1 (c) Any person under the age of twenty-one (21) years who attempts in any manner to purchase alcoholic or malt 2 3 beverages or who falsifies any identification or uses any 4 false identification in order to obtain alcoholic or malt 5 beverages is guilty of a misdemeanor. If it has been 6 determined by the jury, or a judge in a nonjury trial, that 7 a motor vehicle was used by a minor to facilitate the offense, the judge may order a copy of the minor's record 8 9 of conviction under this subsection to be forwarded to the department of transportation. The department of 10 transportation may then suspend the minor's driver's 11 license in accordance with W.S. 31-7-129(c). Any driver's 12 13 license suspension as a result of a conviction under this 14 subsection shall not be the basis for any increase in 15 insurance premiums or the cancellation of any insurance policy for a minor, his parents or guardian. 16 31-7-129.
