1 AN ACT relating to renewable energy development; establishing a renewable energy commission within the 2 governor's office; providing definitions; providing for 3 membership; specifying duties; requiring the commission to 4 5 submit its recommendations to the legislature as specified; providing an appropriation; providing for the termination 6 7 of the commission; and providing for an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2901 through 9-2-2904 are created 11 12 to read:

Definitions. 1 2 3 (a) As used in this article, unless the context 4 otherwise requires: 5 6 (i) "Commission" means the Wyoming renewable 7 energy commission created by this section; 8 (ii) "Renewable energy" means energy produced 9 10 from a renewable resource; 11 12 (iii) "Renewable resources" include wind, solar, 13 biomass, landfill gas, hydro, geothermal and hydrogen if it is generated from any of the aforementioned sources; 14 15 16 (iv) "System" means physically connected distribution facilities 17 generation, transmission and operating as a single unit. 18 19 20 9-2-2902. Ruckelshaus Institute of Environment and Natural 8 9 Resources or his designee; 10 11 (ix) The governor's energy and 12 telecommunications policy advisor; and 13 14 (x) Two (2) residents of the state appointed at 15 large by the governor. 16 (c) Appointed commission members shall serve until 17 completion of duties delegated to the commission under this 18 article. If a vacancy occurs on the commission, the 19 20 governor shall appoint a new member from the 21 membership category to fill the vacancy for the remainder 22 of the term. The governor may remove members as provided 23 in W.S. 9-1-202. Commission members who are not state 24 employees shall receive a salary equal to the per diem paid

- 2 each day of actual service and when engaged in necessary
- 3 travel plus necessary expenses.

- 5 (d) The members shall elect from the membership a
- 6 chairman, vice-chairman and secretary. The two (2) members

- 8 of Wyoming with special knowledge, as evidenced by college
- 9 degrees or courses or with at least five (5) years
- 10 experience in the field of renewable energy generation,
- 11 manufacturing, transmission, marketing, industrial

- 14 (e) The commission shall meet not less than monthly
- 15 at the call of the chairman. Seven (7) members shall

and existing electric and natural gas generation and 1 2 transmission facilities by: 3 4 (i) Holding public meetings throughout the 5 state; 6 7 (ii) Hearing from experts and other interested parties; 8 9 10 (iii) Studying and researching other states' 11 renewable resource policies and programs; 12 (iv) Analyzing existing Wyoming data related to 13 renewable resources and existing electric and natural gas 14 facilities; and 15 16 (v) Incorporating past efforts related to 17 renewable energy resources, including, but not limited to, 18 the report issued by the Wyoming energy commission on 19 20 December 14, 2001, and future possibilities that can be 21 useful in decision making. 22 (b) As part of its study the commission shall address 23 24 the following:

5 (ii) Models for integrating renewable energy

6 into the existing energy system;

8 (iii) Renewable energy resources, technologies

9 and technical and regulatory issues;

17 workforce development and local and rural economies;

19 (vi) Energy efficiency and energy conservation

1 (vii) Development of a renewable portfolio 2 standard; 3 4 (viii) The effects of renewable energy projects 5 on national security, public health, welfare and the environment; 6 7 (ix) The role of the university of Wyoming, 8 Wyoming community colleges and the Western Research 9 10 Institute in renewable energy research and business 11 development; and 12 13 (x) Other issues as deemed appropriate by the commission. 14 15 (c) The commission shall submit to the joint 16 minerals, business and economic development interim 17 18 committee and the governor a preliminary report on its findings no later than June 30, 2006, and submit a final 19 20 report with its recommendations for legislative changes by 21 December 1, 2006.

1 (d) Public hearings of the commission shall be held

2 in accordance with W.S. 16-4-401 et seq. The attorney

3 general shall be the legal adviser to the commission.

5 (e) The commission may contract for consultants or

6 administrative services as necessary to assist in the

7 functions of the commission and the preparation of the

8 reports.

10 (f) Staff support for the commission shall be

11 provided by the Wyoming business council and by any state

12 agency upon request.
