A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to nursery stock; providing for cease and

2 desist orders relating to nursery stock violations;

3 providing procedures; modifying definitions; adding

4 definitions; eliminating transportation of nursery stock

5 from licensing requirements; providing for exemptions;

6 requiring inspections; limiting nursery stock sales;

7 increasing penalties; repealing certain nonresident

8 requirements; and providing for an effective date.

10 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11

12 **Section 1.** W.S. 11-9-108 is created to read:

- 11-9-108. Cease and desist orders; 1 quarantine;
- 2 confiscation; destruction or removal of nursery stock;
- 3 hearing; final orders; enforcement.

- 5 (a) The department is authorized to issue cease and
- desist orders to any nursery stock dealer, quarantine any 6
- place of nursery stock business or order confiscation, 7
- destruction or removal from the state, of any nursery stock 8
- 9 the department determines poses a serious risk of
- 10 introducing injurious insects, plant diseases, other pests
- or noxious weeds into the state. 11

- 13 (b) All notices and orders required to be served by
- the department under this article shall be served by 14
- certified mail, return receipt requested, to the last known 15
- address of the nursery stock dealer or may be served as 16
- 17 provided by the Wyoming rules of civil procedure.
- notice of an order issued by the department under this 18
- article shall include: 19

- 21 (i) A statement of the grounds for issuing the
- 22 order, including a citation of the statute or rule
- involved; 23

(ii) A statement of the supporting facts; 1

3 (iii) A statement informing the nursery stock 4 dealer subject to the order of the right to a hearing on 5 the order before the director, right of appeal of any subsequent order in accordance with the 6 7 Administrative Procedure Act and that failure to timely request a hearing shall result in the order becoming final; 8

11 (iv) A copy of the order.

12

13 (c) A request for a hearing on a proposed order issued by the department under this article shall be in 14 writing and shall be submitted to the director no later 15 than seven (7) days after receipt of the notice from the 16 17 department. The director shall hold the hearing not later than fifteen (15) days after receipt of the request for 18 hearing, unless the nursery stock dealer subject to the 19 proposed order requests an extension of time for good cause 20 21 shown.

22

(d) A hearing on a proposed order issued under this 23 article shall be a contested case hearing conducted in 24

1 accordance with the Wyoming Administrative Procedure Act.

After the hearing, the director shall issue finings of fact 2

3 and conclusions of law and a final decision either

4 confirming or dismissing the proposed order. The director

5 shall confirm a proposed order only if the director finds

by a preponderance of the evidence that grounds exist under 6

this article for issuing the proposed order. Otherwise, 7

the director shall dismiss the proposed order. 8

9 director confirms a proposed order it shall become a final

10 order.

12 The department shall serve a final order upon the

nursery stock dealer who is the subject of the order.

final order shall take effect upon service and shall remain 14

in effect until the department or a court of competent 15

16 jurisdiction terminates the final order. The nursery stock

17 dealer who is the subject of the final order may appeal the

issuance of the final order in accordance with Wyoming 18

Administrative Procedure Act. 19

21 (f) On or after the effective date of a final order

22 under this article, the attorney general, upon request from

the department, may apply to the district court of the 23

24 county in which the nursery is located or the county where

the violations of this article occurred, for enforcement of 1

2 the final order.

- 12 (a) As used in W.S. 11-9-101 through

- 15 (i) "Nursery" means any ground, place or
- 16 establishment where nursery stock is grown, offered for
- 17 sale, sold, or distributed or is offered as part of a
- 18 landscape service;

20 (ii) "Nursery stock" means:

- 22 (B) All berry plants, rooted cuttings and
- plants with roots attached grown from bulbs, corms, tubers, 23
- 24 rhizomes or other vegetative parts, whether produced

out-of-doors or under glass and whether grown in open 1 2 ground or in benches, boxes, pots or other containers; and 3 4 (C) All bulbs, corms, pips, rhizomes, 5 tubers, roots, cuttings, scions, grafts or other vegetative 6 parts of plants; and -7 (D) All ground cover, including sod, plugs 8 9 and vegetative mulches and compost. 10 11 (iii) "Nursery stock" shall not include noxious, 12 regulated or designated weeds; 13 (iii) (iv) "Nursery stock dealers" means any 14 person who obtains nursery stock to be offered for sale or 15 16 distribution; 17 18 (iv) (v) "Nursery stock salesman" means person selling, distributing or soliciting orders 19 20 delivery of nursery stock directly to the ultimate consumer 21 from a supply on hand at a location other than a nursery 22 stock dealer's place of business;

11-9-102. License requirements and fees for dealers 1 2 and salesmen; disposition of fees.

