## A BILL

for

- AN ACT relating to the administration of government; creating the Wyoming Industry Partnership Act; providing definitions; establishing industry partnerships; providing for a grant process; establishing the industry partnership account; providing for rulemaking; requiring reports;

9 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Wyoming:

11 **Section 1.** W.S. 9-2-2901 through 9-2-2906 are created 12 to read:

2	WYOMING INDUSTRY PARTNERSHIP ACT
3	
4	9-2-2901. Short title.
5	
6	This article shall be known as the "Wyoming Industry
7	Partnership Act of 2009."
8	
9	9-2-2902. Definitions.
10	
11	(a) As used in this article:
12	
13	(i) "Council" means the Wyoming workforce
14	development council;
15	
16	(ii) "Department" means the Wyoming department
17	of workforce services;
18	
19	(iii) "Economic development entity" means a
20	group of private citizens organized as a business entity
21	authorized to do business in this state for the purpose of
22	providing financing for new, existing or expanding

1	businesses and other economic or community development
2	purposes;
3	
4	(iv) "Education or training entity" means:
5	
6	(A) Any Wyoming community college, the
7	University of Wyoming, private post secondary educational
8	institution and private school or organization providing
9	training in Wyoming which is licensed or registered under
10	W.S. 21-2-401 through 21-2-407; or
11	
12	(B) Any training facility and entity
13	approved and registered with the office of apprenticeship,
14	United States department of labor.
15	
16	(v) "Industry identified solution" means the
17	development, recruitment or retention project that develops
18	or enhances the skills of Wyoming's workforce and supports
19	an industry in meeting its workforce needs;
20	
21	(vi) "Industry partnership" means an industry
22	directed collaboration, supported by economic development,

1	education and workforce systems to address common workforce
2	needs;
3	
4	(vii) "Industry sector" means a group of
5	employers closely linked by common products or services,
6	workforce needs, similar technologies, supply chains or
7	other economic links;
8	
9	(viii) "Targeted industry sector" means an
10	industry sector identified by the department as having
11	statewide or regional economic impact, immediate workforce
12	development needs and emerging or competitive career
13	opportunities.
14	
15	9-2-2903. Industry sectors; identification.
16	
17	(a) Industry sectors identified by the department in
18	conjunction with the council, shall be based on at a
19	minimum, the following:
20	
21	(i) Economic growth potential;
22	
23	(ii) Competitiveness;

2	(iii) Employment base;
3	
4	(iv) Wages, benefits and career opportunities;
5	
6	(v) Workforce development needs;
7	
8	(vi) Importance of the industry sector to the
9	state and regional economy.
10	
11	(b) The department shall periodically evaluate the
12	industry sectors and determine the need for any
13	modifications to the targeted industry sectors.
14	
15	9-2-2904. Industry partnership; goals.
16	
17	(a) The goals of an industry partnership are to:
18	
19	(i) Foster innovation and a competitive
20	advantage in global markets;
21	
22	(ii) Organize businesses, employers, workers,
23	labor organizations and industry associations into a

1 collaborative structure that supports the sharing of

2 information, ideas and challenges common to their industry;

3

4 (iii) Identify the training needs of multiple

5 employers, especially skills critical to competitiveness

6 and innovation to the industry;

7

8 (iv) Facilitate economies of scale by

9 aggregating training and education needs of multiple

10 employers;

11

12 (v) Assist educational and training institutions

13 to align curriculum and programs to industry demand;

14

15 (vi) Assist industry partnership companies to

16 work together to identify and to address common

17 organizational and human resource challenges, such as

18 recruiting new workers, retaining incumbent workers,

19 implementing a high performance work organization, adopting

20 new technologies and fostering on-the-job learning;

1	(vii) Develop and strengthen career paths within
2	and across companies and industries to enable entry level
3	workers to improve skills and advance to higher wage jobs;
4	
5	(viii) Assist industry partnership companies to
6	attract potential employees from a diverse job seeker base,
7	including individuals with barriers to employment,
8	including job seekers who are economically disadvantaged,
9	younger workers, older workers or workers who previously
10	have been incarcerated;
11	
12	(ix) Assist employers in maintaining a constant
13	and sufficient supply of available and qualified workers;
14	
15	(x) Assist job seekers in enhancing their
16	employability, career potential and labor market rewards.
17	
18	9-2-2905. Industry partnership account; proposals;
19	grants; rulemaking.
20	
21	(a) The industry partnership account is created in
22	the department to support industry partnerships and to
23	implement industry identified solutions.

