A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the board of examiners in optometry; amending definitions; providing for 2 licensure of optometrists; providing authority to practice during an 3 externship; providing for staggered terms for board 4 5 members; providing for annual election of officers; providing for compensation for board members; providing for 6 7 background checks; providing for reciprocal licensure of 8 optometrists; providing for disciplinary proceedings for optometrists; and providing for an effective date. 9

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7 (a) Employees of substitute care providers certified

by the department of family services pursuant to W.S. 8

general or the adaptation of lenses or frames for the aid 1 2 thereof. 3 4 (b)(c) The provisions of this chapter do not prevent 5 a duly licensed physician and surgeon, physician from treating or fitting glasses to the human eye, or a duly 6 7 licensed physician and surgeon, oculist, or physician or optometrist from filling prescriptions or orders. T Nor do 8 9 they the provisions of this chapter prevent the replacing, 10 duplicating or repairing of ophthalmic lenses or the frames 11 or fittings thereof by persons qualified to write or fill 12 prescriptions or orders under the provisions of this act, 13 nor prevent the doing of the merely mechanical work upon 14 such lenses or upon the frames or fittings thereof. by an optical mechanic. 15 16 17 (c)(d) It is unlawful for any person to dispense, replace or duplicate an ophthalmic lens or ophthalmic 18 19 lenses or any contact lenses without a prescription or 20 order from a duly licensed physician and surgeon, oculist 21 or optometrist. Contact lenses may be sold or dispensed in 22 a retail optical dispensary or other permanently

established place of business with an optical department

only when the prescription specifically states on its face

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that it is intended for contact lenses and includes the 1 type and specification of the contact lens being prescribed 2 3 A contact lens prescription shall specifically state that 4 it is intended for contact lenses and include the type and 5 specification of the contact lenses being prescribed. An optometrist shall provide, at no additional cost 6 7 requested by a to the patient, a written copy of his contact lens prescription. The prescription shall only be 8 9 released after the contact lenses have been adequately 10 fitted and no more follow-up visits are necessary to assure 11 the contact lenses fit the patient. The essential 12 information necessary to duplicate the prescription shall 13 be defined by rules adopted by the board. All contact lens prescriptions shall have an expiration date after which it 14 unlawful to fill such prescription. 15 shall be prescribing optometrist shall not be liable for any injury 16 17 or condition to a patient resulting from negligence in packaging, manufacturing or dispensing lenses by anyone 18 other than the prescribing optometrist. Any person may file 19 20 a complaint with the board seeking disciplinary action 21 concerning any violation of this subsection. The board 22 shall investigate or cause to be investigated and shall resolve a complaint on its own motion or upon receipt of a 23 written complaint as provided by W.S. 33-23-110. No person 24

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1 shall improperly fill a contact lens prescription or fill 2 an expired prescription. 3 4 (d) (e) The provisions of this chapter do not prohibit 5 the sale of goggles, sunglasses, colored glasses or occupational eye-protective devices if they do not have 6 7 refractive values, nor do the provisions of this act prohibit the sale of complete ready-to-wear eyeglasses as 8 9 merchandise by any person not holding himself out as 10 competent to examine, test or prescribe for the human eye 11 or its refractive errors. 12 13 (e) (f) Nothing in W.S. 33-23-101 through 33-23-117 14 this act shall prevent an optometrist from using assistants his practice under his direct personal general 15 supervision in the office in which the optometrist 16 17 practices his profession as defined in board rule. 18 19 33-23-102. Optometrist's use of certain drugs; 20 limitation. 21 22 An optometrist licensed according to the statutes of the

state of Wyoming shall be allowed to administer and

prescribe pharmaceutical agents related to the practice of

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1 optometry, excluding the following categories of oral

2 medications: immunosuppressives, steroids, anti-fungals,

3 sedative-hypnotics, and schedule I and II narcotics. No

4 medication shall be given by injection. Oral anti-glaucoma

5 medications may be administered for a period not to exceed

6 forty-eight (48) hours. A licensed An optometrist who

7 administers or prescribes pharmaceutical agents for

8 examination or for treatment shall provide the same

9 standard of care to patients as that provided by a

10 physician licensed in this state utilizing the same

11 pharmaceutical agents for examination or treatment.

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33-23-103. License required; civil suit; damages.

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15 (a) It is unlawful for any person in the state of
16 Wyoming to practice or attempt to practice optometry or to
17 advertise, or hold himself out as qualified to fit or
18 adjust any lenses or lens in any manner or form as an aid
19 to human eyesight, without first obtaining a certificate

20 license to practice optometry.

