6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-3-309 is created to read:

- 10 23-3-309 Intentional feeding of big and trophy game
- 11 animals; penalty.

- 13 (a) No person shall intentionally attract or feed any
- 14 big game or trophy game animal by depositing, placing,
- 15 distributing or scattering any attractant or food source.

1 (b) No person, after having received a written 2 warning from the department or any peace officer as defined 3 in W.S. 7-2-101(a)(iv), shall fail to properly store any 4 attractant or food source or otherwise allow big or trophy 5 game animals to have access to an attractant or food 6 source. 7 (c) Nothing in this section shall prohibit: 8 9 10 (i) Any normal or accepted agricultural management practice; 11 12 13 (ii) Any big game animal or trophy game animal 14 feeding program authorized or conducted by the department; 15 16 (iii) Any legal form of taking big game or 17 trophy game animals as provided in W.S. 23-1-705(j) or 18 baiting trophy game animals as authorized by commission 19 rule and regulation. 20 21 (d) As used in this section: 22 23 (i) "Attractant or food source" means salt, hay,

grain, fruit, nut, chemical, mineral, garbage or other

substance or material used as an attraction, food source or 1

2 enticement for big game or trophy game animals, regardless

3 of the kind and quantity;

5 (ii) "Properly store" means to store in such a

manner that a reasonable and prudent person would believe 6

the attractant or food source had been secured in a manner 7

to prohibit access by big or trophy game animals. 8

(e) A violation of this section constitutes a $5^{\rm th}$ 10

11 degree misdemeanor.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2006. 13
