Section 1. W.S. 18-5-303(b) and by creating a new
subsection (c) and 18-5-306(a) by creating a new paragraph

1 (b) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this 2 section, this article shall not apply to the sale or other 3 disposition of land where the parcels involved are thirty-4 five (35) acres or larger, subject to the requirement that 5 ingress and egress and utility easements shall be provided to each parcel by binding and recordable easements of not 6 7 less than forty (40) feet in width to a public road unless specifically waived by the grantee or transferee in a 8 9 binding and recordable document.

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11 (c) If a county, by resolution, elects to regulate 12 the sale or other disposition of land where the parcels 13 involved are thirty-five (35) acres or larger and smaller 14 than one hundred (100) acres, the provisions of this article shall apply to those sales or dispositions of land. 15
