Definitions. 2 3 (a) As used in this article: 4 5 (xix) "Distance education" means a formal education process in which the major portion of instruction 6 7 occurs when the student and the instructor are not in the same place at the same time through any media including 8 9 printed materials, videotapes, audio recordings, 10 facsimiles, telephone communications, internet 11 communications through email and web-based delivery 12 systems. Any out-of-state provider providing distance 13 education in Wyoming shall be licensed to operate in this 14 state under W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-2-407. 15 16 21-13-309.
