6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-30-108 is amended to read:

10 11-30-108. Abandonment of sheep by herders.

- 12 (a) It is unlawful for any person having charge as
- 13 herder of any sheep to willfully desert and abandon the
- 14 sheep upon the open range and leave them without care or
- 15 attention except in those cases where the life or health of

1 the herder is in imminent or immediate danger. The herder shall in all cases where practical give the owner or his 2 3 employer not less than five (5) days notice prior to the 4 time at which he intends to abandon the sheep. Any person 5 who violates this section shall be fined not less than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) 6 nor more than seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00) ten 7 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), imprisoned not more than six 8 (6) months one (1) year, or both. 9 10 (b) Any person who knowingly and willingly aids or 11 abets any herder in the commission of an offense under 12 13 subsection (a) of this section shall be subject to the same 14 fines and imprisonment as provided for in subsection (a) of 15 this section. 16 17 (c) Any person who offers alternative employment to a 18 herder knowing that such an offer would cause the herder to abandon sheep upon the open range shall be fined not less 19 20 than ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) nor more than twenty 21 thousand dollars (\$20,000.00), imprisoned not more than one 22 (1) year, or both. 23 24 (d) As used in this section:

2 (i) "Abandon" means the act of intentionally 3 deserting or relinquishing control or intentionally leaving 4 sheep that have been entrusted in the care of a herder 5 without providing due notice, as provided in subsection (a) of this section, to the owner or his employer with ultimate 6 7 responsibility for the sheep that the herder intends to 8 cease such control or care. 9 (ii) "Herder" means the person who has been 10 charged with the day to day care and responsibility for the 11 sheep by the owner or employer with ultimate responsibility 12 13 for the sheep. 14 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2006. 15
