## A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to agriculture; creating a seed laboratory advisory group; designating duties of the seed laboratory 2 3 advisory group; providing definitions; modifying exceptions licensing requirements; requiring a license for 4 5 conditioning grain or seed; providing for exemption from licensure; allowing the department to establish weed lists; 6 7 transferring rulemaking authority from the board agriculture to the department of agriculture; establishing 8 9 a procedure to set seed laboratory fees; increasing a penalty amount; repealing definitions; repealing certain 10 11 noxious weeds and quarantine provisions; and providing for an effective date. 12

14 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

**Section 1.** W.S. 11-12-123 and 11-12-124 are created 1 2 to read: 3 4 11-12-123. Seed laboratory advisory group created; 5 composition; appointment; officers; vacancy; meetings; 6 quorum. 7 (a) There is created a seed laboratory advisory group 8 9 which shall be comprised of the following: 10 (i) Voting members shall be: 11 12 13 (A) One (1) member of the board, appointed by the chairman of the board; 14 15 16 (B) One (1) member representing 17 organizations whose primary goal is improved crop 18 production, appointed by the board; 19 20 (C) Two (2) members representing the 21 Wyoming seed industry, appointed by the board; 22 (D) One (1) member who is a certified or 23 24 contract seed grower from Albany, Campbell, Carbon,

1	Converse,	Crook,	Goshen,	Johnson,	Laramie,	Natrona,

- 2 Niobrara, Platte, Sheridan or Weston County, appointed by
- 3 the board;

- 5 (E) One (1) member who is a certified or
- contract seed grower from Big Horn, Fremont, Hot Springs, 6
- 7 Lincoln, Park, Sublette, Sweetwater, Teton, Uinta or
- Washakie County, appointed by the board; 8

9

- 10 (F) One (1) member who is a person
- interested in seed quality, appointed by the board. 11

12

13 (ii) Non-voting members shall be:

14

- 15 (A) The director of the Wyoming department
- 16 of agriculture or his designee;

17

- 18 The University of Wyoming experiment (B)
- 19 station director;

20

- 21 (C) The head of the University of Wyoming
- 22 college of agriculture plant science department or his
- designee; 23

(D) The Wyoming seed certification service 1

2 manager, who shall serve as the seed laboratory advisory

3 group secretary;

4

5 (E) The state seed analyst.

6

(b) All voting members shall serve terms of three (3) 7

years. A member may serve for more than one (1) term. 8

9

(c) The chairman and the vice-chairman shall be 10

11 elected by a majority of the voting members at the annual

12 meeting.

13

(d) In the event of a vacancy on the advisory 14

committee, the board shall appoint a new member to complete 15

16 the term of the vacating member.

17

(e) One (1) regular meeting shall be held annually in 18

conjunction with a Wyoming crop improvement industry 19

20 meeting, as called by the chairman or as called by a

21 majority of the voting members.

22

(f) A majority of the voting members shall constitute 23

24 a quorum.

2	11-12-124. Seed laboratory advisory group duties.
3	
4	(a) The seed laboratory advisory group shall:
5	
6	(i) Maintain a policy of operation manual, which
7	shall be reviewed by seed laboratory advisory group members
8	at the annual meeting, and shall contain the policies and
9	operational procedures of the seed laboratory advisory
10	group;
11	
12	(ii) Serve in an advisory role to aid the state
13	seed analyst, the University of Wyoming, the Wyoming
14	department of agriculture and the board in the management
15	of the seed laboratory;
16	
17	(iii) Annually review the price list for seed
18	testing and services provided by the laboratory;
19	
20	(iv) Recommend to the board as necessary, any
21	changes to the price list or other fees of the laboratory;
22	
23	(v) Review the annual seed laboratory report;

1 (vi) Recommend to the board as necessary, any major capital purchases needed by the laboratory; 2 3 4 (vii) Recommend to the board as necessary, the 5 use of new technologies or other seed testing needs as they occur; 6 7 8 (viii) Provide support as necessary to seed 9 laboratory customers; 10 11 (ix) Provide to the board as necessary, 12 constructive ideas on how the laboratory can serve Wyoming 13 and the region more effectively. 14 15 Section 2. W.S. 11-12-101 creating new subsection (b), 11-12-102(a)(i) and (ii), 11-12-103, 11-12-104(a) and 16 17 (d) (intro) and (iii) through (v), 11-12-105(a)(i), (ii), (iii) and (vii) and (c), 11-12-107, 11-12-110, 11-12-112 18 through 11-12-114, 11-12-115(a), 11-12-116(a) and by 19 creating new subsections (d) through (g) and 11-12-122(a) 20 21 and (d) are amended to read:

