15 (d) Whether or not the licensee gives his written 16 consent, the content of the record may be disclosed as 17 follows:

19 <u>(vi) To the state board or commission regulating</u> 20 <u>the licensee, if the diagnosis or prognosis determines a</u> 21 <u>clearly definable drug or alcohol abuse problem and the</u> 22 <u>licensee refuses to seek treatment.</u>
