(a) There is created the Wyoming tourism board. The 1

2 board shall serve as the leading proponent of Wyoming's

3 tourism and hospitality industry and shall provide

4 governance and oversight for the division of travel and

5 tourism.

7 (b) The board shall be comprised of nine (9) members

who shall who shall be employed in or associated closely 8

9 with the travel industry. No more than five (5) members

shall be from the same political party. The board shall be 10

11 appointed by the governor, and approved with the advice and

consent of the senate, in accordance with W.S. 28-12-101 12

through 28-12-103, as follows: 13

15 (i) One (1) member shall be from tourism

16 appointment district 1, consisting of Albany, Carbon and

17 Laramie counties;

19 (ii) One (1) member shall be from tourism

20 appointment district 2, consisting of Converse, Goshen,

21 Natrona, Niobrara and Platte counties;

- 1 (iii) One (1) member shall be from tourism
- 2 appointment district 3, consisting of Campbell, Crook
- 3 Johnson, Sheridan and Weston counties;

- 5 (iv) One (1) member shall be from tourism
- 6 appointment district 4, consisting of Lincoln, Sublette,
- 7 Sweetwater and Uinta counties;

- 9 (v) One (1) member shall be from tourism
- 10 appointment district 5, consisting of Big Horn, Fremont,
- 11 Hot Springs, Park, Teton and Washakie counties;

- 13 (vi) Four (4) members shall be at-large members
- 14 appointed to provide geographic and tourism industry
- 15 balance.

- 17 (c) Each appointed member shall serve for three (3)
- 18 years, except that for the initial appointments three (3)
- 19 members shall be appointed for two (2) years and three (3)
- 20 members shall be appointed for one (1) year.

- 22 (d) The board shall select a chairman and a vice-
- 23 chairman from among its members.

(e) The governor may remove any member as provided by 1

2 W.S. 9-1-202.

4 (f) Members of the board shall receive mileage and

5 per diem for attending board meetings or other meetings as

assigned by the board, in the same amount as state 6

7 legislators and shall receive no other compensation for

serving on the board. 8

- Laws, Chapter 35, Section 85, footnote 1 are repealed. 16

- 18 Section 3. There is transferred from the Wyoming
- business council to the tourism board created by this act 19
- 20 all remaining funds appropriated by 2006 Wyoming Session
- 21 Laws, Chapter 35, Section 85 under the tourism program.