1	
2	(b) A competitive grant program shall be established
3	by the department that provides support to industry
4	partnerships and to implement industry identified
5	solutions.
6	
7	(c) Grants shall be used to meet the goals under W.S.
8	9-2-2904(a).
9	
10	(d) The department shall:
11	
12	(i) Establish grant guidelines and develop grant
13	applications;
14	
15	(ii) Develop forms and promulgate rules and
16	regulations as may be necessary to implement the provisions
17	of this section, which at a minimum shall include:
18	
19	(A) A competitive application process;
20	
21	(B) A process to review applications;

1	(C) A process for providing applicants with
2	additional information about eligibility requirements and
3	assistance in preparing applications;
4	
5	(D) A procedure for establishing
6	eligibility requirements for industry partnerships, which
7	at a minimum shall include:
8	
9	(I) Three (3) or more employers;
10	
11	(II) One (1) education or training
12	entity;
13	
14	(III) One (1) economic development
15	entity;
16	
17	(IV) One (1) person representing the
18	department; and
19	
20	(V) A private sector in-kind or cash
21	matching fund of at least twenty-five percent (25%) of a
22	grant awarded under this article.
23	

1 (e) A grant may be awarded for approved industry

2 partnership applications, subject to available funds. Any

3 proposal for a grant shall be filed with the department on

4 or before July 31 of each calendar year. A grant awarded

5 to an industry partnership shall be for a period not to

6 exceed two (2) years and shall not exceed fifty thousand

7 dollars (\$50,000.00) per year. Thereafter, no state

8 assistance shall be provided for the industry partnership

9 funded under this section.

10

11 (f) A grant may be awarded to an approved industry

12 partnership to implement industry identified solutions,

13 subject to available funds. Any proposal for a grant shall

14 be filed with the department on or before July 31 of each

15 calendar year. A grant shall not be awarded for the

16 purchase of equipment or capital construction. A grant

17 awarded to an industry partnership to implement industry

18 identified solutions shall be for a period not to exceed

19 two (2) years and shall not exceed one million dollars

20 (\$1,000,000.00) for the first year and shall not exceed

21 eight hundred seventy five thousand dollars (\$875,000.00)

22 for the second year. Thereafter, no state assistance shall

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- 1 be provided for the industry partnership to implement
- 2 industry identified solutions funded under this section.

- 4 (g) The department shall provide technical assistance
- 5 to grantees during the grant period.

6

- 7 (h) Following review of all applications submitted
- 8 under this section, the department shall notify each
- 9 applicant of the department's decision and shall provide
- 10 each applicant a written statement of reasons for approving
- 11 or denying the application. If the application is
- 12 approved, the department shall award the grant from the
- 13 amounts made available by the legislative appropriation for
- 14 purposes of this section.

15

16 9-2-2906. Evaluation; reports; rulemaking.

17

- 18 (a) The department shall create and implement an
- 19 evaluation system that:

- 21 (i) Collects critical industry partnership
- 22 information on an annual basis or more frequently as
- 23 determined by the department;

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1

2 (ii) Defines the benefits of the partnership and

3 its activities to employers, workers and communities; and

4

5 (iii) Provides performance information to the

6 public and workforce stakeholders.

7

8 (b) The department shall coordinate year-end reviews

9 of each industry partnership grantee and produce a

10 comprehensive industry sector overview report that includes

11 the results of the industry partnership grantee in meeting

12 the goals pursuant to W.S. 9-2-2904(a).

13

14 (c) The department shall consult with the council

15 before final adoption of rules and regulations under this

16 section.

17

18 (d) By September 1, 2010, the department shall report

19 to the joint minerals, business and economic development

20 interim committee on the funds awarded under this article.

21 The report shall include partnerships funded, the impact of

22 the partnerships, any industry identified solutions, the

23 impact of the industry identified solutions on current,

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- 1 projected and emerging shortages in the Wyoming economy,
- 2 industry, employer and employee participation in workforce
- 3 programs, systemic changes that benefited industries,
- 4 employers and employees, partners' ability to streamline
- 5 efforts and resources and the results of the expenditures
- 6 appropriated.

8 Section 2.

9

- 10 (a) There is appropriated fifteen million eight
- 11 hundred thousand dollars (\$15,800,000.00) from the general
- 12 fund to the department of workforce services. This
- 13 appropriation shall be for the period beginning July 1,
- 14 2009 and ending June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall
- 15 only be expended as follows:

16

- 17 (i) Eight hundred thousand dollars (\$800,000.00)
- 18 for grants awarded pursuant to W.S. 9-2-2905(e).

19

- 20 (ii) Fifteen million dollars (\$15,000,000.00)
- 21 for grants awarded pursuant to W.S. 9-2-2905(f).

1	(b) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, this
2	appropriation shall not be transferred or expended for any
3	other purpose and any unexpended, unobligated funds
4	remaining from this appropriation shall revert as provided
5	by law on June 30, 2010. This appropriation shall be
6	included in the department of workforce service's 2011-2012
7	standard biennial budget request.
8	
9	Section 3.
10	
11	(a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this
12	section, this act is effective July 1, 2009.
13	
14	(b) Section 1 of this act is effective immediately
15	upon completion of all acts necessary for a bill to become
16	law as provided by Article 4, Section 8 of the Wyoming
17	Constitution.
