2	Wyoming tourism board; granting rule making authority;

6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:
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8	Section 1. W.S. 9-12-901 and 9-12-902 are created to
9	read:

11	9-12-901. Wyoming tourism board; creation;
12	composition; appointment; terms; compensation.

14	(a) There is created the Wyoming tourism board. The

board shall serve as the leading proponent of Wyoming's

- tourism and hospitality industry and shall provide 1
- 2 governance and oversight for the division of travel and

3 tourism.

- 5 (b) The board shall be comprised of nine (9) members
- who shall who shall be employed in or associated closely 6
- with the travel industry. The board shall be appointed by 7
- the governor, and approved with the advice and consent of 8
- 9 the senate, in accordance with W.S. 28-12-101 through
- 28-12-103, as follows: 10

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- 12 (i) One (1) member shall be from tourism
- appointment district 1, consisting of Albany, Carbon and 13
- Laramie counties; 14

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- 16 (ii) One (1) member shall be from tourism
- appointment district 2, consisting of Converse, Goshen, 17
- Natrona, Niobrara and Platte counties; 18

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- (iii) One (1) member shall be from tourism 20
- 21 appointment district 3, consisting of Campbell, Crook
- 22 Johnson, Sheridan and Weston counties;

1 (iv) One (1) member shall be from tourism

2 appointment district 4, consisting of Lincoln, Sweetwater

3 and Uinta counties;

5 (v) One (1) member shall be from tourism

6 appointment district 5, consisting of Big Horn, Hot

7 Springs, Park and Washakie counties;

9 (vi) One (1) member shall be from tourism

10 appointment district 6, consisting of Fremont, Sublette and

11 Teton counties;

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13 (vii) Three (3) members shall be at-large

14 members appointed to provide geographic and tourism

15 industry balance.

17 (c) Each appointed member shall serve for three (3)

18 years, except that for the initial appointments three (3)

19 members shall be appointed for two (2) years and three (3)

20 members shall be appointed for one (1) year.

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22 (d) The board shall select a chairman and a vice-

23 chairman from among its members.

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(e) The governor may remove any member as provided by 1

2 W.S. 9-1-202.

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4 (f) Members of the board shall receive mileage and

5 per diem for attending board meetings or other meetings as

assigned by the board, in the same amount as state 6

7 legislators and shall receive no other compensation for

serving on the board. 8

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10 (g) For purposes of this article, "board" means the

Wyoming tourism board. 11

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13 9-12-902. General powers and duties of the board;

14 rulemaking authority.

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(a) The board shall be responsible for implementing 16

17 the tourism program and functions assigned to the Wyoming

business council under the Wyoming Economic Development 18

Act, including the expenditure of all funds appropriated 19

20 for the tourism program and shall:

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22 (i) Assemble and distribute information

concerning the scenic and recreational opportunities and 23

24 resources of Wyoming; (ii) Encourage close cooperation between public

and private agencies engaged in stimulating recognition of

Wyoming recreational resources;

(iii) Implement programs to promote tourism in

Wyoming.

(b) The board shall assign a member to attend all

regularly scheduled meetings of the Wyoming business

council.

(c) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations

necessary to implement this article.

Section 2. W.S. 9-12-107(a) and 2006 Wyoming Session

Laws, Chapter 35, Section 85, footnote 1 are repealed.

Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2007.
