For the period commencing July 1, 2006 and ending June 30, 2008, services authorized under the Wyoming 11 Medical Assistance and Services Act involving the delivery 12 13 of a child, including prenatal and postpartum care related 14 to the delivery, shall be reimbursed at ninety percent (90%) of the statewide average of the physician's specialty 15 for the services provided as of July 1, 2006, not to exceed 16 one hundred percent (100%) of the provider's usual and 17

1 customary billed charges. This reimbursement rate shall 2 apply if the service was rendered during the period 3 commencing July 1, 2006 and ending June 30, 2008. 4 5 Section 2. The department of health shall report to the joint appropriations interim committee on or before 6 October 31, 2007, the additional costs incurred by the 7 increased reimbursement rate under 8 this act and 9 recommendations for modifications to the reimbursement rate 10 for obstetric services under the Medical Assistance and 11 Services Act. 12 13 Section 3. 14 15 (a) For the purposes of this act, there is appropriated to the department of health for the period 16 commencing July 1, 2006 and ending June 30, 2008: 17 18 (i) Three million five hundred thousand dollars 19 20 (\$3,500,000.00) from the general fund; and 21 22 (ii) Three million eight hundred thousand dollars (\$3,800,000.00) in federal funds. 23 24
