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6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	Section 1. W.S. 9-2-118(a)(i), (b) and (c) and
9	9-2-119(a)(i), (b) and (c) are amended to read:
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11	9-2-118. Physician and dentist loan repayment
12	program.
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14	(a) The department is authorized to enter into
15	agreements with physicians and dentists who have graduated

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1 from accredited residency programs to provide health care 2 in this state. The agreements shall:

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4 (i) Provide for the physician or dentist to 5 practice medicine in a community of the state from among a list of communities developed by the department. A 6 physician or dentist shall agree to provide medical care 7 for the period of the contract in underserved areas of the 8 9 state and shall accept patients qualified under the Medical 10 Assistance and Services Act, Title XVIII of the federal 11 Social Security Act and the child health insurance program 12 who seek medical care which the physician or dentist is qualified to provide. The department of health, in 13 consultation with the state board of medicine and the board 14 of dental examiners, shall determine which areas of the 15 16 state are underserved and which provider services are most 17 needed in each underserved area;

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19 (b) The department, in consultation with the 20 departmental advisory council, shall promulgate rules 21 necessary to carry out the purposes of this section. In 22 carrying out this section the department shall assess 23 health care needs of the state by geographic areas and

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practice specialties and shall prioritize and enter into
 agreements under this section accordingly.

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4 (c) The department may vary the terms of each 5 agreement in accordance with this section based upon the 6 community and the number of <u>the physician's or dentist's</u> 7 patients whose cost of care is reimbursed under Title XVIII 8 of the federal Social Security Act, <u>or</u> the <u>child health</u> 9 <u>insurance program or the</u> Wyoming Medical Assistance and 10 Services Act., <u>served by the physician</u>.

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12 9-2-119. Allied health care provider loan repayment 13 program.

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(a) The department is authorized to enter into
agreements with health care providers licensed or certified
to provide health care services in this state including,
but not limited to, hospital, medical, surgical, dental,
vision, nursing, radiology, mental health and
pharmaceutical services. The agreements shall:

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(i) Require the health care provider to provide
health care services in a community of the state from among
a list of communities developed by the department. A

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health care provider shall agree to provide medical care 1 2 for the period of the contract in underserved areas of the 3 state and shall accept patients qualified under the Medical 4 Assistance and Services Act, Title XVIII of the federal 5 Social Security Act and the child health insurance program who seek medical care which the health care provider is 6 7 qualified to provide. The department of health, in consultation with the appropriate health care provider 8 9 licensing boards, shall determine which areas of the state are underserved and which provider services are most needed 10 11 in each underserved area;

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13 (b) The department, in consultation with the departmental advisory council, shall promulgate rules 14 necessary to carry out the purposes of this section. - In 15 16 carrying out this section the department shall assess health care needs of the state by geographic areas 17 and particular health care services required and shall 18 19 prioritize and enter into agreements under this section 20 accordingly.

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22 (c) The department may vary the terms of each 23 agreement in accordance with this section based upon the 24 community and the number of the health care provider's
