for

AN ACT relating to penalties for violations of electrical licensing provisions; authorizing the electrical board to issue notices of violation of the electrical licensing statutes and impose civil penalties; authorizing the electrical board to act as the recommending agency to district attorneys or the attorney general for proceedings

7 to enjoin violations of electrical licensing statutes;

8 repealing criminal penalties; and providing for an

11 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

13 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-9-124(d) and 35-9-130(b) and by

14 creating new subsections (c) through (f) is amended to

2 35-9-124. Powers and duties of board; appeals.

4 (d) Except as provided by subsection (e) of this 5 section, any person whose application for a license is denied, who has been assessed a civil penalty under W.S. 6 7 35-9-130(c) or whose license is suspended, cancelled or 8 refused by the board may appeal to the appropriate district 9 court.

(b) Violators of W.S. 35-9-101 through 35-9-130 may also be enjoined from continuing the violation by proceedings brought by the district or county and prosecuting attorney or by the attorney general. The electrical board shall make recommendations to the appropriate district attorney, county and prosecuting attorney or attorney general regarding proceedings under this subsection.

(c) A person who violates W.S. 35-9-101 through 35-9-22 23 130 shall pay a civil penalty in an amount the electrical 24 board determines of not more than one thousand dollars

- 1 (\$1,000.00) for a first offense, or two thousand dollars
- 2 (\$2,000.00) for any subsequent offense within any three (3)
- 3 month period. The penalty shall be collected from the
- 4 violator and credited as provided by W.S. 8-1-109.

- 6 (d) Before the electrical board imposes a civil
- 7 penalty, the board shall notify the person accused of a
- 8 violation, in writing, stating specifically the nature of
- 9 the alleged violation and fixing a time and place, at least
- 10 ten (10) days from the date of the notice, when a hearing
- 11 of the matter shall be held. After hearing or upon failure
- 12 of the accused to appear at the hearing, the electrical
- 13 board shall determine the amount of the civil penalty to be
- 14 imposed in accordance with the limitations expressed in
- 15 subsection (c) of this section. Each violation is a
- 16 separate offense.

- 18 (e) A civil penalty may be recovered in an action
- 19 brought thereon in the name of the state of Wyoming in any
- 20 court of appropriate jurisdiction, and the court may review
- 21 the penalty as to both liability and reasonableness of
- 22 amount.

(f) The provisions of subsections (c) through (e) are in addition to and not instead of any other enforcement provisions contained in this article. **Section 2.** W.S. 35-9-130(a) is repealed. **Section 3.** This act is effective July 1, 2006. (END)
