A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the state boxing commissioner; creating

2 an office of state boxing commissioner; providing for the

3 appointment of a state boxing commissioner, inspectors and

4 deputies; specifying duties; providing procedures for

5 licensure; providing for distribution of revenues;

6 providing penalties; granting rulemaking authority; and

7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 33-8-121 through 33-8-140 are created

12 to read:

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33-8-121. State boxing commissioner; office created;

15 appointment; term, office, rules and regulations;

16 definitions.

2 (a) There is hereby created an office known as "state boxing commissioner of Wyoming". The governor shall appoint a person to fill the office. Any resident of the state of Wyoming shall be eligible to fill the office of the state boxing commissioner. The term of office of the commissioner shall be two (2) years.

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9 (b) The commissioner shall maintain an office for the

10 transaction of business in the city of Cheyenne, Wyoming,

11 but he may transact his business under this act at any

12 place within the state of Wyoming when the convenience of

13 the parties so requires.

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15 (c) The commissioner shall adopt a seal and shall

16 make rules for the administration of his office not

17 inconsistent with this act, and may from time to time amend

18 or repeal rules.

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20 (d) As used in this act:

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22 (i) "Commissioner" means the state boxing

23 commissioner appointed pursuant to this section;

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1 (ii) "This act" means W.S. 33-8-121 through 2 33-8-140.

3 33-8-122. State boxing commissioner; powers and 5 duties; subpoenas; oaths.

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7 The commissioner shall keep a full and accurate record of all his acts and doings and shall preserve at his general 8 9 office all books, documents and papers. The commissioner 10 shall prepare for service of notices and other papers as 11 may be necessary, and shall issue subpoenas for the 12 attendance of witnesses before him with the same effect as 13 if they were issued in an action in the district court, and shall have power to administer oaths in all matters 14 pertaining to the administration of his affairs as 15 commissioner. Disobedience of such subpoenas and falsely 16 17 swearing before the commissioner shall be attended by the same consequences and be subject to the same penalties as 18 if the disobedience or false swearing occurred in an action 19 20 in the district court.

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22 33-8-123. State boxing commissioner; per diem;

23 **mileage**.

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 $1\,$ The commissioner shall receive as compensation the sum of

2 five dollars (\$5.00) for each day or fraction thereof

3 actually spent in the performance of his duties, together

4 with per diem and mileage allowance as allowed to state

5 employees, payments of the same to be made out of the state

6 boxing commissioner's appropriation. Provided, that if any

7 state officer is appointed to act as commissioner he shall

8 not receive the compensation for his services herein

9 mentioned, but shall be reimbursed for any necessary

10 expenses incurred or paid by him.

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12 33-8-124. State boxing commissioner; report to

13 **legislature**.

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15 The commissioner shall make a full report to the

16 legislature of all proceedings during the two (2) years

17 preceding the first day of December before the beginning of

18 the regular session of the legislature. The report to the

19 legislature shall be completed and shall contain a

20 statement of clubs, organizations or corporations, the

21 number of licenses revoked, the gross receipts from each

22 club, organization or corporation, and other information

23 and comments in relation to the work of the commissioner as

24 public interest may require.

2 33-8-125. Jurisdiction over boxing matches and

3 licenses; power of municipalities.

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5 The commissioner shall have, and is hereby vested with the sole direction, management, control of, and jurisdiction 6 over, all boxing and sparring matches and exhibitions to be 7 conducted, held or given within the state by any club, 8 9 corporation or association and no boxing or sparring 10 exhibitions shall be conducted, held or given within the 11 state except pursuant to authority granted by the 12 commissioner and in accordance with the provisions of this 13 act and the rules and regulations of the commissioner. The 14 commissioner may, at his discretion, issue and for cause revoke a license to conduct, hold or give boxing or 15 sparring matches and exhibitions to any incorporated club 16 17 association formed as hereinafter provided. commissioner shall have full power and authority to limit 18 the number of sparring or boxing exhibitions to be held or 19 20 given by any club, organization or corporation in any city 21 in this state where boxing contests are conducted in the 22 manner herein provided. No boxing or sparring exhibitions shall be conducted by any club, organization or corporation 23 24 in the state except by a license from the state boxing

1 commissioner. Every license shall be subject to such rules 2 as the commissioner may prescribe. It shall be lawful for 3 any incorporated athletic club organized under the laws of 4 the state of Wyoming, and which has been in existence for a period of not less than thirty (30) days, to arrange and 5 provide for sparring and boxing exhibitions or contests in 6 7 compliance with the provisions of this act. No provision of this act shall prevent any incorporated city or town from 8 9 prohibiting or regulating by ordinance any sparring or boxing exhibition. Except as provided in W.S. 33-8-129 no 10 sparring or boxing contest shall be held or permitted 11 12 outside of the limits of an incorporated city or town.

