- 15 (xi) Any person who practices direct entry
- 16 midwifery if that person does not in any manner:

2 Advertise, hold himself out or (A) 3 otherwise represent that she is authorized to practice 4 medicine; or 5 6 (B) Otherwise perform any of the other acts 7 specified in W.S. 33-26-102(a)(xi), except delivering or 8 assisting in the delivery of infants and the management of 9 pregnancy and parturition; and 10 11 (C) Is registered with the county health 12 department in each county in which she is practicing direct 13 entry midwifery, verifying that she has successfully 14 completed requirements established by the North American registry of midwives for certified professional midwives. 15 16 17 (b) For purposes of this section, "direct entry 18 midwife" means an independent practitioner educated in the 19 discipline of midwifery through self-study, apprenticeship, 20 a midwifery school or a college or university-based program 21 distinct from the discipline of nursing. A direct entry 22 midwife is trained to provide the midwifes' model of care 23 to healthy women and newborn infants throughout the child 24 bearing cycle primarily in out-of-hospital settings.
