for

1 AN ACT relating to education; providing for scholarships 2 for attendance at Wyoming community colleges and the University of Wyoming as specified; specifying eligibility 3 4 criteria, conditions and limitations; imposing duties on 5 the Wyoming department of education, the University of 6 Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges, the community college 7 commission and school districts; delegating rulemaking 8 authority; defining terms; imposing reporting requirements; providing an appropriation and providing for a continuous 9 appropriation; authorizing positions; and providing for an 10 11 effective date.

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13 It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 14

5	HATHAWAY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

7	21-16-1301. Definitions.
8	
9	(a) As used in this article:
10	
11	(i) "Academic term" means the fall semester or
12	term or the spring semester or term. In this article,
13	"term" and "semester" have the same meaning except that
14	recipients may elect to use the scholarship during summer
15	school, which counts toward the maximum number of terms for
16	which the student is eligible but does not count toward
17	computation of an academic year;
18	
19	(ii) "Academic year" means two (2) consecutive
20	semesters or terms and is the period of time a full-time
21	student is expected to complete the equivalent of at least
22	two (2) semesters of academic work;
23	

(iii) "Expenditure account" means the Hathaway 1 2 scholarship expenditure account established under W.S. 3 21-16-1302; 4 5 (iv) "ACT score" means a composite score on the American College Test or an equivalent score on the 6 7 Scholastic Aptitude Test; 8 9 (v) "Certificate" means a credential other than a degree as defined in paragraph (vii) of this subsection. 10 11 A "certificate" is either an associate of applied science degree or indicates satisfactory completion of training in 12 13 an academic year program of study offered by a Wyoming

14 community college;

(vi) "Convicted" means an unvacated determination of guilt by any court having legal jurisdiction of the offense and from which no appeal is pending and includes pleas of guilty and nolo contendere. "Convicted" shall not include dispositions pursuant to W.S. 7-13-301, 7-13-302(a), 35-7-1037 or deferred prosecutions;

23 The convictions excluded by the above language

1 completed without a final judgment of conviction 2 ever being entered. 3 (vii) "Degree" means a baccalaureate or an 4 5 associate degree other than a certificate; 6 7 (viii) "Department" means the Wyoming department of education; 8 9 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 10 The department of education will implement the 11 program overall. The University and community 12 colleges will generally determine eligibility, 13 within the statutory guidelines. 14 (ix) "Eligible high school" means a public or 15 16 private secondary school that is located in Wyoming and is 17 accredited by the department; 18 19 (x) "Eligible institution" means the University 20 of Wyoming or a Wyoming community college; 21 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 2.2 definition limits the scholarships This to 23 attendance at the University of Wyoming and 24 Wyoming community colleges. 25 2.6 (xi) "Grade point average" or "GPA" means the numbered grade average calculated using a 4.0 scale. High 27 school GPAs for preliminary eligibility determinations 28 29 under this article shall be determined as of the end of the

1 first semester of a student's senior year, or for students 2 graduating prior to their senior year as of the end of the 3 semester immediately prior to the last semester before the 4 student's graduation. High school GPAs for final 5 eligibility determinations under this article shall be determined as of the completion of a student's senior year, 6 7 or for students graduating prior to their senior year as of the completion of the student's secondary education; 8 9 10 "Graduate of an out-of-state high school" (xii) means a person attending and graduating from an out-of-11 12 state high-school pursuant to W.S. 21-4-501; 13 "Satisfactory academic progress" means 14 (xiii) 15 completing at least twelve (12) semester hours per semester and meeting such other criteria as established by the 16 17 eligible institution to ensure the student earns his degree or certificate in a timely manner; 18 19 20 (xiii) "Scholarship" means an award provided 21 pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1304, 21-16-1305 or 21-16-1306; 22

23 (xiv) "Semester hour" means each nonremedial 24 semester hour attempted for credit toward a degree or

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21-16-1302. Hathaway scholarship expenditure account
 created; use and appropriation of funds.

3

4 Hathaway scholarship expenditure account The is 5 created to consist of earnings from the Hathaway student scholarship endowment account created by W.S. 21-16-1201 6 and such other funds appropriated by the legislature to the 7 expenditure account. Eighty percent (80%) of all monies 8 9 deposited to the expenditure account under this section shall be available for scholarships under W.S. 21-16-1304 10 and 21-16-1305. Twenty percent (20%) of all monies 11 deposited to the expenditure account under this section 12 13 shall be available for scholarships under W.S. 21-16-1306. 14 Monies within the expenditure account are continuously appropriated to the state treasurer for distribution to 15 eligible institutions based on scholarships awarded under 16 17 this article. All unexpended and unencumbered monies within the expenditure account at the end of each fiscal 18 19 year shall be deposited to the Hathaway student scholarship 20 endowment account.

