AN ACT relating to education; providing for scholarships 1 for attendance at Wyoming community colleges and the 2 University of Wyoming as specified; specifying eligibility 3 4 criteria, conditions and limitations; imposing duties on the Wyoming department of education, the University of 5 Wyoming, Wyoming community colleges, the community college 6 commission, school districts and the state treasurer; 7 8 delegating rulemaking authority; defining terms; imposing reporting requirements; modifying other tuition programs; 9 10 providing for a continuous appropriation; and providing for 11 an effective date.

7	21-16-1301. Definitions.

9	(a) As used in this article:
10	
11	(i) "Academic term" means the fall semester or
12	term or the spring semester or term. In this article,
13	"term" and "semester" have the same meaning except that
14	recipients may elect to use the scholarship during summer
15	school, which counts toward the maximum number of terms for
16	which the student is eligible but does not count toward
17	computation of an academic year;
18	
19	(ii) "Academic year" means two (2) consecutive
20	semesters or terms and is the period of time a full-time
21	student is expected to complete the equivalent of at least
22	two (2) semesters of academic work;

(iii) "ACT score" means a composite score on the 1

- (xvi) "Semester hour" means each nonremedial 14

- 17 earning a high school diploma or a general educational
- development (GED) equivalency diploma; 18

- (xvii) "Title IV" means Title IV of the federal 20
- 21 Higher Education Act of 1965, as amended;

- (xviii) "Unmet financial need" means the cost of 23
- 24 attendance minus the sum of expected family contribution

1 and all federal, state, local, institutional and privately

2 funded scholarships or grants received by the student, all

3 as determined by the institution. The institution shall

4 use the most recent federal free application for federal

5 student aid form to determine expected family contribution

9 (xix) "WORKKEYS SCORE" means qualifying scores

10 on the WORKKEYS job skills assessment test. In the event

11 the WORKKEYS job skills assessment test is superseded,

12 becomes too expensive to administer or goes out of general

use, the department shall specify by rule and regulation a 13

14 replacement test to be used.

15

16 21-16-1302. Hathaway scholarship expenditure account

17 created; reserve account created; use and appropriation of

18 funds.

19

20 The Hathaway scholarship expenditure account is

21 created to consist of earnings from the Hathaway student

22 scholarship endowment account created by W.S. 21-16-1201

and such other funds appropriated by the legislature to the 23

expenditure account. Eighty percent (80%) of all monies 24

1 deposited to the expenditure account under this section

2 shall be available for scholarships under W.S. 21-16-1304

3 and 21-16-1305. Twenty percent (20%) of all monies

4 deposited to the expenditure account under this section

5 shall be available for scholarships under W.S. 21-16-1306.

6 Monies within the expenditure account are continuously

7 appropriated to the state treasurer for distribution to

8 eligible institutions based on scholarships awarded under

9 this article. All unexpended and unencumbered monies

10 within the expenditure account at the end of each fiscal

11 year shall be deposited by the state treasurer to the

12 Hathaway student scholarship reserve account.

14 (b) There is created the Hathaway student scholarship

15 reserve account. The reserve account shall consist of

16 those monies deposited to the account pursuant to

17 subsection (a) of this section and such other funds

18 appropriated by the legislature to the reserve account. To

19 the extent funds within the Hathaway scholarship

20 expenditure account are insufficient in any fiscal year to

21 fully fund scholarships awarded under this article, monies

22 within the reserve account shall be deposited by the state

23 treasurer to the expenditure account for distribution to

- 15 There is created the Hathaway scholarship program

- (b) Under the Hathaway scholarship program, subject 18
- to availability of funds as determined by the legislature, 19
- 20 the state shall provide a scholarship pursuant to W.S.
- 21 21-16-1304 and 21-16-1305 to any student who has been
- 22 accepted by and enrolls in an eligible institution to
- pursue a degree or certificate, and who meets the following 23
- 24 qualifications:

2 student demonstrated (i) The has Wyoming 3 residency as determined by the eligible institution at 4 which the student is enrolled;

(ii) The student has successfully completed a 7 curriculum and meets standards for admission to the eligible institution. Until success curricula requirements 8 9 are established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307, the curriculum 10 requirement of this paragraph for degree seeking Hathaway 11 scholarship recipients shall be that applicable for assured 12 admission to the University of Wyoming. Until success 13 curricula requirements are established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307, there shall be no curriculum requirement for 14 certificate seeking Hathaway scholarship recipients. 15 first-time students who enroll in an eligible institution 16 17 in the fall of 2011, and thereafter, curriculum requirements for a scholarship under this article shall be 18 as established pursuant to W.S. 21-16-1307; and 19

(A) Graduated from an eligible high school 1

2 or is otherwise eligible under rules promulgated pursuant

20 students who are Wyoming residents and graduates of an out-

21 of-state high school shall be deemed to have graduated from

22 an eligible high school for the purpose of qualifying under

this article. Notwithstanding W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(viii) or 23

paragraph (b)(i) of this section, a student whose custodial 24

parent or quardian is in active military service and 1

2 maintains Wyoming as that parent's or guardian's state of

3 domicile is deemed to be a Wyoming resident and if a high

4 school graduate of a high school outside of Wyoming

5 accredited by the appropriate regional accrediting agency

shall be deemed to have graduated from an eligible high 6

7 school for the purpose of qualifying under this article.