11-12-101. Definitions. 23

1	(b) As used in this act:
2	
3	(i) "Controlling the pollination" means to use a
4	method of hybridization which will produce pure seed which
5	is at least seventy-five percent (75%) hybrid seed;
6	
7	(ii) "Dormant" means viable seed, excluding hard
8	seed, which fails to germinate when provided the specific
9	germination conditions for the kind of seed in question;
10	
11	(iii) "Germination" means the emergence and
12	development from the seed embryo of those essential
13	structures which, for the kind of seed in question, are
14	indicative of the ability to produce a normal plant under
15	favorable conditions. For the purposes of this act,
16	"germination" may also mean the percentage of seed
17	determined viable by a tetrazolium test;
18	
19	(iv) "Hard seed" means seed which remains hard
20	at the end of the prescribed test period because it has not
21	absorbed water due to an impermeable seed coat;
22	

1	(v) "Hybrid" as applied to kinds or varieties of
2	seed, means the first generation seed of a cross produced
3	by controlling the pollination and by combining:
4	
5	(A) Two (2) or more inbred lines;
6	
7	(B) One (1) inbred or a single cross with
8	an open pollinated variety; or
9	
10	(C) Two (2) selected clones, seed lines,
11	varieties or species.
12	
13	(vi) "Inert matter" means all matter that is not
14	a seed, including broken seeds, sterile florets, chaff,
15	fungus bodies and stones;
16	
17	(vii) "Kind" means one (1) or more related
18	species or subspecies which singly or collectively is known
19	by one (1) common name, including soybean, flax, barley and
20	wheat;
21	
22	(viii) "Labeling" means the display or displays
23	of written, printed or graphic matter upon or attached to
24	the container of seed or accompanying and pertaining to any

1	seed whether sold in bulk or in containers, including
2	invoices;
3	
4	(ix) "Lot" means the number or other
5	identification that relates to records pertaining to the
6	known quantity of seed;
7	
8	(x) "Origin" means the state, District of
9	Columbia, Puerto Rico or possession of the United States,
10	or the foreign country or designated portion thereof, where
11	the seed was grown;
12	
13	(xi) "Pure seed" means seed exclusive of inert
14	matter and all other seed not of the seed being offered for
15	<pre>sale;</pre>
16	
17	(xii) "Seed" means the propagative part of a
18	plant normally capable of germination to produce a new
19	plant, including ovules, tubers and bulbs. "Seed" also
20	includes the following as defined for the purposes of this
21	act:
22	

1	(A) "Agricultural seeds" means any
2	agronomic crop seeds or seeds of species as defined in W.S.
3	<u>11-1-101;</u>
4	
5	(B) "Flower seed" means seeds of herbaceous
6	plants grown for their blooms, ornamental foliage or other
7	ornamental parts and commonly known and sold under the name
8	of flower seeds in this state;
9	
10	(C) "Tree seed" means seeds of woody plants
11	commonly known and sold as tree and shrub seeds in this
12	state; or
13	
14	(D) "Vegetable seed" means the seeds of
15	those crops that are or may be grown in gardens or truck
16	farms and are generally known and sold under the name of
17	vegetable seeds in this state.
18	
19	(xiii) "Treated seed" means any seed that has
20	been treated with chemicals that are harmful to humans,
21	livestock or other vertebrate animals;
22	
23	(xiv) "Total viable" means:
24	

1	(A) Germination plus dormant seed plus hard
2	seed; or
3	
4	(B) Viable as determined by a tetrazolium
5	test.
6	
7	(xv) "Variety" means a subdivision of a kind
8	which is characterized by growth, plant, fruit, seed or
9	other characters by which it can be differentiated from
10	other sorts of the same kind, including C2243 wheat and
11	Manchu soybeans;
12	
13	(xvi) "Weeds" includes the following as defined
14	for purposes of this act:
15	
16	(A) "Prohibited noxious weeds" means the
17	seeds of any species for which the department by rule has
18	<pre>established zero (0) tolerance;</pre>
19	
20	(B) "Restricted noxious weeds" means any
21	species for which the department by rule has established an
22	allowable tolerance;

(C) "Regulated weeds" means seed, other

    of any species for which the department by rule has

    established a limitation of amount per pound in a seed lot.