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16 **33-8-126.** Licenses required; application; fee and 17 bond.

Sparring and boxing contests may be held in unincorporated

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No boxing or sparring exhibition shall be conducted by any club or organization except by license issued to the club or organization by the state boxing commissioner of Wyoming. The application for a license shall be in writing, and shall be addressed to the commissioner, and shall be verified by some officer of the club, organization or

1 corporation on whose behalf the application is made. The 2 application shall be accompanied by a fee of ten dollars 3 (\$10.00) for each boxing or sparring exhibition. 4 application shall show that the club or organization has 5 been incorporated not less than thirty (30) days and that the club has been organized under the laws of the state of 6 Wyoming. Before any permit or license is issued under this 7 act to any club, organization or corporation, the applicant 8 9 shall file a bond of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) with good and sufficient surety, with the state treasurer, 10 11 conditioned for the faithful performance of the conditions

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of this act.

33-8-127. Report of club, corporation or association; admission tax to be paid.

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17 Every club, corporation or association which may hold or exercise any of the privileges conferred by this act shall, 18 within twenty-four (24) hours after the determination of 19 20 every contest, furnish to the commissioner a written 21 report, duly verified by one (1) of its officers, showing 22 the number of tickets sold for the contest, and the amount of gross proceeds thereof, and other matters as the 23 commissioner may prescribe and shall also within the time 24

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prescribed by this section, pay a tax of five percent (5%) 1 2 of its total gross receipts from the sale of tickets of 3 admission, or admission fees to boxing or sparring matches 4 or exhibitions. 5 33-8-128. Disposition of fees and taxes. 6 7 (a) All money shall be received and collected as 8 9 provided by this act and credited by the state treasurer as follows: 10 11 12 (i) One-half (1/2) of license fees and admission 13 taxes collected to the general fund; 14 15 (ii) One-half (1/2) of license fees to the 16 treasury of the county in which the licensee resides; and 17 18 (iii) One-half (1/2) of the admission tax to the treasury of the county in which the exhibition was held. 19 20 33-8-129. Matches under rules of amateur athletic 21 22 union.

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1 (a) Whenever amateur boxing and sparring matches are 2 held under the rules of the amateur athletic union, by any 3 club or organization, the license fee required under this 4 act or the presence of commissioner or deputy shall not be 5 required. The matches and exhibitions shall, however, be subject to the provisions of W.S. 33-8-132 and the rules of 6 7 the commissioner, provided: 8 9 (i) Amateur boxing and sparring matches, of not more than six (6) rounds duration shall be permitted 10 outside of incorporated cities and towns; 11 12 13 (ii) The rounds under paragraph (i) of this subsection shall not be permitted to extend for a period 14 longer than two (2) minutes. 15 16 17 33-8-130. County inspectors. 18 The commissioner shall by and with the cooperation of the 19 county commissioners of the several counties 20 21 official representatives designated as inspectors or 22 deputies for each county, each of whom shall receive from the commissioner a card, authorizing him in person or by 23

deputy to act as an inspector wherever the commissioner may

1 designate him to act. The commissioner may, and at least

- 2 one (1) inspector or deputy shall, be present at all
- 3 exhibitions and matches conducted for pecuniary profit and
- 4 see that the rules are strictly observed, and an inspector
- 5 shall also be present at the counting up of the gross
- 6 receipts, and shall immediately mail to the commissioner
- 7 the official box office statement received by him from the
- 8 officers of the club.

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10 33-8-131. Sunday matches prohibited.

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- 12 No boxing or sparring match or exhibition shall be held on
- 13 Sunday.

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15 33-8-132. Rules for conduct of matches.

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- 17 (a) No boxing or sparring exhibitions shall be of
- 18 more than fifteen (15) rounds duration, and no one (1)
- 19 round of such exhibition shall be permitted to extend for a
- 20 period longer than three (3) minutes.

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- 22 (b) There shall be a one (1) minute intermission
- 23 between rounds.

1 (c) No contestant shall in any such boxing or

2 sparring exhibition wear, or be permitted to wear, gloves

3 weighing less than five (5) ounces.

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5 (d) No betting or wagering at any boxing or sparring

6 contest shall be permitted by any person or persons

7 directly associated with the boxing or sparring contest,

8 including the contestants, spectators and members of the

9 club or organization, before, after or during any such

10 contest, in or around the premises where such contest is

11 held. Nothing in this subsection shall be construed to

12 prohibit betting or wagering as may be allowed by law away

13 from the premises where such contest is held.

