A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to law enforcement retirement; authorizing 2 specified employees of the department of corrections to
- 3 participate in the law enforcement retirement system;
- 4 amending a definition; conditioning implementation upon
- 5 receipt of required payments and transfer of covered
- 6 employees as specified; providing an appropriation; and
- 7 providing for an effective date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-3-402(a) (xviii) is amended to read:

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13 **9-3-402.** Definitions.

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15 (a) As used in this article:

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(xviii) "Law enforcement officer" or "officer" 1 means any member who is a county sheriff, deputy county 2 3 sheriff, municipal police officer, duly authorized 4 investigator of the Wyoming livestock board meeting the 5 specifications of W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv)(E), investigator employed by the Wyoming state board of outfitters and 6 7 professional guides meeting the specifications of W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv)(J), Wyoming correctional officer, probation 8 9 and parole agent employed by the Wyoming department of 10 corrections, employee of the Wyoming department of 11 corrections' institutions whose duties most often occur 12 outside the presence of a Wyoming correctional officer and 13 primarily include the direct supervision, care and control 14 of persons committed to the custody of or transferred to the department of corrections, Wyoming law enforcement 15 16 academy instructor, University of Wyoming campus police 17 officer, detention officer or dispatcher for law enforcement agencies; 18

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22 (a) Coverage of probation and parole agents employed 23 by the Wyoming department of corrections and employees of 24 the Wyoming department of corrections' institutions whose

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duties most often occur outside the presence of a Wyoming 1 2 correctional officer and primarily include the direct 3 supervision, care and control of persons committed to the 4 custody of or transferred to the department of corrections 5 under W.S. 9-3-432 as provided by section 1 of this act shall not be implemented by the Wyoming retirement board 6 until funds payable to the Wyoming retirement system are 7 received for deposit into the retirement account, 8 9 necessary for maintaining the actuarial integrity of the 10 account and funding all liability arising under this act, 11 for years of service prior to the date of entry or 12 expansion of coverage.

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In addition to subsection (a) of this section, 14 (b) W.S. 9-3-432, with respect to probation and parole agents 15 employed by the Wyoming department of corrections and 16 17 employees of the Wyoming department of corrections' institutions whose duties most often occur outside the 18 presence of a Wyoming correctional officer and primarily 19 include the direct supervision, care and control of persons 20 21 committed to the custody of or transferred to the 22 department of corrections, shall not be implemented by the Wyoming retirement board until funds necessary 23 24 maintaining the actuarial integrity of the account and

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1 funding any liability arising under this act, are deposited

2 into the Wyoming retirement account by the Wyoming

3 department of corrections and contributions required under

4 W.S. 9-3-432(a) and (b) are paid to the Wyoming retirement

5 system for deposit into the retirement account for at least

6 two (2) months of covered service following the date of

7 entry of coverage, as applicable.

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9 Section 3. There is appropriated three million nine hundred thousand dollars (\$3,900,000.00) from the general 10 11 fund to the department of corrections to be deposited in 12 the retirement account as required by section 2 of this act 13 to fund the liability arising under this act for the coverage of Wyoming probation and parole agents employed by 14 the department of corrections and other employees of the 15 16 Wyoming department of corrections' institutions 17 duties most often occur outside the presence of a Wyoming correctional officer and primarily include the direct 18 supervision, care and control of persons committed to the 19 20 custody of or transferred to the department of corrections, 21 as provided in section 1 of this act.
