A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Wyoming board of outfitters;
- 2 providing definitions; limiting terms of board members;
- 3 clarifying the board's authority to investigate and issue
- 4 citations; providing for forfeiture; prohibiting the lease
- 5 of lands for hunting to unlicensed outfitters; and
- 6 providing for an effective date.

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8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 23-2-406(a), 23-2-407(a),
- 11 23-2-408(b), 23-2-410(c) by creating a new paragraph
- 12 (vii), 23-2-417 by creating a new subsection (c) and
- 13 23-2-418 by creating a new subsection (b) and by
- 14 renumbering (b) as (c) are amended to read:

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16 **23-2-406.** Definitions.

1 2 (a) As used in this act: 3 4 (i) "Advertises" means attempting by any means, 5 including the Internet, the world wide web or a similar proprietary or common carrier electronic system, to induce 6 7 persons to enter into an agreement with an outfitter to receive guide or packing services; 8 9 10 (i) (ii) "Board" means the Wyoming state board of 11 outfitters and guides established under this act; 12 (ii) (iii) "Outfitter" means a person including a 13 hunting club, who advertises or holds himself out to the 14 public for hire or remuneration to provide guide or packing 15 16 services for the purpose of taking any big or trophy game 17 animal, excluding any person who furnishes pack or riding animals and other equipment only to a hunter for his 18 19 personal temporary use and any landowner providing 20 outfitter services on private lands owned or leased by him. 21 As used in this paragraph:

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23 (A) "Hunting club" means any person 24 requiring dues or remuneration for providing personal

1 services in the field for the taking of any big or trophy

2 game animal;

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(B) "Landowner" means any person, firm or corporation holding title to, or occupying under a contract of purchase, agricultural land or any person whose family owns at least a majority of the stock in a Wyoming corporation and who provides services specified in this paragraph on lands owned by the corporation and used

primarily for agricultural purposes.

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12 (iii) (iv) "Professional guide" means any person 13 employed by or operating under an independent contract with a licensed outfitter to furnish personal services for the 14 conduct of outdoor recreational activities for the purpose 15 16 of hunting animals except any person employed by a licensed 17 outfitter solely to care for, groom or saddle livestock, cook, cut wood or to transport people, equipment and 18 19 personal property;

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(iv) (v) "Guide or packing services" means,

transporting for hire or remuneration, hunters, game

animals or equipment accompanying and providing assistance

of any kind to a hunter in the field for the purpose of

1 related to taking of any big or trophy game animal, and may 2 include providing services, equipment, livestock or 3 facilities for the benefit of the hunter; 4 5 $\frac{(v)}{(vi)}$ "This act" means W.S. 23-2-406 through 23-2-418. 6 7 8 23-2-407. License required for outfitters and 9 professional guides. 10 11 (a) No person shall hold himself out as, engage in 12 the business of or act in the capacity of an outfitter or 13 shall engage in the occupation of a professional guide as 14 an independent contractor or as an agent or employee, provide guide or packing services unless he is licensed as 15 16 an outfitter or professional quide pursuant to this act. 17 18 23-2-408. Wyoming state board of outfitters professional guides; membership; meetings; per diem and 19 20 travel expenses. 21 22 (b) Appointed members shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the senate in 23 accordance with W.S. 28-12-101 through 28-12-103 and may be 24

removed by the governor as provided by W.S. 9-1-202. Not 1 2 more than four (4) members of the board shall be of the 3 same political party. Except as otherwise provided for 4 initial appointees, the term of an appointed member shall 5 be three (3) years. After July 1, 2006, no appointed member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms on 6 7 the board. 8 9 23-2-410. Powers and duties of board; generally; employees; licensing and regulation; issuance of citations. 10 11 12 The board shall license and regulate outfitters (C) 13 and professional guides in this state and shall: 14 (vii) Investigate unlicensed outfitters and 15 16 unlicensed guides for violations of this act. 17 18 23-2-417. Violations general; in penalties; 19 forfeiture. 20 21 (c) Devices and equipment, including, but not limited 22 to, any firearm, livestock, tack, weapon, ammunition, trap, 23 snare, vessel, motorized vehicle, aircraft, explosive, 24 poisonous substance, electronic device or optical

1 equipment, used in, or in aid of, outfitting or guiding 2 without a license may be seized by any law enforcement 3 officer of the state after hearing and upon order issued by 4 the court of original jurisdiction when the value of the 5 devices or equipment is one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00) or 6 less or by the district court for the county in which the 7 offense was charged when the value of the devices or equipment is more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). 8 9 Any device or equipment seized under this section shall be forfeited to the state in accordance with W.S. 7-2-105, 10 11 provided the device or equipment is not subject to 12 forfeiture under this section by reason of the unlawful act 13 being committed without the knowledge or consent of the 14 owner. A device or equipment seized under this section shall not be forfeited as provided under this section until 15 16 after the person has been convicted and the time for appeal 17 has expired.

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23 (b) No person shall directly or indirectly lease his 24 property to a person holding himself out as engaging in the

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business of or acting in the capacity of an outfitter or a 1 2 guide unless that person provides proof that he is a 3 licensed outfitter or professional guide as required by 4 this act. 5 6 (b)(c) Any person violating this section is guilty of 7 a misdemeanor as prescribed under W.S. 23-2-417(a). 8 Section 2. Nothing in this act shall affect the 9 current term of office of any board member holding office 10

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Section 3. This act is effective July 1, 2006.
