4 The legislature finds that, through education (a) 5 programs provided by the Eastern Shoshone and the Northern Indian Tribes 6 Arapaho to school age Indian children residing on the Wind River Indian Reservation, the state 7 can address conditions of unemployment, poverty and lack of 8 9 adequate job skills which exist on the reservation. 10 Maintenance of these education programs unique to Indian 11 students is of mutual benefit to the tribes and the state, 12 reducing future financial needs of those students as tribal 13 members and as Wyoming residents for public education, job

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(b) Subject to amounts appropriated by the 17 legislature, the governor shall enter into contractual arrangements with the joint business council of the Eastern 18 Shoshone and Northern Arapaho Indian Tribes for the 20 provision of education programs and services addressing Indian students at risk of failure in school and other programs and services essential to the success and welfare 23 of these students as specified under subsection (a) of this 24 section. - 9 July 1, 2007, and ending June 30, 2008.