9 the requirements are applicable to the student;

11 (iii) Is in default on a federal Title IV

12 education loan. Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a

13 student who is otherwise eligible for a scholarship under

this article and has fully repaid a defaulted loan or is no 14

longer in default, from receiving a scholarship for future 15

16 academic semesters;

17

(iv) Owes a refund under a federal Title IV 18

19 student financial aid program or a subsequently enacted

20 similar federal student financial aid program, or a student

21 financial aid program administered through the state.

22 Nothing in this paragraph prohibits a student who is

otherwise eligible for a scholarship under this article and 23

has fully paid the refund owed, from receiving a 1

2 scholarship for future academic semesters;

4 (v) Owes past due child support in an amount

5 equal to at least triple the obligor's current monthly

child support obligation. Nothing in this paragraph 6

7 prohibits a student who is otherwise eligible for a

scholarship under this article and has fully paid all child 8

9 support obligation owed, from receiving a scholarship for

future academic semesters; 10

20 (a) Any student who meets the criteria under W.S.

21 21-16-1303 is eligible to receive a scholarship to pursue a

2 2.50 and a composite ACT score of at least nineteen (19), a

3 Hathaway opportunity scholarship for:

14 enrolled for twelve (12) or more semester hours;

(b) Scholarships under this section shall be for a 23

24 maximum of the equivalent of eight (8) full time semesters.

A scholarship under this section shall be available for 1

(i) Make satisfactory academic progress toward a 8 9 If a student fails to maintain the cumulative grade point average required for continuation in the 10 program as provided in this subsection, the student shall 11 12 ineligible for the scholarship in subsequent become 13 semesters unless granted an exception for cause by the department or except as otherwise provided 14 in this subsection. 4 enrolled and the denominator is twelve (12), if enrolled at

Scholarships under paragraph (i) of this 8 (ii)

9 subsection shall be for a maximum of the equivalent of four

12 (iii) A student who receives a scholarship under

13 paragraph (i) of this subsection and who earns

certificate from the community college with a minimum 14

cumulative GPA of 2.25 may receive an additional 15

scholarship at a Wyoming community college to pursue either 16

a certificate or a degree if the student maintains a 17

minimum cumulative GPA of 2.25 and otherwise remains 18

eligible for a scholarship under this article. 19 The

20 scholarship under this paragraph shall be for the same

21 amounts and subject to the same limitations as provided for

22 scholarships under paragraph (a)(i) of this section, except

24 certificate or a degree.

2 (b) To remain eligible for the scholarship award 3 under this section, the student shall:

3 (a) Not later than October 1, 2006, the department 4 shall recommend to the governor and the joint education 5 interim committee of the legislature, in consultation with 6 the University of Wyoming, each Wyoming community college

9 (i) The contents of an appropriate success 10 curriculum for Hathaway opportunity, performance and honor 11 scholarship students and, in consultation with each 12 community college and the commission, the contents of an 13 appropriate success curriculum for Hathaway career scholarship students. The success curricula and cumulative 14 GPA requirements for performance in the success curricula 15 16 shall, upon approval of the legislature, enable students 17 entering high school in the fall of 2007 to pursue those curricula for scholarship eligibility under this article 18 beginning with the fall of 2011. 5 21-16-1308. Administration; rules and regulations.

6

- 7 (a) This article shall be administered by the
- 8 department in accordance with the following:

9

- 10 (i) Students shall make application for
- 11 scholarships under this article with the eligible
- 12 institution at the time of applying for admission or in any
- 13 event prior to the beginning of the semester at the
- 14 eligible institution. The application shall contain
- 15 information as required by rule of the department. The
- 16 application shall require each applicant to verify under
- 17 penalty of false swearing under W.S. 6-3-505, that if the
- 18 applicant is subject to any order requiring payment of
- 19 child support, the applicant at the time of completing the
- 20 application does not owe past due child support of at least
- 21 triple the applicant's current monthly obligation;

- 23 (ii) Upon request of a student applying to an
- 24 eligible institution and initially applying for a Hathaway

1 scholarship, each school district shall provide to the

2 eligible institution an official transcript of the

3 student's academic record through the student's most recent

4 semester of attendance. Following graduation and upon the

5 student's request the school district shall also provide to

6 the eligible institution an official transcript of the

7 student's complete academic record;

8

9 (iii) For students transferring from an eligible institution to another eligible institution and making 10 11 application for continuance of a scholarship, the 12 institution from which the student is transferring shall at 13 the student's request provide an official transcript to the 14 new institution and shall provide a list of all semesters of attendance in which a Hathaway scholarship was received 15 by the student and, if applicable, a list of all semesters 16 17 for which a student previously qualifying for a Hathaway scholarship was determined ineligible for the Hathaway 18

scholarship;

21 (iv) Each eligible institution receiving an 22 application from a student applying for a Hathaway 23 scholarship shall preliminarily determine the student's 24 eligibility for the scholarship. For students initially
