## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to the Hathaway scholarship program;
- 2 allowing reinstatement of lost scholarships upon
- 3 satisfaction of specified conditions; specifying
- 4 application; and providing for an effective date.

6 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

- 8 **Section 1.** W.S. 21-16-1304(c)(i), (ii) and by
- 9 creating a new subsection (f) and 21-16-1305(b)(i), (ii)
- 10 and by creating a new subsection (d) are amended to read:

- 12 21-16-1304. Hathaway opportunity, performance and
- 13 honor scholarships.

14

- 15 (c) To remain eligible for the scholarship under this
- 16 section, the student shall:

17

1 (i) Except as provided in W.S. 21-16-1303(f), 2 make satisfactory academic progress toward a degree. If a 3 student fails to make satisfactory academic progress or 4 maintain the cumulative grade point average required for 5 continuation in the program as provided in this subsection, the student shall become ineligible for the scholarship in 6 subsequent semesters unless granted an exception for cause 7 by the department or except as otherwise provided in this 8 9 subsection (f) of this section. The department may delegate 10 to any eligible institution the department's authority to 11 grant an exception for cause, but shall only do so in 12 accordance with department rules establishing procedures 13 and criteria for granting an exception and any eligible 14 institution acting pursuant to such delegation shall grant exceptions only in accordance with those rules; . The 15 16 scholarship under this article which is lost for failing to 17 maintain the requisite grade point average shall be reinstated for the subsequent semester following attainment 18 of the cumulative grade point average required of the 19 20 applicable scholarship under paragraph (iii) of this 21 subsection, provided that the student is otherwise eligible 22 and neither the applicable maximum number of full time 23 equivalent semesters nor the maximum scholarship 24 eligibility time period specified under subsection (b) of

this section and W.S. 21 16 1303(d), including semesters 1 2 for which a scholarship was not received, has been reached; 3 4 (ii) Except as provided in W.S. 21-16-1303(f) 5 and subsection (f) of this section, maintain continuous enrollment for not less than two (2) semesters in each 6 7 successive academic year. The department shall by rule and regulation establish exceptions to the requirement of this 8 9 paragraph for military service, religious service and other 10 good cause shown; and 11 12 (f) If a student is otherwise eligible under this 13 article and neither the applicable number of full-time 14 equivalent semesters nor the maximum scholarship eligibility time period specified under subsection (b) of 15 this section and W.S. 21-16-1303(d), including semesters 16 17 for which a scholarship was not received, has been reached, a scholarship under this section which is lost may be 18 19 reinstated if the student meets the applicable requirements 20 imposed by this subsection and successfully completes 21 courses at an eligible institution in a summer school 22 session or an academic term occurring during the period the 23 scholarship is lost. A lost scholarship shall be reinstated

1	in the first academic term following the academic term or
2	summer school session during which the student:
3	
4	(i) Attains satisfactory academic progress as
5	defined by W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(xiv) for a scholarship lost
6	under this subsection for failure to meet the requirements
7	of paragraph (c)(i) of this section; or
8	
9	(ii) Achieves the cumulative grade point average
10	required of the applicable scholarship under paragraph
11	(c)(iii) of this section for a scholarship lost for failure
12	to meet the requirements of paragraph (c)(iii) of this
13	section; or
14	
15	(iii) For a scholarship lost for failure to meet
16	the requirements of (c)(ii) of this section, enrolls and
17	completes one (1) academic term as a full-time or part-time
18	student, whichever is applicable, occurring during the
19	period in which the scholarship is lost.

23	(b) To remain eligible for the scholarship award
24	under this section, the student shall:

2	(i) Except as provided by W.S. $21-16-1303(f)$ ,
3	make satisfactory academic progress toward a certificate or
4	degree. If a student fails to make satisfactory academic
5	progress or maintain the cumulative grade point average
6	required for continuation in the program provided in
7	paragraph (iii) of this subsection, the student shall
8	become ineligible for the scholarship in subsequent
9	semesters unless granted an exception for cause by the
LO	department or except as otherwise provided in this
L1	subsection (d) of this section. The department may delegate
L2	to any eligible institution the department's authority to
L3	grant an exception for cause, but shall only do so in
L4	accordance with department rules establishing procedures
L5	and criteria for granting an exception and any eligible
L6	institution acting pursuant to such delegation shall grant
L7	exceptions only in accordance with those rules: The
L8	scholarship under this article which is lost for failing to
L9	maintain the requisite grade point average shall be
20	reinstated for the subsequent semester following attainment
21	of the cumulative grade point average required under
22	paragraph (iii) of this subsection provided that the
23	student is otherwise eligible and that neither the maximum
24	number of full time equivalent semesters nor the maximum

scholarship eligibility time period specified under 1 2 subsection (a) of this section and W.S. 21 16 1303(d), 3 including semesters for which a scholarship was not 4 received, has not been reached; 5 (ii) Except as provided by W.S. 21-16-1303(f) 6 7 and subsection (d) of this section, maintain continuous enrollment for not less than two (2) semesters in each 8 9 successive academic year. The department shall by rule and 10 regulation establish exceptions to the requirement of this 11 paragraph for military service, religious service and other 12 good cause shown; and 13 14 (d) If a student is otherwise eligible under this 15 article and neither the applicable number of full-time equivalent semesters nor the maximum scholarship 16 17 eligibility time period specified under paragraph (a)(ii) of this section and W.S. 21-16-1303(d), including semesters 18 19 for which a scholarship was not received, has been reached, 20 a scholarship under this section which is lost may be 21 reinstated if the student meets the applicable requirements 22 imposed by this subsection and successfully completes courses at an eligible institution in a summer school 23 24 session or an academic term occurring during the period the

1 scholarship is lost. A lost scholarship shall be reinstated 2 in the first academic term following the academic term or 3 summer school session during which the student: 4 5 (i) Attains satisfactory academic progress as 6 defined by W.S. 21-16-1301(a)(xiv) for a scholarship lost 7 for failure to meet the requirements of paragraph (b)(i) of 8 this section; or 9 10 (ii) Achieves the cumulative grade point average 11 required under paragraph (b)(iii) of this section for a 12 scholarship lost for failure to meet the requirements of 13 paragraph (b)(iii) of this section; or 14 15 (iii) For a scholarship lost for failure to meet 16 the requirements of paragraph (b)(ii) of this section, 17 enrolls and completes one (1) academic term as a full-time or part-time student, whichever is applicable, occurring 18 19 during the period in which the scholarship is lost. 20 21 Section 2. This act shall apply to Hathaway 22 scholarships lost during the 2006-2007 and 2007-2008 academic year for failure to make satisfactory academic 23 progress, to maintain the required grade point average or 24

1 for failure to maintain continuous enrollment, all as

2 required by law, if the scholarship recipient otherwise

3 remains eligible for the awarded scholarship pursuant to

4 law and the applicable number of full-time equivalent

5 semesters and the maximum scholarship eligibility time

6 period specified by law, including any semesters for which

7 a Hathaway scholarship was not received, have not been

8 reached.

10 **Section 3.** This act is effective immediately upon

11 completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become law

12 as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