3

4 (a) No person shall engage in the business of 5 selling, offering for sale, or distributing or transporting nursery stock within Wyoming without first obtaining a 6 7 license from the state department of agriculture. The fee for a license shall be the fee authorized by W.S. 11-1-104. 8

9

10 (b) Upon application for a resident nursery stock 11 dealer license and payment of the required fee, the 12 director, or an authorized inspector shall inspect the 13 premises and stock of the applicant and shall issue the 14 license if the inspection shows the premises and stock to be apparently free from injurious insects, plant diseases, 15 16 other pests or primary noxious or designated weeds.

17

(c) No person shall act as a nursery stock salesman 18 19 without first securing a license from the state department 20 of agriculture. The fee for a license shall be granted if 21 the applicant shows evidence of knowledge of the nursery 22 stock industry and pays the fee authorized by W.S. 11-1-104. 23

- (e) Licenses granted to nursery stock dealers or 1
- 2 salesmen within or outside of Wyoming expire on March 31
- 3 next following date of issue of each year. All license fees
- 4 collected shall be deposited in the general fund.

- 6 (f) Any person may petition the department for
- 7 exemption from the licensing requirement. The petition for
- exemption shall be applied for annually. 8

- 10 11-9-103. Right of entry of authorized persons for
- inspection. 11

- 13 The director, or his authorized agents, during reasonable
- business hours, may enter upon or into any premises, lands, 14
- establishments or places in this state where they suspect 15
- that injurious insects, plant diseases or noxious or 16
- 17 designated weeds occur for the purpose of inspecting,
- controlling or exterminating insects or diseases or 18
- otherwise carrying out the provisions of W.S. 11-9-101 19
- 20 through $\frac{11-9-108}{11-9-109}$.

- 11-9-104. Shipping inspection certificate; health 22
- certificate; public carriers not to accept stock without 23
- 24 affidavit.

2 (b) Public carriers shall not accept for shipment 3 nursery stock that does not bear a proper affidavit showing 4 apparent freedom from injurious insect, pests, plant 5 diseases, other pests and noxious, regulated or designated 6 weeds.

7

(c) Any person shipping, selling or distributing 8 9 nursery stock from out of state shall furnish with each shipment of nursery stock a plant inspection or health 10 certificate stating that the nursery stock to be sold, 11 offered for sale or distributed into Wyoming has been 12 13 inspected and issued a plant inspection or health 14 certificate by the state of origin.

(d) Resident nursery stock dealers shall request an inspection of any nursery stock to be shipped out of Wyoming. An annual inspection shall be sufficient for the purposes of this subsection. The department shall issue a plant inspection or health certificate after inspection by the department of the premises and nursery stock.

23 11-9-105. Nursery stock for condition sale; 24 generally.

2 (a) All nursery stock sold or offered for sale shall

3 be in a sound, healthy condition and shall be stored and

4 displayed under conditions which will maintain its vigor.

5 Nursery stock which is dead or so seriously weakened that

it will not grow with normal vigor when given reasonable 6

7 care shall not be sold or offered for sale.

8

9 (b) Any nursery stock containing any injurious

insects, plant diseases, other pests or noxious, regulated 10

11 or designated weeds shall not be sold.

12

13 11-9-107. Rules and regulations by director of

agriculture; objections.

The director may issue and enforce rules, regulations and 16

definitions to implement the provisions of W.S. 11-9-101 17

18 through $\frac{11-9-108}{11-9-109}$, subject to the Wyoming

Administrative Procedure Act. Licensed nursery stock 19

20 dealers or salesmen shall be given an opportunity to file

21 verified objections, if any, before final adoption of the

22 rules.
