Wyoming homemade products.

## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to health and safety; exempting homemade
- 2 food product kitchens from licensing and inspection as
- 3 specified; modifying requirements for existing exemption
- 4 for home produced foods; providing for regulations;
- 5 providing definitions; and providing for an effective date.

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7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

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- 9 **Section 1.** W.S. 35-7-110(a)(xi), by creating new
- 10 paragraphs (xxviii) through (xxx) and by renumbering
- 11 paragraph (xxviii) as (xxxi), 35-7-119 by creating a new
- 12 subsection (f), 35-7-121(a)(i), (ii) and by creating a new
- 13 subsection (h) and 35-7-124(e) are amended to read:

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15 **35-7-110. Definitions.** 

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1 (a) As used in this act:

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(xi) "Establishment" means and includes any place or any area of any establishment in which foods, drugs, devices and cosmetics are displayed for sale, manufactured, processed, packed, held or stored but does not include Wyoming homemade product operations;

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(xxviii) "Home" means the primary residence in 9 Wyoming occupied by the residence's owner, on the condition 10 that the residence, excluding an apartment located in the 11 primary residence, contains only one (1) stove or oven used 12 13 for cooking, which may be a double oven, designed for 14 common residential usage and not for commercial usage, and that the stove or oven be operated in an ordinary kitchen 15 16 within the residence;

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nonmeat food that is natural or synthetic, with a pH level greater than four and six tenths (4.6) or a water activity value greater than eighty-five one hundredths (.85) or that requires temperature control because it is in a form capable of supporting the rapid and progressive growth of infectious or toxigenic microorganisms, the growth and

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4	(xxx) "Wyoming homemade product operation" means
5	a person who, in the person's home, produces food items
6	including, but not limited to, bakery products that are not
7	potentially hazardous foods, jams, jellies, candy, apple
8	butter and similar products and are only offered for sale
9	within the state for home consumption. "Wyoming homemade
10	product operation" does not include persons processing
11	acidic food, low acid canned foods or potentially hazardous
12	foods;

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19	(f) In addition to any other requirements provided by
20	this section, a Wyoming homemade product operation shall
21	include the following information on the label of each of
22	their food products:
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1	(1) The name, address and telephone number of
2	the business of the Wyoming homemade product operation;

6 7	(iii) The ingredients of the food product;
8	(iv) If the product is sold by weight or volume,
9	the net weight or volume of the food product in weights and
10	measures in customary use in the United States. If the
11	product is not sold by weight or volume the label shall so
12	state;
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14	(v) The date the product was produced; and
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16	(vi) A statement in not less than ten (10) point
17	type that reads "This product is home produced and not
18	subject to state inspection".
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20	35-7-121. Inspections; examinations.
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22	(a) For purposes of enforcement of this act, the
23	director or a local health department official may, upon

1 presenting appropriate credentials to the owner, operator

2 or agent in charge:

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4 (i) Enter at reasonable time any factory,

5 warehouse or establishment, not including a Wyoming

6 <u>homemade product operation</u>, in which food, drugs, devices

7 or cosmetics are manufactured, processed or packed or held

8 for introduction into commerce or after introduction or to

9 enter any vehicle being used to transport or hold the food,

10 drugs, devices or cosmetics in commerce; and

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(ii) Inspect at any reasonable times and within 12 13 reasonable limits and in a reasonable manner any factory, 14 warehouse, establishment or vehicle, not including a Wyoming homemade product operation, and all pertinent 15 equipment, finished and unfinished materials, containers 16 17 and labeling therein, and to obtain samples necessary to the enforcement of this act, except that paragraph (i) of 18 19 this subsection and this paragraph do not permit the director to inspect any establishment solely because it 20 21 holds prepackaged food, drugs or cosmetics for retail sale 22 by that establishment. The frequency of inspections shall be based on the relative food safety risk that the factory, 23 24 warehouse, establishment or vehicle presents to the public,

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such facility receiving less than one 1 with no (1) 2 inspection per year; 3 (h) All food products, including those produced and 4 5 packaged by a Wyoming homemade product operation, are subject to food sampling conducted by the director or a 6 representative of the director to determine if a food 7 product is misbranded or adulterated. In order to protect 8 9 public health, the department may adopt rules regulating Wyoming homemade product operations which may include 10 11 requiring the filing of documentation supporting the operation's classification as a Wyoming homemade product 12 13 operation and the operator's understanding of sanitary facilities and controls. 14 15 35-7-124. License required; exemptions; electronic 16 transmittals. 17 18 (e) The provisions of subsection (a) of this section 19 20 shall not apply to: 21 22 (i) Food operators or kitchens in private homes

that prepare food that is not other than potentially

hazardous food and which is prepared for sale or use at

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functions, including those operated by not for profit 1 2 charitable or religious organizations; - or 3 4 (ii) For purposes of this section, "food that is not potentially hazardous" means foods prepared in a way 5 that results in mixtures that do not support the growth of 6 microorganisms, including cakes, cookies, dinner rolls and 7 breads Wyoming homemade product operations. 8 9 Section 2. This act is effective July 1, 2008. 10 11
