for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming national guard; establishing
- 2 a Wyoming national guard educational assistance trust fund;
- 3 specifying use of trust fund investment income; accordingly
- 4 modifying educational assistance payments for guard members
- 5 and specifying full payment of tuition and fees to the
- 6 extent funds are available; and providing for an effective
- 7 date.

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9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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11 **Section 1.** W.S. 19-9-505 is created to read:

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- 13 19-9-505. Wyoming national guard educational
- 14 assistance trust fund; established; corpus inviolate;
- 15 investment by state treasurer; expenditure of investment
- 16 earnings; annual report.

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2 (a) An account within the trust and agency fund is 3 established which shall be referred to as the Wyoming 4 national guard educational assistance trust fund. The 5 trust fund shall consist of those funds designated to the 6 account by law.

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(b) Monies deposited into the trust fund established 8 9 pursuant to this section are inviolate and constitute a 10 permanent or perpetual trust fund. The monies shall be transmitted to the state treasurer for credit to the trust 11 12 fund and shall be invested by the state treasurer authorized under W.S. 9-4-711 in a manner to obtain the 13 highest return possible consistent with the preservation of 14 the corpus. The interest earned from investment of the 15 16 corpus of the trust fund shall be annually credited by the 17 state treasurer not later than June 30 of each year into a separate account within the trust and agency fund. 18 expenditure of amounts credited to this separate investment 19 20 income account shall be made by the adjutant general for 21 educational assistance payments for active members of the 22 Wyoming national guard authorized under W.S. 19-9-503.

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(c) Commencing September 1, 2006, and each September 1 2 1 thereafter, the adjutant general shall provide an annual 3 report to the governor and the joint appropriations interim 4 committee specifying the total amount of interest income 5 earned from the trust fund during the preceding state fiscal year and the total amount of educational assistance 6 7 provided from the interest income during the same reporting period. 8 9 10 **Section 2.** W.S. 19-9-503(a) (intro), (b) (intro), (i) 11 through (iii) and by creating a new subsection (c) is 12 amended to read: 13 14 19-9-503. Requirements for educational assistance; 15 assistance payments. 16 17 (a) Subject to legislative appropriation From amounts deposited within the Wyoming national guard educational 18 19 assistance trust fund investment income account pursuant to 20 W.S. 19-9-505 (b) and in accordance with the provisions of 21 this article, the adjutant general or his designee, may 22 shall authorize the payment of higher education tuition and

mandatory fees for active members of the Wyoming national

18 mandatory fee charges of all Wyoming public institutions of

19 higher education for an undergraduate student enrolled for

20 twelve (12) semester hours;

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22 (iii) Eligible members who are not Wyoming

23 residents may shall receive benefits payments as provided

24 in paragraphs (i) and (ii) of this subsection, but the

benefit payment shall not exceed the amount of tuition and 1 2 mandatory fees which would have been charged if the member 3 were a Wyoming resident; 4 5 (c) If amounts within the Wyoming national guard 6 trust fund investment income account established under W.S. 7 19-9-505(b) are not sufficient to make tuition and mandatory fee payments under this section, the adjutant 8 9 general or his designee shall make a pro rata reduction in payments to institutions on behalf of active members until 10 11 such time as sufficient amounts become available. 12