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(c) A person who is attending an optometry school
accredited by a regional or professional accreditation
organization which is recognized or approved by the United

1 States Department of Education (USDE) or the Council on

2 Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA), or their successor

3 agencies, may practice optometry while doing an externship

4 for said school under the direct supervision of an

5 optometrist or physician licensed in this state.

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7 33-23-104. Board of examiners in optometry; created;

8 composition; designation; duties generally; appointment;

9 qualifications and terms of members; vacancies; oath.

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11 The Wyoming state board of examiners in optometry is 12 created to carry out the purposes and enforce the 13 provisions of this act. The board shall consist of three 14 (3) members appointed by the governor. In 2005, one (1) 15 board member shall be appointed for a term of three (3) 16 years, one (1) board member shall be appointed for a term 17 of two (2) years- and one (1) board member shall be appointed for a term of one (1) year. Thereafter, the 18 19 terms of the office of the members appointed shall be three 20 (3) years or until their successors have qualified. 21 member of the board shall be a resident of the state of 22 Wyoming and shall have been engaged in the actual practice of optometry in the state for at least one (1) year prior 23

to appointment. The governor shall make all appointments to

1 fill vacancies caused by death, resignation or removal.

- 4 their duties, shall take and subscribe to the oath required

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8 33-23-105. Board of examiners in optometry; officers;

9 powers of members; meetings; quorum; records.

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11 Said The board shall choose at its first meeting, and

12 annually thereafter, one (1) of its members as president,

13 and one (1) as secretary and treasurer thereof elect

14 officers. Each member of the board shall have the power,

15 during his term of office to administer oaths and take

16 affidavits, certifying thereto under his hand and seal

17 provided and kept by the board. Said The board shall meet

18 at least once in each year, for the purpose of holding an

19 examination, and in addition thereto, whenever and wherever

20 the president or secretary, by order of the president,

21 shall call a meeting—upon the call of the president or

22 request of a majority of its members. A majority of said

23 <u>the</u> board shall constitute a quorum. The secretary shall

24 keep a complete record of the proceedings of the board,

1 which record shall be open to public inspection at all

4 33-23-106. Board of examiners in optometry; per diem 5 and expenses of members; disposition of funds.

(a) Each member of the board may receive as compensation ten dollars (\$10.00) for each day actually engaged in the duties of his office, and per diem and mileage as is allowed state officers the sum paid each day to members of the state legislature for each day spent in board meetings and per diem and mileage as is paid state employees. Expenses shall be paid from the fees, fines and assessments received under the provisions of this act. All fees, fines, assessments and other moneys monies received under the provisions of this act, may be used for meeting the expenses of the board and in carrying out the provisions of this act. In no event shall any expenses be charged against the state.

33-23-109. Examinations required of applicants for licensure; qualifications; existing practitioners, passing grade; reexamination; fees; renewal of license; retirement.

1 (a) Any applicant for registration licensure under 2 this act is required to pass an the examination series 3 administered by the National Board of Examiners in 4 Optometry, or its successor agency, and any other 5 examination specified by the board in rule. The applicant shall be a graduate of an optometric school or college 6 7 accredited by a regional or professional accreditation organization which is recognized or approved by the council 8 9 postsecondary accreditation or the United States 10 Commissioner of Education maintaining not less than a four 11 (4) year course of not less than one thousand (1,000) hours 12 each year covering the following subjects: general anatomy, 13 general mathematics, general optics, theoretical optometry, practical optics, hygiene, optical laboratory work, general 14 physiology, general physics, ocular pathology, theoretical 15 16 optics, practical optometry, psychology and clinical work. 17 Anyone desiring to commence the practice of optometry after May 22, 1987 shall in addition to these requirements, have 18 satisfactorily completed courses in general and ocular, 19 20 diagnostic and therapeutic pharmacology given by an 21 institution accredited by a regional or professional accreditation organization, which is recognized or approved 22 by the council on postsecondary accreditation or the United 23 24 States Commissioner of Education and approved by the

1 Wyoming Board of Examiners in Optometry Department of 2 Education (USDE) or the Council on Higher Education 3 Accreditation (CHEA), or their successor agencies. 4 Examinations shall cover the above subjects, and other 5 subjects designated by the board. Any currently licensed person intending to employ diagnostic or therapeutic 6 7 pharmaceutical agents in his practice is required to complete and pass a board approved course and pass the 8 9 board examination pertaining to the use of those agents.