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15 (e) In all boxing or sparring contests, contestants

16 shall break clean, and shall not hold and hit. Butting with

17 the head or shoulder, wrestling or illegal use of elbows

18 shall not be allowed. There shall be no unsportsmanlike

19 conduct on the part of the contestants, including the use

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20 of abusive or insulting language.

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22 33-8-133. Age limit for spectators.

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1 No person under the age of sixteen (16) years shall be

- 2 admitted to a boxing or sparring exhibition, unless
- 3 accompanied by his parent, guardian or other adult
- 4 relative.

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6 33-8-134. Examination by physician.

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- 8 Each contestant shall be examined not more than twelve (12)
- 9 hours prior to entering the ring by a physician who has
- 10 been licensed to practice in Wyoming and who has been
- 11 designated by the commissioner. The physician shall certify
- 12 in writing, over his signature, as to the contestant's
- 13 physical condition to engage in the contest.

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15 **33-8-135.** Referees.

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- 17 The commissioner is authorized to grant licenses to
- 18 competent referees upon the application and the payment of
- 19 an annual fee of ten dollars (\$10.00), and may revoke any
- 20 license granted to any referee upon such cause as the
- 21 commissioner may deem sufficient. The referee shall stop
- 22 the contest or match when either of the contestants shows a
- 23 marked superiority or is apparently outclassed or injury is
- 24 likely to result to either of the contestants.

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2 33-8-136. Holding fake matches.

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4 Any club, corporation or organization which conducts, holds

5 or participates in any sham or fake boxing or sparring

6 match, shall forfeit its license in accordance with the

7 provisions of this section. The commissioner shall cancel

8 and declare the license void and shall deny any future

9 license application under the provisions of this act to the

10 club, corporation, organization or its successor.

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12 33-8-137. Penalty for taking part in fake match.

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14 (a) Any contestant who shall participate in any sham

15 or fake boxing or sparring match or violate any rule or

16 regulation of the commissioner shall be penalized in the

17 following manner:

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19 (i) For the first offense he shall be restrained

20 by order of the commissioner from participating in any

21 boxing or sparring match or exhibition to be held or given

22 by any club or corporation duly licensed to give or hold

23 any boxing or sparring match or exhibition for a period of

1 not less than three (3) months nor more than one (1) year

2 at the discretion of the commissioner;

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- 4 (ii) For a second offense he shall be totally
- 5 disqualified from further admission or participation in any
- 6 boxing contest, held or given by any club, corporation or
- 7 association, duly licensed for such purpose in this state.

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- 9 33-8-138. Failure to make reports; unsatisfactory
- 10 reports; examination of records, officers.

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- 12 Whenever any club, corporation or association shall fail to
- 13 make a report of any contest at the time prescribed by this
- 14 act, or whenever the report is unsatisfactory to the
- 15 commissioner, the commissioner may examine or cause to be
- 16 examined, the books and records of the club, corporation or
- 17 association, and subpoena and examine under oath its
- 18 officers and other person or persons for witnesses for the
- 19 purpose of determining the total amount of its gross
- 20 receipts for any contest and the amount of taxes due
- 21 pursuant to the provisions of this act, which tax he may,
- 22 upon and as a result of such examination, fix and
- 23 determine. Should the club, corporation or association fail
- 24 to pay any taxes determined to be due, together with the

1 expenses incurred in making the examination, for a period

2 of twenty (20) days after notice of the amount due by the

3 commissioner, the club, corporation or association shall

4 forfeit its license and shall be thereby disqualified from

5 receiving any new license, or any renewal of its license.

6 In addition, the club, corporation or association shall

7 forfeit to the people of the state of Wyoming the bond of

8 two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) required to be filed by

9 W.S. 33-8-126, which may be recovered by the attorney

10 general in the name of the people of the state of Wyoming

in the same manner as other penalties are by law recovered.

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33-8-139. Weights and classes.

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15 The weights and classes of boxers and the rules and

16 regulations of boxing shall be the same as the weights and

17 classes and rules and regulations adopted by the Army, Navy

18 and Civilian Board of Boxing and Control, Inc. and the

19 International Sporting Club of New York, Inc. except as

20 otherwise herein provided. No contest shall be allowed in

21 which the difference in weight of the respective

22 contestants shall exceed eighteen (18) pounds, but this

23 provision shall not apply to boxers in the heavy and

24 light-heavy weight classes.

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2	33-8-140. Penalty.
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4	Any person who violates any of the provisions of this act
5	for which a penalty is not herein expressly prescribed
6	shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon
7	conviction shall be fined not to exceed seven hundred fifty
8	dollars (\$750.00) or imprisoned in the county jail for a
9	period not to exceed six (6) months, or be subject to both
10	fine and imprisonment.
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12	Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