21

*** STAFF COMMENTS ***

This divides all earnings from the scholarship endowment account, with 80% being used for merit scholarships and 20% for merit/need scholarships. All earnings are automatically made available for the scholarship program; it would not require a legislative appropriation each biennium to use

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1 the funds from earnings. If earnings exceed scholarship payments at the end of any fiscal 2 3 year, the remaining funds would revert to the 4 endowment corpus. 5 6 21-16-1303. Hathaway scholarship program; eligibility 7 requirements. 8 9 There is created the Hathaway scholarship program (a) for Wyoming students. 10 11 12 (b) Under the Hathaway scholarship program, subject 13 to availability of funds as determined by the legislature, 14 the state shall provide a scholarship pursuant to W.S. 15 21-16-1304 and 21-16-1305 to any student who has been 16 accepted by and enrolls in an eligible institution to pursue a degree or certificate, and who meets the following 17 18 qualifications:

19

20 (i) The student has demonstrated Wyoming 21 residency as determined by the eligible institution at 22 which the student is enrolled;

23

(ii) The student has successfully completed a
 curriculum and meets standards for admission to the
 eligible institution. Until success curricula requirements

1 are established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307, the curriculum requirement of this paragraph shall be that applicable for 2 3 assured admission to the University of Wyoming. For first-4 time students who enroll in an eligible institution in the 5 fall of 2011, and thereafter, curriculum requirements for a scholarship under this article shall be as established 6 7 pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307; 8 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 9 The above needs to be read in conjunction with 10 21-16-1307 and the accompanying staff comment. 11 12 (iii) The student has not been convicted of a 13 felony; and 14 15 (iv) The student has: 16 17 (A) Graduated from an eligible high school or is otherwise eligible under rules promulgated pursuant 18 to W.S. 21-16-1308(b)(iii) and (iv); 19 20 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 21 The "otherwise eligible" refers to home schoolers 22 and GED recipients. 23 24 (B) Applied for a scholarship under this 25 article within two (2) years of the date of high school 26 graduation, or is otherwise eligible under rules 27 promulgated pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1308(b)(iii) and (iv).

1 The department shall by rule and regulation establish exceptions to the requirement of this subparagraph for 2 military service, religious service and other good cause 3 4 shown; and 5 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** Depending on when this bill is made effective 6 this would initially allow more than one high 7 8 school graduating class to receive the first 9 Hathaway scholarships; i.e., in addition to the 10 class graduating after this bill is effective, 11 those graduated previously as long as the 12 application is within two years of the high 13 school graduation date. 14 15 (C) The minimum high school cumulative 16 grade point average and minimum composite ACT or cumulative 17 WORKKEYS score specified under this article for the type of 18 scholarship to be awarded. 19 20 Notwithstanding W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(ix), students (C) 21 who are Wyoming residents and graduates of an out-of-state 22 high school shall be deemed to have graduated from an 23 eligible high school for the purpose of qualifying under this article. Notwithstanding W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(ix) or 24 paragraph (b)(i) of this section, a student whose custodial 25 26 parent or guardian is in active military service and maintains Wyoming as that parent's or guardian's state of 27 28 domicile is deemed to be a Wyoming resident and if a high

1 school graduate of a high school outside of Wyoming accredited by the appropriate regional accrediting agency 2 3 shall be deemed to have graduated from an eligible high 4 school for the purpose of qualifying under this article. 5 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 6 The above allows a student of a military parent 7 who maintains Wyoming as the parent's state of qualify 8 domicile to as а Wyoming student 9 regardless of where the student resides. 10

11 No student shall be eligible for a scholarship (d) pursuant to this article for more than eight 12 (8) 13 consecutive semesters or an equivalent number of units 14 comprising four (4) academic years eligible in an 15 institution which operates on a schedule based on units 16 other than semesters, unless an extension is granted by the 17 department for cause pursuant to rule and regulation. For purposes of this subsection a student's eligibility shall 18 be deemed to have commenced with the first semester in 19 which the state is obligated to reimburse an eligible 20 21 institution for the student's scholarship under this 22 article.

