## A BILL

for

- AN ACT relating to the Wyoming national guard; establishing

  Wyoming national guard educational assistance trust fund;

  specifying use of trust fund investment income; accordingly

  modifying educational assistance payments for guard members
- 5 and specifying full payment of tuition and fees to the
- 6 extent funds are available; providing an appropriation and
- 7 for transferring of funds; and providing for an effective
- 8 date.

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10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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12 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-9-505 is created to read:

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- 14 19-9-505. Wyoming national guard educational
- 15 assistance trust fund; established; corpus inviolate;

1 investment by state treasurer; expenditure of investment

2 earnings; annual report.

4 (a) An account within the trust and agency fund is
5 established which shall be referred to as the Wyoming
6 national guard educational assistance trust fund. The
7 trust fund shall consist of those funds designated to the
8 account by law.

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10 Monies deposited into the trust fund established (b) 11 pursuant to this section are inviolate and constitute a 12 permanent or perpetual trust fund. The monies shall be 13 transmitted to the state treasurer for credit to the trust 14 fund and shall be invested by the state treasurer as authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 in a manner to obtain the 15 16 highest return possible consistent with the preservation of 17 the corpus. The interest earned from investment of the corpus of the trust fund shall be annually credited by the 18 state treasurer not later than June 30 of each year into a 19 20 separate account within the trust and agency fund. 21 expenditure of amounts credited to this separate investment 22 income account shall be made by the adjutant general for educational assistance payments for active members of the 23 Wyoming national guard authorized under W.S. 19-9-503. 24

2 (c) Commencing September 1, 2006, and each September 3 1 thereafter, the adjutant general shall provide an annual 4 report to the governor and the joint appropriations interim 5 committee specifying the total amount of interest income earned from the trust fund during the preceding state 6 7 fiscal year and the total amount of educational assistance provided from the interest income during the same reporting 8 9 period.

through (iii) and by creating a new subsection (c) is
amended to read:

To be eligible to participate in the plan members 2 shall: 3 4 (b) To the extent amounts are available within the 5 Wyoming national guard educational assistance trust fund investment income account, members meeting the requirements 6 7 subsection (a) of this section may shall receive educational assistance benefit payments as follows: 8 9 10 (i) For authorized courses at a Wyoming public 11 institution of higher education, payment may shall be made 12 for up to the full cost of tuition and mandatory fees; 13 (ii) For authorized courses at a Wyoming private 14 institution of higher education, payment may shall be made 15 for the lesser of the actual costs of tuition and mandatory 16 17 fees or an amount equal to the average resident tuition and mandatory fee charges of all Wyoming public institutions of 18 higher education for an undergraduate student enrolled for 19 20 twelve (12) semester hours; 21 (iii) Eligible members who are not 22 23 residents may shall receive benefits payments as provided 24 in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subsection, but the

1 benefit payment shall not exceed the amount of tuition and

2 mandatory fees which would have been charged if the member

3 were a Wyoming resident;

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- 5 (c) If amounts within the Wyoming national guard
- 6 trust fund investment income account established under W.S.
- 7 19-9-505(b) are not sufficient to make tuition and
- 8 mandatory fee payments under this section, the adjutant
- 9 general or his designee shall make a pro rata reduction in
- 10 payments to institutions on behalf of active members until
- 11 such time as sufficient amounts become available.

- 15 (a) Fourteen million dollars (\$14,000,000.00) is
- 16 appropriated from the general fund to the national guard
- 17 educational assistance trust fund established by W.S.
- 18 19-9-505(a), as created under section 1 of this act. Funds
- 19 appropriated under this subsection shall be deposited into
- 20 a separate account within the trust and agency fund in
- 21 accordance with W.S. 19-9-505(a).

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- 23 (b) Any unobligated and unencumbered amount remaining
- 24 within the 2005-2006 biennial budget of the military

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1 department for national guard educational assistance

2 pursuant to 2004 Wyoming Session Laws, Chapter 95, Section

3 007, shall be transferred to and deposited within the

4 Wyoming national guard educational assistance trust fund

5 investment income account established under W.S.

6 19-9-505(b) as created under section 1 of this act.

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8 Section 4. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
