A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to correctional officers; providing for the
- 2 training and certification of correctional officers as
- 3 specified; specifying the duties of the peace officer
- 4 standards and training commission; establishing
- 5 qualifications for correctional officers and certified
- 6 correctional officers; providing definitions; and providing
- 7 for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-1-710 is created to read:

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- 9-1-710. Qualifications for employment as a
- 14 correctional officer; termination of employment;
- 15 certification without compliance with the requirements of
- 16 this section.

2 (a) Within fifteen (15) days after the appointment, 3 termination, resignation or death of any correctional 4 officer or certified correctional officer, written notice 5 thereof shall be given to the commission by the employing agency. 6 7 (b) No state agency or any other person authorized by 8 9 law to appoint correctional officers in this state shall appoint any person as a correctional officer on or after 10 July 1, 2005, who does not meet the following 11 12 qualifications. The person shall: 13 14 (i) Be a United States citizen; 15 16 (ii) Be an adult; 17 (iii) Submit to fingerprinting and a search of 18 local, state and national fingerprint files to determine 19 whether the applicant has a criminal record, with a copy of 20 21 the responses sent to the commission;

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23 (iv) Not have been convicted of any crime for 24 which the applicant could have been punished by

imprisonment in a federal or a state penitentiary, unless 1

- 2 his conviction is reversed or annulled, he receives a
- 3 pardon or his rights are restored pursuant to W.S.
- 4 7-13-105(a);

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- 6 Hold a high school diploma or equivalent (\vee)
- 7 with proof of such forwarded to achievement, the
- commission; 8

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- 10 (vi) Be of good moral character as determined by
- 11 a background investigation. The hiring agency shall
- 12 complete a background investigation as defined by the
- 13 commission of any new applicant for employment as a
- correctional officer before the applicant may be employed 14
- or begin training as a correctional officer; 15

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- 17 (vii) Be free of any physical, emotional
- mental conditions which might adversely affect the 18
- 19 applicant's performance as a correctional officer.
- 20 Physical condition shall be evaluated by a person licensed
- 21 to practice medicine and by application of a standardized
- 22 physical fitness performance test as specified by the
- 23 hiring agency. Emotional and mental conditions shall be
- 24 evaluated by a licensed psychologist or psychiatrist;

2 (viii) Successfully pass an oral interview 3 examination and other preemployment examinations specified 4 by the hiring agency.

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(c) No person shall receive an original appointment 6 as a certified correctional officer or hold an appointment 7 on a permanent basis as a certified correctional officer 8 9 unless the person has been awarded a certificate by the director attesting to his satisfactory completion of an 10 11 approved correctional officer basic training program and 12 has demonstrated the core competencies of a correctional 13 officer as defined by the employing agency in cooperation with the commission. 14

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16 (d) No person shall be appointed as a correctional 17 officer on a permanent basis on or after July 1, 2006 unless within one (1) year from the date of his original 18 appointment he is awarded a certificate by the director 19 20 attesting that he satisfactorily completed a commission 21 approved peace officer's basic training program and has 22 demonstrated the core competencies of a correctional officer as defined by the employing agency in cooperation 23 with the commission. The commission may extend the one (1) 24

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1 year time requirement of this section upon the written

2 application of the correctional officer and his employer.

3 The application shall explain the circumstances which make

4 the extension necessary. Factors which the commission may

5 consider in granting or denying the extension include the

6 illness of a correctional officer or a member of his

7 immediate family or the absence of reasonable access to the

8 basic course. The commission shall not grant an extension

9 exceeding one hundred eighty (180) days.

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11 (e) Every person who is appointed as a part-time 12 correctional officer on or after July 1, 2005, shall 13 forfeit his position unless within two (2) years from the date of his appointment he is awarded a certificate by the 14 director attesting that he satisfactorily completed a 15 commission approved correctional officer basic training 16 17 program and has demonstrated the core competencies of a correctional officer as defined by the employing agency in 18

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(f) Notwithstanding subsections (b) through (e) of this section, the commission may, upon the recommendation of the employing agency, waive the basic correctional officer training program and certify those applicants who

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1 can pass a written examination provided by the commission

2 and an oral interview attesting to the applicant's ability

3 and core competencies in corrections. The applicant shall

4 prove that he satisfactorily completed a basic correctional

5 officer training program which in the commission's opinion

6 is comparable to that required by this section before

7 waiver is granted.

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9 (g) Any correctional officer attending any school or

10 training program authorized by the commission for the

11 purpose of meeting the requirements of this section shall

12 be paid his wages as a correctional officer by his

13 employer. He shall also receive reimbursement for

14 reasonable expenses as determined by his employer.

