- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; providing for management
- 2 of wolves as trophy game animals throughout the state;
- 3 modifying penalty provisions for improper taking of a gray
- 4 wolf; providing for taking of gray wolves in additional
- 5 situations as specified; repealing inconsistent provisions;
- 6 and providing for an effective date.

Ownership of wildlife; purpose of 5 provisions. 6 7 For the purpose of this act, all wildlife in Wyoming is the property of the state. It is the purpose of this act and 8 9 the policy of the state to provide an adequate and flexible 10 system for control, propagation, management, protection and 11 regulation of all Wyoming wildlife. There shall be no private ownership of live animals classified in this act as 12 13 big or trophy game animals or of any wolf or wolf hybrid. 14 15 23-1-302. Powers and duties. 16 17 (a) The commission is directed and empowered: 18 19 (xxix) After the date gray welves are removed 20 from the list of experimental nonessential population, 21 endangered species or threatened species in Wyoming as 22 provided by W.S. 23 1 108, to classify To manage gray 23 wolves and to regulate the taking of gray wolves as 24 predatory or trophy game animals in accordance with W.S.

23 1 304, and to regulate the number of gray wolves which 1 may be taken under a license issued under this act or as 2 3 necessary appropriate to carry out the commission's duties 4 under this act. The commission shall manage and regulate 5 the taking of gray wolves in a manner consistent with that of other trophy game and in a manner which facilitates the 6 7 removal of the gray wolf from the list of experimental nonessential population, endangered species or threatened 8 9 species in Wyoming and prevents any such future listing of 10 the gray wolf. 11 23-2-101. Fees; restrictions; nonresident application 12 13 fee; nonresident licenses; verification of residency required. 14 15 (j) Subject to W.S. 23-2-101(f), 23-1-705(e) and the 16 17 applicable fee under W.S. 23-1-701, the following hunting licenses and tags may be purchased for the fee indicated 18 and subject to the limitations provided: 19 20 21 (xliii) From and after the date Gray wolves: are 22 removed from the list of experimental nonessential 23 population, endangered species or threatened species in 24 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23 1 108:

5 (e) When hunting antelope, bighorn sheep, black bear, deer, gray wolf, mountain goat or mountain lion the longbow 6 7 hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than forty (40) pounds draw weight or possessing the ability to 8 9 cast a hunting arrow of four hundred (400) grain weight at 10 least one hundred sixty (160) yards. When hunting elk, 11 grizzly bear or moose, the longbow hunter must be equipped with a longbow of not less than fifty (50) pounds draw 12 13 weight or possessing the ability to cast a hunting arrow of 14 five hundred (500) grain weight at least one hundred sixty 15 (160) yards. The crossbow hunter must be equipped with a crossbow of not less than ninety (90) pounds draw weight 16 17 which has a minimum draw length of fourteen (14) inches (from front of bow to back of string in the cocked 18 19 position) and a positive safety mechanism. Crossbow bolts 20 must be at least sixteen (16) inches long. The broadhead 21 of arrows or bolts shall be of sharp steel with a minimum 22 cutting width of one (1) inch. The provisions of this 23 subsection relating to the hunting of antelope, bighorn 24 sheep, black bear, deer, mountain goat and mountain lion

1 shall also apply to the hunting of the gray wolf as a

2 trophy game animal from and after the date gray wolves are

23-2-303. Trapping licenses; tagging; traps and snares; penalty; confiscation; inspection; interference

11 (d) All traps and snares used for furbearing or predatory animals shall be permanently marked or tagged 12 13 with the name and address of the the owner or 14 identification number assigned to the owner bv the 15 department. Any identification number attached to a trap or snare pursuant to this subsection is solely for the use 16 17 of the department or appropriate law enforcement officers and is not a public record for purposes of W.S. 16-4-201 18 19 through 16-4-205. No trap or snare shall be set for 20 furbearing or predatory animals within thirty (30) feet of 21 any exposed bait or carcass over five (5) pounds in weight. 22 As used in this subsection, "exposed bait or carcass" means 23 the meat or viscera of any part of a mammal, bird or fish, 24 excluding dried bones. In addition, all snares used for

1 taking furbearing or predatory animals shall be equipped 2 with a break-away locking device that is designed to 3 release at two hundred ninety-five (295) pounds of pressure 4 or less and a snare loop not to exceed twelve (12) inches 5 in diameter measured side to side. Unless otherwise specified in this section, all traps, excluding snares set 6 for furbearing animals and predatory animals and quick kill 7 defined by commission rule 8 body grip traps as 9 regulation, shall be checked by the owner at least once 10 during each seventy-two (72) hour period from the time the 11 traps were set. Quick kill body grip traps shall be checked by the owner not less than once each seven (7) day 12 13 period from the time the traps were set. All wildlife 14 caught in any trap or snare shall upon discovery, be 15 removed immediately by the owner. Violation of this 16 subsection constitutes a low misdemeanor punishable as 17 provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(v). After the date gray wolves are removed from the list of experimental nonessential 18 19 population, endangered species or threatened species in 20 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23 1 108 the commission may 21 enact rules and regulations setting forth 22 specifications for traps and snares used for the taking of 23 gray wolves and the time period for checking such traps and snares. Except as otherwise provided by commission rule, 24

1 the provisions in this section regulating the trapping of

2 furbearing and predatory animals shall apply to the

3 trapping of gray wolves.

5 23-3-102. Taking certain game animals without license

6 or during a closed season prohibited.

7

8 (a) Except as provided in subsection (d) of this

9 section, any person who takes any big or trophy game animal

10 or gray wolf where classified as a trophy game animal

11 without the proper license or authority is guilty of a high

12 misdemeanor punishable as provided in W.S. 23-6-202(a)(ii).

13 The taking of each animal is a separate offense.

15 (d) Any person who knowingly takes any antlered elk,

16 antlered deer, antlered moose, horned antelope, bighorn

17 sheep, mountain goat, mountain lion, gray wolf, grizzly

18 bear or black bear without the proper license or during a

19 closed season except as otherwise permitted by this act is

20 guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not less

21 than five thousand dollars (\$5,000.00) nor more than ten

22 thousand dollars (\$10,000.00), imprisonment for not more

23 than one (1) year, or both.

1 23-3-115. Taking certain animals for damaging 2 property. 3 4 (d) Any gray wolf in the act of attacking any 5 livestock or dog may be immediately taken and killed by the owner of the livestock or dog or an employee of the owner 6 7 or lessee of the livestock or dog. The owner, employee or 8 lessee shall immediately notify the nearest game warden of the killing of a gray wolf pursuant to this subsection. 9 10 For purposes of this subsection the "act of attacking" is 11 defined as actual biting, wounding, grasping or killing of livestock or a dog, or chasing, molesting or harassing by a 12 13 wolf that would indicate to a reasonable person that 14 actual, biting, wounding, grasping or killing of livestock 15 or a dog is likely to occur at any moment. 16 23-3-304. Certain trapping devices unlawful; game for 17 18 bait prohibited; baiting big game animals prohibited; 19 penalties. 20 21 (a) No person shall take or wound any game animal, 22 game bird, or game fish by use of any pit, pitfall, net, trap, deadfall, poison, or other similar device except as 23 24 otherwise provided. From and after the date gray wolves are

1 removed from the list of experimental nonessential

2 population, endangered species or threatened species in

3 Wyoming as provided by W.S. 23 1 108, gray wolves may be

4 taken with a trap or snare only as allowed by and in

5 accordance with rules and regulations of the commission.
