applicant to drive a 12 specified type or class of motor vehicle. No permit may be 13 issued unless a parent or quardian certifies the applicant 14 has completed the practice driving requirements.

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16 (h) A person operating a motor vehicle, other than a 17 motorcycle, with an intermediate permit:

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(i) May not transport more than one (1) passenger under the age of eighteen (18) who is not a member of the permittee's immediate family unless accompanied by a person at least eighteen (18) years of age who holds a valid driver's license for the type or class of vehicle being used and provided that all occupants of the

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4	(ii) Shall only be upon a public highway between
5	the hours of 5:00 a.m. and 11:00 p.m. unless:

12	evidenced by a signed statement from medical personnel;

11 31-7-126. Reporting of convictions and failure to 12 appear by courts.

Every court having jurisdiction under any statute of this state or a municipal ordinance adopted by local authority regulating the driving of motor vehicles, shall forward to the division within ten (10) working days from the date of conviction a record of the conviction of any person in the court for a violation of any of those laws or ordinances, other than those regulating standing or parking of a motor vehicle. Each court in this state shall also forward to the division within ten (10) working days from the date of conviction a record of the conviction of any person under nineteen (19) years of age in the court for a violation of

any law regarding the possession, delivery, manufacture or 1 use of a controlled substance or alcohol. The court shall 2 also forward to the division a report of any violation by 3 4 any person of a written promise to appear in court as given 5 to the arresting officer upon the issuance of a traffic citation and any failure to appear in court at the time 6 specified by the court. Failure of a court to forward a 7 record of conviction or violation under this section within 8 9 the time specified in this section from the date of

21 seventeen (17) on September 16, 2005 and who do not have a

22 valid driver's license from this state or another