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16 (h) A person who is convicted of a felony after his

17 appointment as a correctional officer is ineligible for

18 continued employment as a correctional officer. If the

19 person has been certified under this section, his

20 certification shall be automatically revoked on the date of

21 his conviction. The director shall notify the person and

22 the person's employing agency upon revocation of

23 certification under this subsection as defined by the

24 commission.

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2	(j) In the case of termination of a certified
3	correctional officer, the employing agency shall notify the
4	commission and the officer, in writing, of the termination,
5	setting forth in detail the facts and reasons for the
6	termination. If the officer is terminated for failure to
7	comply with this act, or rules promulgated under it, the
8	notice shall so specify. Any officer who has been
9	terminated may present a written statement to the
10	commission responding to the claims made against him or
11	setting forth the facts and reasons for the termination as
12	he believes them to be, and that statement shall become a
13	permanent part of the file. A potential employer may
14	contact the commission to inquire as to the facts and
15	reasons an officer was terminated from any previous
16	employing agency. Unless otherwise prohibited by law, the
17	commission shall, upon request, provide to the potential
18	employer all pertinent information which is in its
19	possession.

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21 (k) Upon receipt from the department of family
22 services of a certified copy of an order from a court to
23 withhold, suspend or otherwise restrict a certificate
24 issued by the commission, the commission shall notify the

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1 party named in the court order and the employing agency of

- 2 the withholding, suspension or restriction of the
- 3 certificate in accordance with the terms of the court
- 4 order. No appeal under the Wyoming Administrative
- 5 Procedure Act shall be allowed for a certificate withheld,
- 6 suspended or restricted under this subsection.

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- 8 (m) Any person who has been employed on a permanent
- 9 basis as a correctional officer for ten (10) consecutive
- 10 years, and who is employed as a correctional officer by the
- 11 Wyoming department of corrections on July 6, 2006, shall be
- 12 certified as a certified correctional officer by the
- 13 director without having complied with subsections (b)
- 14 through (d) of this section.

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- 16 (n) The Wyoming department of corrections may
- 17 establish qualifications and standards for hiring and
- 18 training that exceed the minimum set by the commission.

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- 20 **Section 2.** W.S. 9-1-701(a) by creating new paragraphs
- 21 (xiv) through (xvi), 9-1-702 by creating a new subsection
- 22 (k), 9-1-703(b)(ii) through (vi), (viii) and (ix) and by

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23 creating a new paragraph (x) are amended to read:

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1	9-1-701. Definitions.
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3	(a) As used in this act:
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5	(xiv) "Certified correctional officer" means a
6	person who is employed by the Wyoming department of
7	corrections on a full-time basis to care for, supervise,
8	control and maintain custody of persons confined in Wyoming
9	department of corrections institutions and who has
10	completed all requirements for certification as a
11	correctional officer under this act;
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13	(xv) "Correctional officer" means a person who
14	is employed by the Wyoming department of corrections on a
15	full-time basis to care for, supervise and maintain custody
16	of persons confined in Wyoming department of corrections
17	institutions;
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19	(xvi) "Correctional officer training" means an
20	approved Wyoming department of corrections preservice
21	academy or other correctional officer training program
22	authorized by the commission to train correctional officers
23	for the state.

Created; membership; removal; compensation; 1 2 meetings; publication of procedures; standards for certified training; powers and duties. 3 4 5 (k) The commission shall establish course requirements and continuing education requirements for 6 7 correctional officer training. 8 9 9-1-703. Director; appointment; term; powers and 10 duties. 11 12 (b) With the approval of the commission, the director 13 may: 14 15 (ii) Inspect and approve peace officer and correctional officer training academies, issue certificates 16 17 of approval to academies and revoke approval or 18 certificates; 19 20 (iii) Certify as qualified instructors 21 approved peace officer and correctional officer training 22 academies and issue appropriate certificates 23 instructors; 24

(iv) Certify peace officers and correctional 1 2 who have satisfactorily completed the officers basic 3 training programs as outlined in this act and issue 4 appropriate certificates to peace officers and correctional 5 officers; 6 7 (v) Cause surveys to be made relating to the establishment and operation of peace officer 8 and 9 correctional officer training academies; 10 (vi) Consult and cooperate with peace officer 11 12 and correctional officer training academies for 13 development of the basic and advanced training programs for peace officers; 14 15 16 (viii) Consult and cooperate with other 17 departments and agencies concerned with peace officer and 18 correctional officer training; 19 20 (ix) Report to the commission at 21 meetings of the commission and at other times as required and recommend denial, suspension or revocation 22 of certification of a peace officer or correctional officer to 23 24 the commission as deemed necessary; -

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2 (x) Consult and cooperate with universities, 3 colleges, junior colleges and other institutions for the 4 development of specialized courses of study in the state 5 for correctional officers in the areas of inmate 6 management, group dynamics, correctional facility 7 operations, the social sciences and other related areas. 8 9 Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2005. 10