2 (a) No Any person shall sell or offer who sells or 3 offers for sale or distribution in Wyoming 4 agricultural, vegetable, flower or tree seeds without 5 obtaining shall obtain a license from the state department. of agriculture. The license shall expire annually on March 6 7 31. Application for the license shall include the name and address of the person to whom the license is to be issued 8 9 and the location of the place or places of business of the 10 applicant. The application shall be accompanied by the 11 license fee authorized by W.S. 11-1-104 for each place of 12 business selling seeds in packets, packages or bulk of ten 13 (10) pounds or more. This section shall not 14 apply to any person licensed in accordance with W.S. 11-11-103. 15

(b) Any person who conditions grain or seed for hire in Wyoming shall obtain a license from the department. The license shall expire annually on March 31. Application for the license shall include the name and address of the person to whom the license is to be issued and the location of the place or places of business of the applicant. The application shall be accompanied by the license fee which shall be the same as the fee established for a seed dealer

1 license. This subsection shall not apply to any person

2 licensed in accordance with W.S. 11-11-103.

3

- 4 (c) An exemption from licensing requirements may be
- 5 granted upon petition to the department. The department
- shall consider any petition and shall grant or deny the 6
- 7 petition within thirty (30) days of receiving the petition.
- [Note: Without setting some standards at least for denying 8
- 9 or granting an exemption raises issues of unlawful
- delegation of legislative authority.] 10

11

- 12 11-12-104. Restrictions on the sale of weed seeds;
- 13 allowed tolerance for other noxious weeds; rulemaking.

- (a) No person shall sell or offer for sale or 15
- distribution in Wyoming any agricultural, vegetable, flower 16
- 17 or tree seeds seed which contains any prohibited
- noxious weed seeds. <del>listed in subsection (b) of this</del> 18
- section or any restricted noxious weed seeds which exceed 19
- 20 the tolerance established under subsection (c) of this
- 21 section. The department, by rule and regulation, may
- 22 establish a list of prohibited noxious weeds, restricted
- 23 noxious weeds and regulated weeds and establish tolerances
- for restricted noxious weeds and regulated weeds. 24

2	(d) Any agricultural, vegetable, flower or tree seeds
3	seed which contain contains any prohibited noxious weed
4	seeds or exceeds the tolerance established on restricted
5	noxious weed seeds or regulated weed seeds shall be removed
6	from sale in Wyoming and impounded by the director of the
7	department of agriculture—and shall be released only for
8	the following purposes:
9	
10	(iii) To be <del>recleaned <u>conditioned</u> to the point</del>
11	that no prohibited noxious weed seeds weeds are present or
12	and to the point that the tolerance established on
13	restricted noxious weed seeds weeds and regulated weeds is
14	not exceeded;
15	
16	(iv) For processing in such a way as to make the
17	weed seeds harmless and <del>to be</del> sold as feed; or
18	
19	(v) For burial in an approved landfill. dump.
20	
21	11-12-105. Labeling of packages required; contents;
22	exception.

(a) Each package or lot of seed, whether in package 1 or bulk, which is sold or offered for sale in Wyoming, 2 3 shall be legibly labeled in English upon the exterior of 4 the container with a written or printed label. The label 5 shall show: 6 7 (i) The commonly accepted name of the kind and variety of seed., and If seeds are mixed, the kind and 8 9 variety of each seed-making up five percent (5%) or more of 10 the mixture shall be stated separately; 11 12 (ii) The full name and address of the person 13 selling, offering or transporting distributing the seeds 14 for sale; 15 (iii) The percentage of pure seed, crop seed 16 17 (not to be added to pure seed), inert matter, common weed seeds by weight, germination, hard seed and the month and 18 year of the germination test; which shall have been made 19 20 within twelve (12) months prior to the sale of the seed; 21 22 (vii) The words "poisonous treated" shall appear

in bold print if the seeds have been treated with chemicals

- 1 which are toxic or poisonous to either humans, or livestock
- 2 or other vertebrate animals.