23 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 24 This places an overall eligibility cap on all scholarships under this program at a maximum of 4 25 26 consecutive years. Thus, unless an extension is 27 granted, once the state is obligated to pay 28 Hathaway scholarship funds to an eligible 29 institution student, for а particular his of 30 eligibility will expire at the end 4

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1 consecutive academic years, regardless of whether 2 he receives a scholarship each semester. 3 4 A student is not eligible for a scholarship under (e) 5 this article if he: 6 7 (i) Is not a United States citizen or а permanent resident alien who meets the definition of an 8 eligible noncitizen under federal Title IV requirements; 9 10 11 (ii) Has not complied with United States 12 selective service system requirements for registration, if 13 the requirements are applicable to the student; 14 15 (iii) Is in default on a federal Title IV education loan. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a 16 17 student who is otherwise eligible for a scholarship under 18 this article and has fully repaid a defaulted loan or is no longer in default, from receiving a scholarship for future 19 20 academic semesters; 21 22 (iv) Owes a refund under a federal Title IV 23 student financial aid program or a student financial aid program administered through the state. Nothing in this 24 25 paragraph prohibits a student from receiving a scholarship

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1 for future academic semesters who is otherwise eligible for 2 a scholarship under this article and has fully paid the 3 refund owed; 4 5 (v) Is incarcerated; or 6 7 (vi) Does not otherwise qualify under this article for a scholarship. 8 9 21-16-1304. Degree scholarships. 10 11 12 (a) Any student who meets the criteria under W.S. 13 21-16-1303 is eligible to receive a degree scholarship to 14 pursue a degree or certificate as follows: 15 16 (i) With a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 17 2.50 and a composite ACT score of at least eighteen (18), a scholarship for seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) per 18 semester for a maximum of four (4) semesters at a Wyoming 19 20 community college; 21 22 (ii) With a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 3.5 and a composite ACT score of at least twenty-three 23 24 (23), a scholarship for one thousand two hundred fifty

dollars (\$1,250.00) per semester for a maximum of eight (8)
 semesters at an eligible institution.

3

4 (b) A student who receives a scholarship under 5 paragraph (a) (i) of this section who earns at least fortyeight (48) semester hours at the eligible institution with 6 a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 shall receive 7 an additional scholarship for seven hundred fifty dollars 8 9 (\$750.00) per semester for a maximum of four (4) semesters at the University of Wyoming if the student maintains a 10 minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise remains 11 eligible for a scholarship under this article. 12

13 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 14 The above allows a two year scholarship to be 15 extended to four years if the college GPA and 16 hours are met. 17

18 (c) To remain eligible for the scholarship under this19 section, the student shall:

20

(i) Make satisfactory academic progress toward a degree and earn not less than the minimum number of credits required of recipients of federal financial aid for classification as a full-time student during each semester, or in the final semester before completion of the degree, the required number of hours necessary for completion. If

a student fails to maintain the cumulative grade point 1 average required for continuation in the program as 2 3 provided in this subsection, the student shall become 4 ineligible for the scholarship in subsequent semesters 5 unless granted an exception for cause by the department or except as otherwise provided in this subsection. The 6 7 scholarship under this article may be reinstated for the subsequent semester following attainment of the cumulative 8 9 grade point average required of the applicable scholarship under paragraph (iv) of this subsection, provided that the 10 applicable maximum number of semesters specified under 11 subsection (a) of this section, including semesters for 12 13 which a scholarship was not received, has not been reached; 14 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 15 If the GPA falls below the required minimum and the scholarship is lost, it can be restored for 16 17 later semesters once the cumulative minimum GPA 18 is reached, but each semester lost cannot be 19 regained. 20 21 (ii) Maintain continuous enrollment for not less 22 than two (2) semesters in each successive academic year, 23 unless granted an exception for cause by the department; 24

25 (iii) Not have been convicted of any felony; and 26

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1 (iv) Maintain a cumulative grade point average 2 as evaluated at the end of each academic year as follows: 3 4 (A) For scholarships awarded under 5 paragraph (a) (i) of this section, at least a 2.25 GPA; 6 7 (B) For scholarships awarded under paragraph (a) (ii) of this section, at least a 2.75 GPA. 8 9 10 (d) A student receiving a scholarship under paragraph 11 (a) (ii) of this section who fails to meet the GPA requirements of subsection (c) of this section necessary to 12 13 maintain that scholarship may be awarded a scholarship 14 under paragraph (a) (i) of this section for attendance at the appropriate eligible institution if he meets the 15 16 requirements necessary to maintain that scholarship. 17 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 18 If the higher scholarship is lost due to GPA, the 19 lower can be awarded if the GPA requirements for 20 the lower are met. 21 22 21-16-1305. Certificate scholarships. 23 24 (a) Any student who meets the criteria under W.S. 25 21-16-1303 is eligible to receive a certificate scholarship 26 to pursue a certificate as follows:

1 2 (i) With a minimum cumulative high school GPA of 2.50 and either a composite ACT score of at least eighteen 3 (18) or a cumulative score of at least twelve (12) points 4 5 on applied math, reading for information and locating information on WORKKEYS tests, a scholarship for seven 6 hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) for a maximum of four (4) 7 semesters at a Wyoming community college; 8 9 (ii) A student who receives a scholarship under 10 paragraph (i) of this subsection or W.S. 21-16-1304(a)(i) 11 and who earns a certificate from the community college with 12 13 a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 may receive an additional scholarship for seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) per 14 semester for a maximum of four (4) semesters at a Wyoming 15 16 community college if the student maintains a minimum 17 cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise remains eligible for a scholarship under this article. A student who receives an 18 additional scholarship under W.S. 21-16-1304(b) shall not 19 receive an additional scholarship under this paragraph. 20 21 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 22 The paragraph above would allow a community

college student to pursue a second certificate or
 an associate degree. Earlier provisions, W.S.
 21-16-1304(a)(i) and (b), would allow a student
 to attend community college for 4 semesters and
 then UW for an additional 4 semesters. If a

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student received that additional scholarship for a degree, he could not receive this additional certificate scholarship.

5 (b) To remain eligible for the scholarship award 6 under this section, the student shall:

7

8 (i) Make satisfactory academic progress toward a 9 certificate and earn not less than the minimum number of 10 credits required of recipients of federal financial aid for classification as a full-time student during each semester 11 12 or in the final semester before completion of the 13 certificate, the required number of hours necessary for 14 completion. If a student fails to maintain the cumulative grade point average required for continuation in the 15 16 program provided in paragraph (iv) of this subsection, the 17 student shall become ineligible for the scholarship in subsequent semesters unless granted an exception for cause 18 by the department or except as otherwise provided in this 19 20 subsection. The scholarship under this article may be reinstated for the subsequent semester following attainment 21 of the cumulative grade point average required under 22 paragraph (iv) of this subsection provided that the maximum 23 24 number of semesters specified under subsection (a) of this

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1 section, including semesters for which a scholarship was 2 not received, has not been reached; 3 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** provisions regarding 4 The loss same of a 5 scholarship and regaining it apply to the 6 certificate scholarship as well as the degree 7 scholarship. 8 9 (ii) Maintain continuous enrollment for not less 10 than two (2) semesters in each successive academic year, 11 unless granted an exception for cause by the department; 12 13 (iii) Not have been convicted of any felony; and 14 15 (iv) Maintain a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.25 GPA, as evaluated at the end of each 16 17 academic year for certificates that require more than one (1) academic year. 18 19 20 21-16-1306. Need based scholarships. 21 22 In addition to scholarships made available under (a) W.S. 21-16-1304 and 21-16-1305 there shall be made 23 24 available a need based Hathaway scholarship as follows:

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1 (i) The scholarship shall be available only to students qualifying for a scholarship under W.S. 21-16-1304 2 3 or 21-16-1305 and for federal financial aid. In addition, 4 the student shall have unmet financial need; 5 6 (ii) If a student has unmet financial need in excess of two thousand dollars (\$2,000.00) he shall qualify 7 for a scholarship under this section in an amount not to 8 9 exceed the lesser of twenty-five percent (25%) of that unmet financial need or five hundred dollars (\$500.00), for 10

11 each semester of qualification.

12

(b) The department shall provide scholarships under this section from funds made available under W.S. 21-16-1302. All requirements for scholarship recipients applicable under this article shall be applicable to scholarships under this section.

18 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** This need based scholarship component would be 19 20 available only if the student also qualified for 21 a Hathaway merit scholarship. "Unmet financial 22 need" is defined in 21-16-1301; paraphrased, it 23 is tuition, mandatory fees, books, room and board 24 minus all scholarships and grants, federal loans 25 and work study funds and expected family 26 contribution (calculated using the federal 27 The maximum Hathaway need financial aid form). scholarship component that could be 28 received 29 would be 25% of the "unmet need", not to exceed 30 \$500 per semester.

