W.S. 16-4-203(d) by creating a new 8 paragraph (xiii) and 21-17-308 by creating a new subsection 9 (e) are amended to read: 10 11 16-4-203. Right of inspection; grounds for denial; 12 access of news media; order permitting or restricting disclosure; exceptions. 13 14 The custodian shall deny the right of inspection 15 (d) 16 of the following records, unless otherwise provided by law:

3	individual diagnoses of contagious, infectious,
4	communicable and genetic diseases maintained or collected
5	by the Wyoming state veterinary laboratory as provided in
6	W.S. 21-17-308(e).

10	(e) All records and information maintained or
11	collected by the Wyoming state veterinary laboratory
12	related to diagnosis of contagious, infectious,
13	communicable and genetic diseases of individual animals or
14	herds shall be confidential and shall not be released
15	except to the individual submitting the sample for
16	diagnosis unless:

18	(i) Laboratory testing results in the
19	recognition of a state or federally reportable disease;

21	(ii) It is in the best interests of animal or
22	human public health, as determined by the director of the
23	Wyoming state veterinary laboratory or his designee, to
24	release the information; or

2	(iii) The release of the information is required
3	by state or federal law. Nothing in this subsection shall
4	affect the duty of the Wyoming state veterinary laboratory
5	or any other person to report contagious or infectious
6	diseases as required by state or federal law.
