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15 (a) As used in this act:

20	or killed by an act of terrorism, as defined by 18 U.S.C.							
21	2331, committed <u>inside or</u> outside the United States;

2	regardless of the actual victim's residency;

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1 (a) The division shall: 2 3 (i) Hear and determine all matters relating to 4 claims for compensation provided determinations and final 5 decisions on victim's compensations awards made by the division shall be exempt from the Wyoming Administrative 6 7 Procedure Act, including the provisions for judicial review under W.S. 16-3-114 and 16-3-115; 8 9 10 1-40-109. Standards for compensation. 11 12 (b) Loss of earnings and loss of future earnings shall be determined on the basis of the victim's average 13 monthly earnings for the six (6) months immediately 14 preceding the date of the injury, or the current federal 15 16 minimum wage nine hundred dollars (\$900.00), whichever is 17 less. 18 (c) Loss of support shall be determined on the basis 19 20 of the victim's or defendant's average monthly earnings for 21 the six (6) months immediately preceding the date of the 22 injury, or the current federal minimum wage nine hundred

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dollars (\$900.00), whichever is less.