2 21-16-1307. Success curriculum; test standards.
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4 (a) Not later than October 1, 2006, the department 5 shall recommend to the governor and the joint education 6 interim committee of the legislature, in consultation with 7 the University of Wyoming, each Wyoming community college 8 and the Wyoming community college commission:

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The contents of an appropriate success 10 (i) 11 curriculum for degree scholarship students and, in 12 consultation with each community college and the 13 commission, the contents of an appropriate success curriculum for certificate scholarship students. 14 The success curricula and cumulative GPA requirements 15 for performance in the success curricula shall, upon approval 16 17 of the legislature, enable students entering high school in the fall of 2007 to pursue those curricula for scholarship 18 eligibility under this article beginning with the fall of 19 20 2011. The success curricula shall include at least four 21 (4) years of mathematics, science, and reading/language 22 arts and three (3) years of social studies in grades 9 through 12; 23

*** STAFF COMMENTS ***

1 Curriculum requirements would not be fully 2 implemented until this upcoming school year's 3 eighth graders are entering ninth grade. Until 4 that time, unless the legislation is changed, the 5 curriculum requirements would be that imposed by 6 Wyoming for the University of "assured The remaining paragraphs provide for 7 admission". 8 recommendations to make changes until full 9 implementation.

11 (ii) Components of the success curricula to be 12 included in the criteria for eligibility for both the 13 degree and certificate scholarships during each year of the 14 phase-in of the Hathaway scholarship program prior to 15 complete implementation in the fall of 2011;

17 (iii) adoption of statewide The student 18 assessment standards and scores administered pursuant to 19 W.S. 21-2-304(a) to supplant or augment qualifying ACT or 20 WORKKEYS scores for scholarships under this article. The recommended adoption of statewide assessment standards and 21 22 scores shall be designed to provide incentives for students to pursue a rigorous curriculum and strive to achieve 23 academic success in high school. 24

26 (b) Not later than October 1, 2007, and by October 1 27 in each odd-numbered year thereafter, the department, in 28 consultation with the University of Wyoming, Wyoming

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community colleges and the community college commission, 1 2 shall report to the governor and the joint education 3 interim committee of the legislature on recommendations for 4 modifications to the minimum cumulative GPA and minimum 5 composite ACT or cumulative WORKKEYS scores contained in this article to ensure that 6 the Hathaway scholarship 7 program is designed to provide the desired incentives for students to pursue a rigorous curriculum and strive to 8 9 achieve academic success. 10 11 *** STAFF COMMENTS *** 12 Until these curricula are adopted by further 13 legislative action, the UW assured admissions 14 requirements would be applicable. But the 15 language is written in the assumption that other 16 curricula will be developed for full 17 implementation in the fall of 2011. 18 19 21-16-1308. Administration; rules and regulations. 20 21 This article shall be administered by the (a) 22 department and state treasurer in accordance with the 23 following: 24 25 (i) Students shall make application for 26 scholarships under this article with the eligible 27 institution at the time of applying for admission or in any

1 event prior to the beginning of the semester at the 2 eligible institution;

3

4 (ii) Upon request of a student applying to an 5 eligible institution and initially applying for a Hathaway scholarship, each school district shall provide to the 6 eligible institution an official transcript of 7 the student's academic record through the student's most recent 8 9 semester of attendance. Following graduation and upon the 10 student's request the school district shall also provide to 11 the eligible institution an official transcript of the 12 student's complete academic record in the same year;

13

14 (iii) For student's transferring from an eligible institution to another eligible institution and 15 making application for continuance of a scholarship, the 16 17 institution from which the student is transferring shall at the student's request provide an official transcript to the 18 new institution and shall provide a list of all semesters 19 20 of attendance in which a Hathaway scholarship was received 21 by the student or in which a student previously qualifying 22 for a Hathaway scholarship was determined ineligible for the Hathaway scholarship; 23

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1 (iv) Each eligible institution receiving an 2 application from a student applying for a Hathaway 3 scholarship shall preliminarily determine the student's 4 eligibility for the scholarship. For students initially 5 applying for a scholarship, unless the student's complete academic record is available, the GPA used to preliminarily 6 7 determine eligibility shall be based upon the student's official high school transcript after the student's last 8 9 semester prior to graduation. The GPA used to finally 10 determine scholarship eligibility for initial applicants shall be the student's complete high school academic 11 12 Upon final determination of scholarship record. 13 eligibility, each community college shall certify to the community college commission not later than thirty (30) 14 days after the semester commences, a list of students 15 16 enrolled at the institution who qualify for a scholarship 17 under this article, including the amount of each scholarship. The University shall certify to the state 18 auditor within thirty (30) days after the semester 19 20 commences a like list for students enrolled at the 21 University. The director of the community college 22 commission shall verify that there is no duplication of students on the community college lists and shall certify 23 24 to the state auditor the amount each college is to receive

1 under this article. The state treasurer shall pay from the 2 scholarship expenditure account the amount due each 3 community college according to warrants drawn by the state 4 auditor upon vouchers issued and signed by the director of 5 the commission and shall pay from the scholarship expenditure account the amount due the University according 6 7 to warrants drawn by the state auditor upon vouchers issued and signed by the chief financial officer of the 8 9 University.