- 4 (c) This section does not apply to flower, tree,
- 5 garden or vegetable seeds labeled to comply with labeling
- the requirements of the United States department of 6
- 7 agriculture by authority of the Federal Seed Act.

11-12-107. Common weed seeds. 9

10

- 11 No person shall sell in the retail trade in this state, any
- 12 agricultural, vegetable, flower or tree seeds either in
- 13 package or in bulk, seed which contains two percent
- 14 (2%) or more of common weed seeds by weight.

15

16 11-12-110. Importation of seeds.

17

- It is unlawful for any person to transport or cause to be 18
- transported into Wyoming any agricultural, vegetable, 19
- 20 flower or tree seeds seed without meeting the requirements
- 21 of this act.

- 11-12-112. Director to enforce provisions; power of 23
- director to examine seeds; exception; purchase of samples. 24

2 The director of the department of agriculture shall enforce

this act. The director or his agents shall have free 3

4 access at all reasonable hours upon and into any premises

5 or structures where seed is stored or offered for sale,

except federally sealed granaries or warehouses, to examine 6

7 any seeds and, upon tendering payment therefor at the

current value, may take from any person a sample or samples 8

9 of the seeds.

13 The board department shall promulgate, adopt and publish

rules and regulations in accordance with the 14

Administrative Procedure Act for the purpose of carrying 15

16 out this act.

17

18 11-12-114. Seed and grain cleaning establishments;

19 certificates of approval; lists thereof.

20

21 The **board**—department shall establish standards and other

22 requirements whereby seed and grain cleaning establishments

may be issued an approved certificate of approval. A list 23

24 of approved establishments for cleaning seeds and grain

shall be published maintained by the director. of the 1 2 department of agriculture. 3

## 4 11-12-115. State seed analyst; seed laboratory.

5

(a) The board of agriculture department shall operate 6 7 a state seed laboratory through a memorandum of understanding with the University of Wyoming. The terms 8 9 and conditions of the memorandum of understanding shall include the designation and compensation of a state seed 10

11 12 analyst.

11-12-116. Analysis of seeds.

(a) Any person may have his seed analyzed by the state seed analyst by paying transportation charges to the laboratory and a fee. established by the board.

18

19 (d) The state seed analyst may provide a list of 20 recommended fees for seed testing and services to the seed 21 laboratory advisory group.

(e) The seed laboratory advisory group shall review 1 2 the state seed analyst's list and provide their 3 recommendation for testing and service fees to the board. 4 5 (f) Fees for testing and services shall become

effective upon approval by the board. 6

7

(g) The state seed analyst, upon approval by the 8 board, may enter into a separately negotiated contract with 9 a government entity to provide testing and services at 10 11 approximate cost.

12

13 11-12-122. Quarantine.

14

15 The board department, in compliance with this (a) 16 act, may promulgate rules and regulations to establish a 17 quarantine against the entry into Wyoming and intrastate 18 movement of seed containing prohibited noxious weed seed 19 and restricted noxious weed seed which exceeds the 20 tolerance established—and may enter into an agreement with 21 law enforcement agencies to carry out the quarantine 22 provisions.

- 1 (d) Interstate All seed shipments through the state
- 2 shall be covered in a prescribed manner so as not to allow
- 3 the dissemination of noxious weed seed.

- 5 **Section 3.** W.S. 11-12-123 by amending and renumbering

- 8 11-12-12311-12-125. Penalties; director authorized to
- 9 investigate and file complaint.

10

- 11 Any person violating any provision of this act is guilty of
- 12 a misdemeanor and shall be fined not more than two hundred
- 13  $\frac{\text{dollars}}{\text{dollars}}$  (\$200.00) one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or
- 14 imprisoned for not more than six (6) months, or both for
- each offense. The director of the department of agriculture 15
- 16 is authorized to investigate alleged violations and to file
- 17 a complaint with the proper district or county and
- prosecuting attorney for the prosecution of violations. 18

23 Section 5. This act is effective July 1, 2005.
