6	Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

8	Section 1. W.S. 7-4-105 is created to read:

10	7-4-105. Archeological human burials.

- 1 (a) Notwithstanding W.S. 6-4-501, the county coroner
- 2 shall have jurisdiction over all human remains discovered
- 3 in the county.

- 5 (b) When human remains are discovered, the county
- 6 coroner shall determine the approximate age of the remains.
- 7 If the human remains constitute an archeological human
- 8 burial the coroner shall notify the state archeologist.

- 10 (c) An archeological human burial may be exhumed by
- 11 the state archeologist in coordination with the county
- 12 coroner.

- 14 (d) The state archeologist and coroner shall notify
- 15 and consult with appropriate native american tribes when
- 16 any archeological human burial and associated grave goods
- 17 are determined by the state archeologist to be native
- 18 american or culturally affiliated with one (1) or more
- 19 native american tribes.

21 (e) For purposes of this section:

(a) Except as provided in W.S. 7-4-105, a person who 19 opens a grave or tomb and removes a body or remains of a deceased person for any purpose without the knowledge and 20 21 consent of near relations of the deceased commits a 22 misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than seven 23 hundred fifty dollars (\$750.00).
