- 7 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-16-1307 by creating a new
- 8 subsection (c) is amended to read:

10 21-16-1307. Success curriculum; test standards.

- 12 (c) From the information provided pursuant to W.S.
- 13 21-16-1308(b)(i), each school district shall provide every
- 14 student registering for ninth grade a summary of available
- 15 Hathaway scholarships, curriculum requirements to earn a
- 16 scholarship and earning differences anticipated at various
- 17 post-secondary education levels. Students enrolling for

1	grade nine (9) in the 2007-2008 school year and thereafter
2	shall be registered for the success curricula required
3	under this section for Hathaway scholarship recipients in
4	each year of grades nine (9) through twelve (12) unless the
5	student and the student's parent or guardian execute a
6	written waiver in accordance with this subsection.
7	Together with the other information required under this
8	subsection each student enrolling in ninth grade shall be
9	provided a waiver form which explains that by signing the
LO	waiver the student and parent understand the student is
L1	electing not to take a curriculum which is required for a
L2	Hathaway scholarship and that by doing so the student may
L3	be limiting opportunities for other scholarships available
L 4	to attend college. For any student initially enrolling in
L 5	a school district in grades ten (10) through twelve (12) ir
L 6	the 2007-2008 school year and thereafter, the district
L 7	shall provide the same information and waiver unless the
L8	student and his parent have previously executed a waiver in
L 9	another Wyoming school district or the student can no
20	longer meet the curriculum requirements of this section.

Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
