Executive training institute/graduate school of business.

## A BILL

## For

1 AN ACT relating to education; providing for planning and siting of an executive training, conference and institutes 2 3 center; providing for the subsequent development of a graduate school; establishing a joint legislative/executive 4 5 oversight committee and a steering committee; providing an 6 appropriation; providing for reports; specifying 7 legislative intent; and providing for an effective date. 8 9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 10 Section 1. 11 12 There is established a joint legislative/executive 13 (a) oversight committee consisting of the members of the state 14 15 building commission or their designees, the president of the 16 senate, speaker of the house of representatives, the

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chairmen of the house and senate education committees or 1 2 their designees, a member of the senate appointed by the 3 president of the senate and a member of the house appointed 4 by the speaker of the house. The president of the senate 5 and speaker of the house shall be co-chairmen of the joint legislative/executive oversight committee. The president of 6 7 the board of trustees of the University of Wyoming and the president of the University of Wyoming shall serve as ex 8 9 officio members of the joint legislative/executive 10 committee, but shall not vote. There is created a steering 11 committee. The steering committee shall consist of the 12 following members: 13 (i) The dean of the college of business at the 14 15 University of Wyoming, who shall serve as chair; 16 17 (ii) The dean of the outreach school at the University of Wyoming; 18 19 20 (iii) A member of the advisory board to the 21 University of Wyoming's college of business appointed by the 22 chairman of the board; 23

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2005 STATE OF WYOMING 05LSO-0556 (iv) The chairman of the board of the University 1 2 of Wyoming foundation or his designee; 3 The cochairman of the Wyoming business 4 (V) 5 council selected by the council, or his designee; 6 7 (vi) Five (5) members appointed by the joint legislative/executive oversight committee with distinguished 8 9 credentials and experience in business or academics. 10 The oversight and steering committees shall 11 (b) 12 evaluate and recommend an appropriate site in Teton County, 13 Wyoming, suitable to construct and operate an executive training, conference and institutes center in preparation 14 for the establishment of a premier graduate school of 15 16 business. 17 (c) With the approval of the steering committee, the 18 University of Wyoming is authorized to expend funds 19 20 appropriated under subsection 3(a) of this act and 21 authorized for expenditure by the joint 22 legislative/executive oversight committee for all expenses, including travel and consultants, reasonable and necessary 23 24 for the steering committee to provide its report to the

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joint legislative/executive oversight committee required 1 2 under subsection (d) of this section. The steering 3 committee shall: 4 5 (i) Develop a plan for the content of the executive training program, which shall include the mission, 6 7 academic program, financial plan and executive campus design with state of the art technology; 8 9 (ii) Identify and pursue opportunities 10 to 11 establish relationships with other nationally recognized 12 business schools for the operation of the executive 13 training, conference and institutes center; 14 15 (iii) Develop a business plan for determining 16 the appropriate executive training tuition levels, with the

17 ability to offer reduced tuition to Wyoming business

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20 (iv) Develop criteria, costs and options for an 21 appropriate site of the executive training center and the 22 premier graduate school of business. Site options shall be 23 developed with consultation with the board of county

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commissioners of Teton County, the council of the city of
 Jackson and public input from Teton County;

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4 (v) Determine the need for building and other 5 facilities, including faculty and student housing, to implement the plans for the center and graduate school. 6 In 7 consultation with the construction management section of the department of administration and information, the University 8 9 of Wyoming's facilities planning office and offices of 10 conferences shall assist the steering committee in 11 developing the building and facility needs under this 12 paragraph;

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(vi) Develop a preliminary plan for the content of the graduate school educational program, which may include areas of concentration in environment and natural resources and entrepreneurship as components of business development and management strategies;

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20 (vii) Develop a preliminary graduate school 21 tuition plan for determining appropriate tuition levels, 22 with the ability to provide slots for University of Wyoming 23 graduates at a reduced tuition rate;

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(viii) Develop a proposed budget for implementing
 its recommendations.

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4 (d) The steering committee shall report its plan for 5 the executive training, conference and institutes center and 6 its plans for the graduate school of business to the joint 7 committee no later than October 1, 2005.

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9 (e) The joint committee shall submit the plan together 10 with any recommendations for additional legislation 11 necessary to implement the plan, including building, 12 facilities and staffing needs, to the legislature not later 13 than December 1, 2005.

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Section 2. The natural beauty, cultural and lifestyle 15 16 amenities of Teton County and its resident business leaders 17 make it the ideal location for a premier, internationally recognized graduate school of business and executive 18 19 training center. Wyoming's mineral resources have provided 20 the financial resources to invest in the development of 21 business leadership for Wyoming's future. The University of 22 Wyoming has nationally recognized strengths in natural resources and strong undergraduate, graduate and distance 23 learning programs in business. It is the intent of the 24

legislature to take advantage of the opportunity provided by 1 2 the unique features of a Teton County location, the strength 3 of the University of Wyoming's existing programs and the 4 availability of the state financial resources to make a 5 significant new investment in higher education. This investment will provide an extraordinary opportunity for 6 Wyoming students and business executives, and students and 7 business executives around the world, to pursue executive 8 9 training and graduate education through the University of 10 Wyoming.

- 12 Section 3.
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14 (a) There is appropriated from the general fund one 15 million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) to the 16 joint legislative/executive oversight committee for the 17 purpose of this act. This appropriation may be expended 18 for:

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20 (i) Procuring the services of one (1) or more 21 consultants with extensive knowledge and experience in the 22 academic and business fields;

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(ii) The expenses incurred by the University of 1 2 Wyoming, subject to the approval of the steering committee, 3 and the travel expenses of the members of the joint 4 committee, steering committee and designated academic team 5 necessary for the preparation of the report to the joint 6 committee. 7 8 (b) Notwithstanding W.S. 9-4-207(a) no part of this 9 appropriation shall lapse to the general fund as of June 30, 10 2006. 11 12 Section 4. This act is effective immediately upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 13 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the 14 Wyoming 15 Constitution. 16
