Mine inspector reporting requirements.

## A BILL

## for

1 AN ACT relating to mines and minerals; providing for annual 2 reporting by mine inspectors of corrective measures taken 3 to prevent reoccurrence of fatal accidents; providing for 4 annual reporting of man hours worked; providing for reporting by mine site contractors; providing a definition; 5 providing for electronic notification of mine openings and 6 7 closings; repealing requirement of notice within thirty 8 days of mine openings and closings; repealing requirement 9 that county pay for investigations; and providing for an 10 effective date.

12 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

14 Section 1. W.S. 30-2-101(a) by creating a new 15 paragraph (xviii), 30-2-202(a)(ii)(B) and (D), 30-2-212(a),

30-2-401, 30-2-402, 30-2-403(a), (b) and (c)(intro) and 1 2 30-2-405 (b) are amended to read: 3 30-2-101. Definitions. 4 5 6 (a) As used in this act: 7 8 (xviii) "Mine site contractor" means a person 9 who has entered into a contract with a mine owner or 10 operator to perform functions traditionally performed by 11 mine personnel. 12 13 30-2-202. Duties of inspector; duties of deputy 14 inspectors. 15 16 (a) The inspector shall: 17 (ii) Collect state mining statistics and report 18 19 to the governor annually no later than March 31 for the 20 preceding calendar year. The report shall include the 21 statistics and may include recommendations concerning further mining legislation. The statistics in the report 22 shall include for each mine: 23 24

1 (B) Corrective measures taken to prevent 2 the reoccurrence of fatal accidents; 3 4 (D) Number of man-days man hours worked. 5 6 30-2-212. Accident investigation; fatal accidents; 7 procedure; coroner's inquest; notification of inquest. 8 9 The inspector, or his deputy when authorized, (a) shall investigate all fatal accidents occurring in 10 connection with mining operations. In his investigation he 11 12 may compel the attendance of witnesses and administer oaths 13 as if he were a coroner. The costs of an investigation shall be paid by the county in which the accident occurred 14 15 in the same manner as costs of coroners inquests are paid 16 by law. 17 30-2-401. Safety rules; posting; responsibility for 18 19 observance. 20 21 All owners, and operators and mine site contractors shall post in a conspicuous place and make available to all 22 23 employees the rules and duties of safety governing their 24 employment. Employees are responsible for the observance of

all the rules and safety practices in all phases of their
 work.

30-2-402. Annual report to inspector; contents.

5

6 The owner, or operator or mine site contractor of any 7 mining operation shall report annually to the inspector before January 31 of each year. The report shall contain 8 9 the names of the owners, and operators and mine site 10 contractors, the post office address, the name of the claim 11 to be operated, the number of persons employed, classified 12 as to occupation, the name of the county mining district, and the tonnage produced during the previous calendar year, 13 14 upon forms furnished by the inspector.

16 30-2-403. Record of accidents to be kept; inspection 17 of record; reports filed with inspector; report of serious 18 accidents.

(a) The owner, or operator or mine site contractor
shall keep a record of all accidents occurring in
connection with mining operations. The record shall be open
to the inspector or his deputies at all times.

1	(b) In all compensable injuries, the owner <u>,</u> <del>or</del>
2	operator or mine site contractor shall send to the
3	inspector a copy of the <del>employer's</del> report <u>of injury form</u>
4	filed in worker's compensation cases.
5	
6	(c) A mine owner <u>,</u> <del>or </del> operator <u>or mine site contractor</u>
7	shall immediately notify the inspector's office in person
8	or by <del>electronic means <mark>telephone</mark> of any of the following</del>
9	occurrences:

11	30-2-405. Notice as to commencement of operations.
12	
13	(b) The owner or operator of a <del>coal</del> mine shall notify
14	the inspector, in writing, telephone or facsimile, whenever
15	a new mine is opened, or whenever an existing mine is
16	either closed or reopened. The <del>written</del> notice shall be
17	given immediately before the happening of the event, and
18	shall specify the date upon which the event will occur.
19	
20	Section 2. W.S. 30-2-405(a) is repealed.
21	
22	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
