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- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 15-1-101(a) by creating new
- 8 paragraphs (xv) and (xvi) and by renumbering (xv) as
- 9 (xvii), 15-1-110(a) and 15-1-116(a) and by creating a new
- 10 subsection (d) are amended to read:

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12 **15-1-101. Definitions.**

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14 (a) As used in W.S. 15-1-101 through 15-10-117:

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(xv) "Legal newspaper" means a newspaper capable 1 2 of publishing legal notices as provided in W.S. 18-3-519; 3 4 (xvi) "Newspaper business office" means a 5 physical office of a legal newspaper wherein advertisements are accepted and composed and which is open to the public 6 7 during set business hours; 8 9 (xv) (xvii) "This act", unless otherwise 10 specified, means W.S. 15-1-101 through 15-10-117. 11 12 15-1-110. Minutes of meetings and titles of 13 ordinances passed to be published; exception; contents; 14 publication of names, salaries and wages of specified 15 officials and employees; "department head" defined. 16 17 The governing body of any city or town in which a legal newspaper is generally circulated and maintains a 18 newspaper business office shall designate a legal newspaper 19 20 and publish once therein the minutes of all regular and special meetings of the governing body and the titles of 21 22 all ordinances passed. If a there is no legal newspaper is 23 not published in which maintains a newspaper business office within the boundary of the city or town the 24

1 proceedings or ordinances shall be posted for at least ten 2 (10) days in the city or town clerk's office and in such 3 other places as the governing body determines. The clerk of 4 each city or town shall within twelve (12) days after 5 adjournment of every meeting, furnish the newspaper a copy of the proceedings of the meeting. Except for salaries and 6 7 wages published under subsection (b) of this section, the copy shall include any bill presented to the governing body 8 9 stating the amount of the bill, the amount allowed, the 10 purpose of the bill and the claimant. Claims for part-time 11 employees may be summarized by department without listing 12 each part-time employee. The newspaper shall publish the 13 copy of proceedings within nine (9) days after receipt.

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15 **15-1-116.** Ordinances; publication required;
16 exception; attestation; recodification or revision.

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(a) Every ordinance before becoming effective shall be published at least once in a <u>legal</u> newspaper of general circulation which maintains a newspaper business office within the <u>boundary of the</u> city or town. The newspaper shall publish the ordinance within nine (9) days from the date of receipt. If there is no such <u>legal</u> newspaper which maintains a newspaper business office within the boundary

1 of the city or town, the ordinance shall be posted for at 2 least ten (10) days in the city clerk's office and in such 3 other places as the governing body determines. Emergency 4 ordinances are effective upon proclamation of the mayor, 5 and as soon thereafter as is practicable they shall be published and posted in the manner required of other 6 7 ordinances. 8 9 (d) Ordinances adopted by the governing bodies of all 10 incorporated cities and towns prior to March 15, 2005 which 11 were posted for at least ten (10) days in the city clerk's 12 office and in such other places as the governing body

determined, are deemed to be in compliance with the

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Section 2. This act is effective March 15, 2005.
