- 1 AN ACT relating to courts; amending procedures for courts 2 as specified; eliminating a duty of a circuit court to 3 prepare affidavits for specified actions; correcting
- 4 obsolete references; amending qualifications for court
- 5 reporters as specified; requiring continuing education for
- 6 court reporters; and providing for an effective date.

8 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 10 **Section 1.** W.S. 1-21-203 (a), 5-3-402, 5-6-106 and 5-
- 11 9-119(a) are amended to read:

- 13 1-21-203. Affidavit of claim; service of summons;
- 14 venue jurisdiction.

(a) The claimant shall prepare the affidavit as set forth., or at his request the circuit judge shall draft it for him. When the affidavit is executed by the claimant the court shall file the same and have summons served on the defendant at any location in the county in the manner provided by law or, if the defendant resides in the county, service may be made by the court by certified mail addressed to the defendant at his address within the county with return receipt requested. Upon receipt by the circuit judge of the return receipt signed by the defendant or his agent, service is complete.

5-3-402. Qualifications; examination; certification; continuing education; supervision and control by judge; removal for cause; appointment of successor.

Before any person can be appointed as official reporter of any district court in this state, he or she shall be a resident of said district the state, and shall be examined as to his or her competency by at least three (3) members of the bar, practicing in said court, and such committee shall be appointed by the judge thereof and such

1	test of competency shall be as follows: applicant shall
2	write in the presence of the committee at the rate of at
3	least one hundred and twenty (120) words per minute for
4	five (5) consecutive minutes from questions and answers not
5	previously written by him or her, and transcribe the same
6	with accuracy. If the applicant passes this test
7	satisfactorily, a majority of the committee shall furnish
8	him or her with a certificate of that fact, which shall be
9	filed with the records of the court; provided, however,
10	that said certified as provided in subsection (b) of this
11	section. The court reporter shall be subject to the
12	supervision and control of the judge of the judicial
13	district appointing him, and for omission or neglect of
14	duty, misconduct or failure to comply with the provisions
15	of this act, he or she may be removed by the judge of said
16	the judicial district, upon cause being shown therefor, by
17	an order of said the judge, who shall have power to appoint
18	his successor.

Т	(1) Passing a registered professional reporter
2	examination administered by the national court reporters
3	association;

5	(ii) Having graduated from an accredited court
6	reporting school and passing a five (5) minute, two (2)
7	voice dictation test at two hundred twenty-five (225) words
8	per minute with a ninety-fiver percent (95%) accuracy rate
9	with no more than sixty-five (65) errors. The test shall
10	be taken from a national court reporters association
11	examination tape and administered by a committee consisting
12	of no less than two (2) persons appointed by the district
13	court judge;
14	
15	(iii) Passing a certification test from any
16	other state that certifies court reporters, provided that
17	the requirements for certification in that state are equal
18	to or exceed the standards specified in paragraph (ii) of
19	this subsection; or,

21	(iv) Serving in the capacity as a full-time
22	official court reporter in a Wyoming district court for a
23	minimum of one (1) year immediately prior to July 1, 2008.

2 (c) All court reporters certified under this section shall be required to earn three (3) continuing education 3 units recognized by the national court reporters 4 5 association for each three (3) year period of 6 certification. A record of the continuing education units 7 earned shall be maintained by the Wyoming shorthand reporters association.

10 5-6-106. Procedure generally; additional rules may be 11 provided by ordinance; appeals.

13 The procedure of municipal courts shall conform to the 14 procedure provided by law and rules of procedure for courts of limited jurisdiction. The incorporated city or town may 15 by ordinance provide any additional rules of procedure 16 found necessary for the proper conduct of municipal courts, 17 18 provided these rules do not conflict with the general laws 19 of the state. Appeals to the district court shall be allowed in all cases as now provided by law for appeals 20 from justices of the peace circuit courts. 21