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No applicant shall be passed by the board who 11 (b) 12 fails to obtain an average a grade of seventy-five percent 13 (75%) in every subject upon which he is examined. If any applicant fails to pass any examination, he shall be 14 examined at the next or any succeeding examination only in 15 16 the subject in which he failed to obtain an average a grade 17 of eighty-five percent (85%). The applicant shall apply for his certificate of registration license within six (6) 18 months after he has satisfactorily passed the examination 19 the examination shall be of no effect. 20 21 certificates awarded on examination, there shall be printed or stamped the words, "Awarded on Examinations". Before 22 engaging in the practice of optometry, and after the 23 certificate license has been delivered to 24 him,

1 registered licensed optometrist shall notify the secretary of the board in writing of the place where he intends to 2 3 begin practice and of any subsequent changes of his office 4 location. Notices given to him by the board shall be given 5 by mailing to that address. 6 7 (c) In addition to subsections (a) and (b) of this section, an applicant for licensure under this act shall 8 9 provide the board fingerprints and other information 10 necessary for a criminal history record background check as provided under W.S. 7-19-201. 11 12 (c) (d) The board of examiners, pursuant to W.S. 13 33-1-201, shall establish fees for the 14 examination, initial registration license and the annual 15 16 renewal of the certificate of registration license. Every 17 registered optometrist who desires to continue the practice of optometry shall annually, on or before April 1, pay to 18 the secretary of the board the required renewal fee. for a 19 renewal of his certificate. The board shall revoke the 20 21 certificate of a practitioner who fails or refuses to pay 22 the renewal registration fee. No certificate shall be revoked without giving sixty (60) days' notice to the 23 24 delinquent who within such period may renew the certificate

on the payment of the renewal fee, with a penalty of ten 1 2 dollars (\$10.00). If an optometrist notifies the board that 3 he is retiring from practice in Wyoming, retirement from 4 practice for a period of not exceeding three (3) years 5 shall not deprive the holder of the certificate of the right to renew his certificate on payment of the elapsed 6 7 fees, and ten dollars (\$10.00) penalty as provided. Upon retirement from active practice, the optometrist shall 8 notify the secretary writing. A license which has expired 9 10 due to failure to renew may be reinstated by the board upon receipt of the renewal fee and reinstatement and late fees 11 set by the board in accordance with W.S. 33-1-201 provided 12 13 the request for reinstatement is received in the board 14 office no later than June 30 of the year in which the 15 license expired. An optometrist who previously notified the board that he had retired may renew his license by 16 17 submitting renewal fees for each year in which no license was issued and a reinstatement fee within three (3) years 18 19 of the expiration date of the last license held. Upon retirement from active practice, an optometrist shall 20 21 notify the board in writing.

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23 <u>(e) The board may issue a license by endorsement to</u>
24 engage in the practice of optometry to an applicant who is

1 currently licensed in another United States or Canadian 2 jurisdiction with substantially equivalent requirements as Wyoming and who meets Wyoming requirements for licensure by 3 4 endorsement. Applicants for licensure by endorsement shall 5 comply with standards set forth in board rules. 6 7 33-23-110. Refusal, suspension or revocation 8 license. 9 10 The board of examiners in optometry shall may (a) 11 suspend, revoke or refuse to issue the certificate of 12 registration provided for in this act a license to any 13 person who has been quilty of unprofessional and dishonest conduct, or unethical conduct, conduct of a character 14 likely to deceive the public, and may suspend or revoke or 15 16 refuse to renew such certificate for like reasons failure 17 to timely submit a renewal application. 18 "Unprofessional and dishonest conduct" as used in 19 20 this act is hereby declared to mean means: 21 22 (v) The use of any other term by a person

23 registered <u>licensed</u> under this act except the term

"optometrist" or "doctor of optometry" to designate his 1 2 profession; 3 4 (vii) Gross—Incompetence, and—malpractice or 5 unethical conduct; 6 7 board, when necessary for (ix) The administration of this act, may clarify the definitions 8 9 stated in this subparagraph (b) subsection by unanimous 10 action of the board, provided that the meaning and effect 11 of this law shall not thereby be added to or diminished 12 properly promulgated rules and regulations. 13 (c) Said board, after due notice and hearing, shall 14 revoke the certificate issued to any optometrist whose 15 16 certificate of registration was obtained or issued through error, fraud, or perjury, or who shall have been quilty of 17 grossly unprofessional, unethical and dishonest conduct, or 18 who shall be guilty of an offense involving moral turpitude 19 20 when such offense shall have been established in a court of 21 competent jurisdiction Board disciplinary proceedings will 22 be conducted in accordance with the Wyoming Administrative 23 Procedure Act and the rules and regulations of the board.

