A BILL

for

AN ACT relating to nursing; amending requirements for the 1 2 practice of nursing as specified; providing for the regulation of advance practice registered nurses; providing 3 4 definitions; providing for the membership of the board of 5 nursing; providing that the board shall report violations 6 of the act to prosecuting attorneys; authorizing the board 7 to collect data; amending fees; providing that board rules and regulations may be more stringent than federal rules; 8 providing qualifications for an executive director; 9 10 providing for examinations; removing grace period for renewal of licenses; providing for approval and evaluation 11 of nursing education programs and providing for a fee; 12 providing for competency examinations; providing for 13 14 unlicensed practice in the case of emergency or disaster;

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1 providing for licensure of nurse volunteers; and providing 2 for an effective date.
