A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to crimes and offenses; establishing the  
2 crime of voyeurism; providing a definition; providing  
3 penalties; and providing for an effective date.

5 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

7 **Section 1.** W.S. 6-4-304 is created to read:

8

9 **6-4-304. Voyeurism; penalties; "peep" defined.**

11 (a) A person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by  
12 imprisonment for not more than six (6) months, a fine of  
13 not more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00), or  
14 both, if he, without the consent of the person being  
15 viewed, commits the crime of voyeurism by:

1 (i) Peeping;

2

3 (ii) Going upon the land of another with the  
4 intent to peep; or

5

6 (iii) Peeping into an area where an occupant of  
7 the area reasonably can be expected to disrobe, including:

8

9 (A) Restrooms;

10

11 (B) Baths;

12

13 (C) Showers; or

14

15 (D) Dressing or fitting rooms.

16

17 (b) A person is guilty of a felony punishable by  
18 imprisonment for not more than two (2) years, a fine of not  
19 more than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00), or both, if he  
20 commits the offense specified in subsection (a) of this  
21 section and the offense is knowingly or intentionally  
22 committed by means of a camera, a video camera or any other  
23 type of video recording device.

1           (c) For purposes of this section, "peep" means any  
2 looking of a clandestine, surreptitious, prying or  
3 secretive nature into an enclosed area where the person  
4 being viewed has a reasonable expectation of privacy.

5

6           **Section 2.** This act is effective immediately upon  
7 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law  
8 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming  
9 Constitution.