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33-23-111. Limitation on rights conferred by license; 1 2 prohibited acts. 3 4 (a) Nothing in this act shall be construed as 5 conferring on the holder of any certificate of registration a license issued by the board, the title "doctor of 6 medicine," "oculist" or "ophthalmologist," or any other 7 word or abbreviation indicating that he is engaged in the 8 9 practice of medicine. or surgery. 10 11 (b) It is unlawful: 12 13 (i) For any person to canvass from house to 14 house or at approach any place of employment either in person or through solicitors or agents for the purpose of 15 16 selling glasses opthalmic lenses, eye examination 17 examinations or optometric service. services; 18 19 (iv) For any person or persons not holding a 20 certificate or any corporation, directly or indirectly, 21 license to practice optometry, by employment of or contract 22 with a person holding a certificate, or otherwise, provided 23 that one holding a certificate may accept employment from a 24 person, partnership, association or corporation to practice

1 optometry with respect to the employees of such person, 2 partnership, association or corporation or any corporation 3 or other organization not wholly owned by persons holding a 4 license to practice optometry, to contract with or employ 5 an optometrist, except to practice optometry with respect to employees. This subsection paragraph shall not be 6 7 construed to prohibit practitioners optometrists licensed under this act from employing other practitioners licensed 8 9 under this act, optometrists or from forming partnerships 10 or professional associations business relationships with 11 other practitioners licensed under this act optometrists or 12 with other licensed health care professionals whose primary 13 objective is the diagnosis and treatment of the human body 14 physicians licensed to practice in this state.

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33-23-113. License to be displayed.

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Every person holding a certificate license to practice optometry in the state of Wyoming shall display the said certificate license, in its entirety, in a conspicuous place in his office, wherein the practice of optometry is conducted. He shall, also, deliver to each person fitted with glasses by him in case the work is not done in his permanent office, a receipt which shall contain his

1 signature, the number of his certificate, and his home

2 post-office address.

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4 33-23-114. Continuing education courses required.

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All registered optometrists licensed in Wyoming shall take 6 courses of study in subjects relating to the practice of 7 the profession of optometry for the utilization and 8 9 application of new techniques, scientific and clinical 10 advances, and the achievements of research which will 11 assure expansive and comprehensive care to the public. The 12 board shall prescribe the length of study. Attendance shall 13 be at a course or courses approved by the board. Attendance 14 at any course or courses of study is to be certified to the board upon a form provided by the board and submitted by 15 16 each registered optometrist to the board. The board may use 17 up to one-half (1/2) of its annual renewal fees for the purposes of contracting with institutions 18 of higher 19 learning, professional organizations, or qualified 20 individuals to provide educational programs that meet this 21 requirement. The board may also treat funds set aside for 22 the purpose of continuing education as state funds for the 23 purpose of accepting any funds made available under federal 24 law on a matching basis for the programs of continuing

1 education. In no instance may the board require a greater

2 number of hours of study than are available at approved

3 courses held within this state. The board may waive the

4 requirements of this section in cases of certified illness

5 or undue hardship.

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7 33-23-115. Penalty; injunction; civil penalty; jury

8 trial.

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10 (a) Any person who violates any provision of W.S.

11 33-23-101 through $\frac{33-23-116}{33-23-117}$ is guilty of a

12 misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not more

13 than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) or imprisoned

14 not more than six (6) months in the county jail, or both.

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16 (b) Any person aggrieved by a violation of W.S.

33-23-101 through 33-23-116-33-23-117, the Wyoming state

18 board of examiners of optometry, the attorney general or

19 the district or county attorney may institute suit in the

20 county in which a violation of W.S. 33-23-101 through

33-23-116 33-23-117 occurred to require enforcement by

22 injunctive procedures and to recover a civil penalty not to

23 exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) per violation,

24 plus costs.

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2 33-23-116. Rules and regulations.

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- 4 The board may make promulgate rules and regulations not
- 5 inconsistent with law as may be reasonably necessary for
- 6 the proper performance of its duties in accordance with the
- 7 Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.
