Prevailing wage amendments.

A BILL

for

1 AN ACT relating to the prevailing wage for public works contracts; providing for a single statewide wage district 2 3 for state-funded contracts; authorizing the department of employment to investigate prevailing wage violations on its 4 5 own volition; removing a requirement that prevailing wage 6 determinations utilize employment security law wage 7 reports; providing a bid preference for contractors participating in the department's prevailing wage survey; 8 9 authorizing the department to apply for a waiver of federal wage surveys, as specified; and providing for an effective 10 11 date.

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13 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming: 14

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Section 1. W.S. 27-4-402(a)(ix), 27-4-404, 27-14-1 2 405(a) and 27-4-406(a) are amended to read: 3 27-4-402. Definitions. 4 5 6 (a) As used in this act: 7 8 (ix) "Locality" for public heavy, highway 9 projects and public building projects means the following districts wherein the physical work is performed: 10 11 12 (A) For federal highway and construction 13 projects: 14 15 (I) The entire state of Wyoming 16 excluding Laramie and Natrona counties; 17 18 (B) (II) Laramie county; 19 20 (C) (III) Natrona county. 21 22 (B) For state only heavy and highway 23 projects, the entire state of Wyoming; 24

1 (C) For public building projects, the 2 entire state of Wyoming. 3 4 27-4-404. Director to investigate complaints; rules 5 and regulations. 6 7 Upon complaint of violation of this act or upon his own volition, the director shall investigate, and shall 8 9 institute actions for penalties herein prescribed when 10 proven violations are considered by him to be intentional 11 and willful in nature. The director may establish rules and 12 regulations for the purpose of carrying out the purposes of 13 this act. 14 15 27-4-405. Duty of public authority to ascertain wage rate for public works; requirement as to call for bids. 16 17 Before any public body awards a contract for 18 (a) public works, it shall obtain from the department the 19 20 prevailing hourly rate of wages in the locality in which 21 the work is to be performed, for each craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract or project. The 22 public body shall specify in the resolution or ordinance 23 24 and in the call for bids for the contract, what the

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1 prevailing hourly rate of wages in the locality is for each 2 craft or type of workman needed to execute the contract, 3 and it shall be mandatory upon the contractor to whom the 4 contract is awarded and upon any subcontractor under him, 5 to pay not less than the specified rates to all workmen employed by them in the execution of the contract. The 6 public body awarding the contract shall cause to be 7 inserted in the contract a stipulation to the effect that 8 9 not less than the prevailing hourly rate of wages as 10 determined by the department pursuant to W.S. 27-4-406, or 11 determined by the court on review, shall be paid to all 12 workmen performing work under the contract. It shall also 13 require in all the contractor's bonds that the contractor 14 include such provision as will guarantee the faithful performance of the prevailing hourly wage clause 15 as provided by the contract. The finding of the department 16 17 specifying the prevailing hourly rate of waqes in accordance with this subsection, shall be final for all 18 purposes of the contract then being considered, unless 19 20 reviewed under the provisions of this act. A public body 21 doing public works directly shall comply with the 22 prevailing hourly rate of wages portion of this subsection 23 for each craft or type of workman so employed. In 24 reviewing bids for public works contracts, the public body

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1	shall award a bid preference of two percent (2%) to any
2	prospective contractor who participated, as certified by
3	the department, in the department's wage survey for the
4	period applicable to the contract being awarded.
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6	27-4-406. Wage rate to be filed with director and
7	mailed to employers and certain employees.
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9	(a) The department shall annually determine the
10	prevailing hourly rate of wages within the state for all
11	occupations, crafts or type of workers expected to be
12	required for public works in the state. In carrying out
13	this subsection, the department may apply to the United
14	States Department of Labor for a waiver of one (1) annual
15	highway construction wage survey and shall:
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17	(i) Utilize the most recent payroll data as
18	submitted by employers or employee organizations for
19	purposes of reporting payroll and making contributions
20	under the Wyoming Employment Security Law;
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22	Section 2. W.S. 27-4-406(a)(i) is repealed.
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24	Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
