A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to government services; authorizing the  
2 governor to establish partnerships among state and local  
3 governments and non-government agencies, as specified, to  
4 study and report on government health, human services and  
5 education programs; establishing criteria for those  
6 programs as specified; providing for reports; and providing  
7 for an effective date.

9 *Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:*

11 **Section 1.**

12

13 (a) The governor shall establish a partnership to  
14 include appropriate state and local government and non-

1 government agencies including but not limited to the  
2 executive branch, the department of education, local school  
3 districts, the judiciary, business, non-profit and faith  
4 organizations, professional organizations, the Tribes, the  
5 community college commission and the University of Wyoming.  
6 The partnership shall study and make recommendations for  
7 improving the effectiveness of state and local health,  
8 human services, and education programs. Critical program  
9 outcomes relating to the well-being of Wyoming children and  
10 families to be addressed by the partnership shall include,  
11 without limitation, the following goals for results:

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13 (i) Wyoming families and individuals will live  
14 in stable, safe, supportive, nurturing, healthy  
15 environments;

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17 (ii) Wyoming's economy will provide people with  
18 a livable income that ensures wage equality;

19

20 (iii) All people shall have affordable health  
21 care and insurance;

22

1           (iv) All Wyoming students will be successfully  
2 educated and prepared for life's opportunities;

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4           (v) All children will be born healthy and  
5 achieve their highest potential during their early  
6 development years and enter school ready to learn with the  
7 support of families and communities.

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9           (b) The success of the partnership's efforts to  
10 achieve the results set forth in subsection (a) above shall  
11 be measured by the following indicators:

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13           (i) Rate of abuse and neglect of children;

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15           (ii) Drug and alcohol use by juveniles;

17           (iii) Domestic violence rates;

18

19           (iv) Rate of divorce;

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21           (v) Suicide rates;

23           (vi) Car crash deaths among persons younger than  
24 twenty-five (25) years;

2           (vii) Numbers of jobs in extraction and non-  
3 extraction industries;

5           (viii) Families earning a livable wage;

6

7           (ix) Gender wage disparity;

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9           (x) Numbers of individuals holding more than one  
10 job at a time;

11

12           (xi) Wyoming wages;

14           (xii) Numbers of residents without health  
15 insurance;

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17           (xiii) Numbers of employers contributing to  
18 employee health insurance;

19

20           (xiv) Cost of uncompensated health care provided  
21 by Wyoming hospitals;

22

23           (xv) Availability of dental care for children;

1 (xvi) Health professional shortages;

3 (xvii) Numbers of pregnant women receiving  
4 prenatal care during first trimester;

6 (xviii) Teen birth rate;

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8 (xix) Numbers of children screened for  
9 disabilities;

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11 (xx) Rate of low birth weight childbirths;

13 (xxi) Rate of maternal smoking during pregnancy;

14

15 (xxii) Immunization rates;

17 (xxiii) Rates of high school completion;

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19 (xxiv) Student progress by fourth grade;

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21 (xxv) Completion of post-secondary education for  
22 Wyoming graduates;

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1           (xxvi) Numbers of teenagers neither in school or  
2 working;

4           (xxvii) GED achievement rates.

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6           (b) The partnership created under this act shall  
7 collaborate with community partnerships for children,  
8 families and individuals in each of the geographical  
9 regions of the state. Community partnerships may consist of  
10 citizens, consumers of health, human services and education  
11 programs, family members, governmental agencies and  
12 nongovernmental organizations providing health, education  
13 and human services, economic development representatives  
14 and business leaders, members of faith and non-profit  
15 organizations and any other individuals and groups who can  
16 contribute to the activities of the community partnership.  
17 Community partnerships may develop and implement local  
18 strategies for improving the social well-being of children  
19 and families, and shall advise the governor, human services  
20 agencies, the judiciary, and the department of education  
21 concerning effective implementation of state and local  
22 health, human services, and education programs.

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1           (c) Annually, on or before December 1, the governor  
2 shall report to the legislature, concerning:

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4           (i) The activities of the state, community and  
5 partnerships for children, families and individuals  
6 established under this act;

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8           (ii) The well-being of children and families as  
9 measured by the indicators set forth in subsection (b) of  
10 this act to include an analysis of the trends demonstrated  
11 by these measurements;

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13           (iii) Any other findings or recommendations  
14 relating to improving the effectiveness of state and local  
15 health, human services, and education programs.

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17           **Section 2.** This act is effective July 1, 2006.
