Unless extended, an applicant has six (6) months from the date of employment to become certified. The board may for good cause grant an extension of this period. The board shall grant certification as a certified addictions practitioner assistant to any applicant who files an application upon a form and in the manner prescribed by the board, accompanied by the

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4 33-38-108. Reciprocity.

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(a) The board may issue a license or certification by 6 7 endorsement Any individual holding a license in good standing to engage in the practice of professional 8 9 counseling, clinical social work, social work, marriage and 10 family therapy and or addictions therapy and treatment to 11 any applicant who has a license or certificate in good standing with no formal complaints or sanctions as a 12 13 professional counselor, a marriage and family therapist, a 14 clinical social worker, under the laws of another state 15 having licensure requirements substantially similar to those required by this act may, upon approval of the board, 16 17 be issued a license to practice in this state.

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(b) Any individual holding a certification in good standing to engage in the practice of social worker, mental health worker, addictions practitioner work or an addictions therapist therapy under the laws of another jurisdiction if the applicant presents proof satisfactory to the board that, at the time of application for a Wyoming

license or state having certification by endorsement, the 1 applicant possesses credentials and qualifications 2 3 requirements substantially comparable similar to those 4 required by this act as determined by may, upon approval of 5 the board, be issued certification to practice in this state. 6 7 (c) The board shall promulgate rules and regulations 8 9 setting forth the manner in which credentials will shall be reviewed by the board. 10 11 12 **Section 2.** W.S. 33-38-106(b)(iv), (c)(iv) and (n)(iv) 13 is repealed. 14 15 Section 3.
