6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 41-3-110 by creating a new subsection
- 9 (e) is amended to read:

10

- 11 41-3-110. Right to acquire temporary water rights for
- 12 highway or railroad roadbed construction or repair;
- 13 application; restrictions; fee.

- 15 (e) Notwithstanding the requirements of W.S.
- 16 41-3-101, an incorporated municipality which is the owner
- 17 of any adjudicated or valid unadjudicated water storage

1 right, may apply to the state engineer under subsection (b) 2 of this section for the release and temporary use of water 3 stored under the right for the purpose of nonconsumptive 4 use. The state engineer may approve the application for 5 nonconsumptive temporary use if the following conditions 6 are met: 7 (i) Upon receipt of an application for use of 8 9 water under this subsection, the state engineer shall 10 determine the feasibility of providing flow and impacts on 11 the hydrology of the stream segment and any other findings 12 and conclusions as he deems appropriate. For those 13 applications where the nonconsumptive use is for instream 14 flow purposes the flow shall be the minimum amount necessary to maintain or improve existing fisheries; 15 16 17 (ii) The nonconsumptive use within a occurs 18 natural stream channel through a stream segment limited as 19 follows: 20 21 From a point upstream of the applying 22 municipality where the municipal boundary intersects the 23 stream to a point downstream from the departure of the

1 stream from the municipal boundary designated by the state 2 engineer as optimum for his office's administration; 3 4 The downstream limit shall not exceed (B) 5 one (1) mile from the municipal boundary. 6 7 (iii) No other owner of an adjudicated or valid unadjudicated water right with a point of diversion located 8 9 downstream from the stream segment under consideration by 10 the state engineer for the temporary nonconsumptive use is 11 willing, at no cost to the owner of the water right, to 12 beneficially use all of the released storage water according 13 to the conditions set forth in the owner's existing 14 downstream water right; 15 16 (iv) As evidence of meeting the requirements of 17 paragraph (ii) of this subsection, the municipality applying 18 for the temporary nonconsumptive use shall publish, at the 19 applicant's expense, for three (3) consecutive weeks in a 20 newspaper of general circulation in the county where the 21 temporary transfer is to occur, a notice specifying the 22 description of the stream segment, the volume, rate and 23 timing of the municipal storage release that would be

1 available for beneficial use, at no cost, to a downstream 2 owner of an adjudicated or valid unadjudicated water right; 3 4 The state engineer determines that a  $(\vee)$ 5 temporary change of use under this subsection will not 6 injure any other appropriator of the state's water; 7 (vi) This subsection is repealed effective July 8 9 1, 2011. 10 Section 2. The state engineer, in conjunction with the 11 12 Wyoming water development office, shall report to the governor and the select water committee on the potential 13 impact of this act on existing and future water storage in 14 Wyoming. The report shall be filed no later than October 1, 15 2006 and shall include any recommendations for statutory 16 17 change. 18 19 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 20 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 21 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 22 Constitution. 23 24 (END)
