1	AN ACT relating to outfitters and professional guides;
2	providing for assessment of civil penalties as specified;
3	and providing for an effective date.

5	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

7	Section 1. W.S. 23-2-416 by creating new subsections
8	(e) and (f) and 23-2-417(a) are amended to read:
9	
10	23-2-416. License suspension and revocation; grounds;
11	payment of damages; civil penalties; proceedings.

13	(e) If an outfitter or professional guide licensed
14	under this act is accused of any of the actions specified
15	in subsection (a) of this section, the board may assess a
16	civil penalty of not more than two thousand dollars

1	(\$2,000.00) and may impose a probationary period under
2	terms and conditions, a violation of which shall result in
3	revocation or suspension of the license, for each action
4	<u>if:</u>
5	
6	(i) The outfitter or professional guide admits
7	the action or the board, after a hearing in accordance with
8	the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act, finds clear and
9	convincing evidence the action occurred; and
10	
11	(ii) The board finds that suspension or
12	revocation of the license are not appropriate remedies.
13	
14	(f) Penalties provided under subsection (e) of this
15	section shall be paid into the county treasury to the
16	credit of the public school fund of the county in which the
17	violation occurred.

19	23-2-417. Violations in general; penalties.

21	(a) In addition to any penalties assessed pursuant to
22	W.S. 23-2-416, any person violating any provision of this
23	act is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not
