A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to taxation and revenue; creating a sales
- 2 and use tax exemption for industrial facilities for the
- 3 state's share of the tax; providing for annual reports;
- 4 providing for a sunset; and providing for an effective
- 5 date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 39-15-105(a)(viii) by creating a new
- 10 subparagraph (S) and 39-16-105(a)(viii) by creating a new
- 11 subparagraph (H) are amended to read:

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13 **39-15-105.** Exemptions.

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- 15 (a) The following sales or leases are exempt from the
- 16 excise tax imposed by this article:

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(viii) For the purpose of exempting sales of services and tangible personal property as an economic incentive, the following are exempt:

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(S) The sale of equipment used to construct 6 7 upgrades or retrofits to existing industrial facilities to 8 protect the environment and to meet applicable environmental standards. The exemption provided by this 9 10 subparagraph shall be limited to the acquisition of 11 equipment used in an upgrade or retrofit project to make it 12 operational. The exemption shall not apply to tools and other equipment used in construction of an upgrade or 13 14 retrofit project, contracted services required for 15 construction, or routine maintenance activities. This exemption shall only apply to the state's share of the 16 17 statewide sales tax imposed under W.S. 39-15-104(a) and (b) as computed by multiplying the tax rates in W.S. 18 39-15-104(a) and (b) by the portion directed to the state 19 20 general fund under W.S. 39-15-111(b)(i) as modified by W.S. 21 39-15-111(g). This exemption shall not apply to any excise 22 taxes imposed under W.S. 39-15-204(a). This subparagraph 23 is repealed effective June 30, 2015.

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3 (a) The following purchases or leases are exempt from 4 the excise tax imposed by this article:

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6 (viii) For the purpose of exempting sales of
7 services and tangible personal property as an economic
8 incentive, the following are exempt:

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10 (H) The purchase of equipment used to 11 construct upgrades or retrofits to existing industrial 12 facilities to protect the environment and to meet 13 applicable environmental standards. The exemption provided 14 by this subparagraph shall be limited to the acquisition of 15 equipment used in an upgrade or retrofit project to make it operational. The exemption shall not apply to tools and 16 17 other equipment used in construction of an upgrade or 18 retrofit project, contracted services required for 19 construction, or routine maintenance activities. This 20 exemption shall only apply to the state's share of the 21 statewide use tax imposed under W.S. 39-16-104(a) and (b) as computed by multiplying the tax rates in W.S. 22 39-16-104(a) and (b) by the portion directed to the state 23 24 general fund under W.S. 39-16-111(b)(i) as modified by W.S.

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(iii) A history of taxes paid or owed to the 1 2 state of Wyoming by companies owning industrial facilities; 3 and 4 5 (iv) A review by the public service commission of the impact of the exemption on existing retail public 6 7 utility rates in the state and an estimate of possible impacts reasonably expected in the future. 8 9 10 (b) Public utilities serving in the state shall provide such information as the public service commission 11 12 may require to assist it in making the report provided for in subsection (a) of this section. 13 14 15 Section 3. This act is effective immediately upon 16 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law 17 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
