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(e) Not later than September 1, 2007, the general services division 13 14 of the department of administration and information shall submit to the 15 state building commission a recommendation for funding for the biennium 16 beginning July 1, 2008, for major building and facility repair and 17 replacement for state institutions, for University of Wyoming facilities and 18 for community college facilities. This recommendation shall be based on a formula adopted by the state building commission, which shall be based on 19 20 the following:
