A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to hospitals and health care providers;
- 2 providing for payments to hospitals for unreimbursed trauma
- 3 care, as specified; requiring reports; authorizing a
- 4 position; providing appropriations; and providing for an
- 5 effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

9 Section 1.

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11 (a) As used in this act:

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- 13 (i) "Acute care hospital" means a hospital
- 14 licensed in Wyoming pursuant to W.S. 35-2-901 through
- 15 35-2-911 and which provides acute patient care;

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1 (ii) "Costs" means one hundred percent (100%) of 2 the Medicaid reimbursement as of January 1, 2005 for any 3 service incurred to provide trauma care services, including 4 health care provider services, provided to individuals with 5 income not exceeding two hundred fifty percent (250%) of the federal poverty level; 6 7 (iii) "Department" means the Wyoming department 8 9 of health; 10 11 (iv) "Health care provider" means a person who is licensed, certified or otherwise authorized by the law 12 13 of this state to provide health care in the ordinary course of business or practice of a profession, but does not 14 include a person who provides health care solely through 15 16 the sale or dispensing of drugs or medical devices; 17 (v) "Incident" means an admission, or related 18 19 series of admissions, both inpatient and outpatient, 20 involving traumatic care for an individual patient within a 21 one (1) year period to a single hospital. Admissions of 22 the same patient for causes not directly related to an

earlier admission shall be considered a separate incident;

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(vi) "Trauma care services" means services to 1 2 patients with at least one (1) injury diagnosis code, using the International Classification of Diseases, 9th Edition, 3 4 from 800.0 through 904, 925 through 929, 940 through 959.9, 5 and 994.7, plus at least one (1) of the following: 6 7 (A) Hospitalization for one (1) calendar 8 day; 9 10 (B) Admission to the intensive care unit or 11 monitored bed unit; 12 13 (C) Cardiac or respiratory arrest on route to the hospital or emergency room; 14 15 16 (D) Dead on arrival at the facility; 17 18 (E) Transfer from or to another acute care hospital; 19 20 21 (F) Admission directly from the emergency room to the operating room; 22 23 24 (G) Trauma team activation;

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2 (H) Meets prehospital triage criteria.

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4 (b) Acute care hospitals and health care providers

5 shall be reimbursed on a per incident basis for one-half

6 (1/2) of the unreimbursed costs incurred, subject to the

7 following:

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9 (i) There is compliance with the reporting

10 requirements of the Wyoming trauma care program registry

11 before the request for reimbursement;

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13 (ii) Incidents shall not be aggregated from one

14 (1) hospital to another;

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16 (iii) Reimbursement shall be available for costs

incurred after June 30, 2005 and before July 1, 2006;

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19 (iv) Any amounts received from or reasonably

20 expected to be received from insurance, the patient or any

21 other source on behalf of the patient for expenses incurred

22 by the patient for the incident shall be deducted from the

23 costs. Where a payment plan for monthly or other periodic

24 payments has been established with the patient, or any

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1 person on behalf of the patient, only those payments

2 expected to be received in the first year after the due

3 date of the first bill sent to the patient shall be

4 considered;

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6 (v) Requests for reimbursement may be submitted

7 to the health department for payment only after one hundred

8 eighty (180) days have elapsed from the date the bill for

9 the services rendered was sent to the patient or his

10 representative, and only after good faith efforts have been

11 made to collect the bill.

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13 (c) The department shall promulgate rules and

14 regulations to administer this program on behalf of the

15 state of Wyoming. The department may contract with a

16 fiscal agent to make the actual payments and conduct any

17 necessary audits of reimbursement requests. Reimbursement

18 requests shall be made in a form and manner prescribed by

19 the department. The department or its agent on its behalf

20 may request any documentation it deems necessary to support

21 any request for reimbursement.

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23 (d) If during any month the department finds that the

24 reimbursement requests reasonably expected during the

1 following month are likely to exceed the appropriation

2 available, the department shall set the last day of that

3 following month as the cutoff date for the submission of

4 requests for reimbursement and shall prorate the payment of

5 reimbursement requests received during that following month

6 to assure that the expenditures do not exceed the

7 appropriation. If necessary to avoid exceeding the

8 appropriation, the department may prorate the payment of

9 expenditure requests received during the month the

10 determination is made.

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12 (e) If, for a claim which has been submitted, the

acute care hospital receives further reimbursement on or in

14 behalf of the patient which was not part of a monthly

15 payment plan or was not otherwise planned for, the acute

16 care hospital shall inform the department and one-half

17 (1/2) of the amount received shall be deducted from future

18 payments to the hospital. When no further payments are to

19 be made to the hospital under this act, the hospital shall

20 remit to the department any remaining balances from

21 reimbursements not deducted from payments. The department

22 shall deposit remittance from this source into the general

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23 fund.

The department shall not reimburse any one (1) 1 (f)

2 acute care hospital in a cumulative amount greater than

3 twenty-five percent (25%) of the appropriation in section 2

4 of this act. However, if the department reasonably

5 concludes as of May 31, 2006, that the appropriation will

not be fully expended, the remaining funds may be used to 6

7 reimburse hospitals on a pro rata basis above the twenty-

five percent (25%) limit of this subsection, subject to the 8

9 requirements of subsection (b) of this section.

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Section 2. There is appropriated to the department of 11

dollars 12 two million five hundred thousand health

13 (\$2,500,000.00) from the general fund for the program set

forth in section 1 of this act and fifty thousand dollars 14

(\$50,000.00) from the general fund to administer the 15

16 program. One (1) position is authorized for the department

17 to administer the program created by this act.

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19 Section 3. On or before December 1, 2005, the

20 department of health shall report to the joint

21 appropriations and the joint labor, health and social

22 services interim committees on the status of the program

including costs of services and 23 how funds have been

24 expended.

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Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon 2

3 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming 4

5 Constitution.
