## A BILL

for

- 1 AN ACT relating to game and fish; expanding area where
- 2 wolves are designated as trophy game animals; providing for
- 3 management of at least fifteen breeding pairs of wolves in
- 4 the state as specified; providing for a memorandum of
- 5 understanding with the national park service; and providing
- 6 for an effective date.

"Trophy game animal" shall include any gray wolf within those tracts of land within the following described area, subject to modification authorized in this subdivision: northwest Wyoming beginning at the east boundary of the Shoshone National Forest and the Wyoming Montana state line; southerly along said forest boundary to the common boundary between the Shoshone National Forest and the Wind River Indian Reservation; westerly and then southeasterly along the Shoshone National Forest boundary to the Union Pass Road (USFS Road 263); southerly along said road until it intersects the north boundary of the Upper Green River Cattle Association's grazing allotment on forest service lands; following the eastern boundary of said allotment southerly and westerly to the point it intersects the Bridger Teton National

Forest boundary; westerly along said forest boundary to 1 2 U.S. Highway 189 191; northwesterly along said highway to 3 U.S. Highway 26 89 191 at Hoback Junction; northerly along 4 said highway to Wyoming Highway 22; westerly along said 5 highway to the Wyoming Idaho state line; north along said state line to the Wyoming Montana state line; north and 6 7 then east along said state line to the east boundary of the 8 Shoshone National Forest junction of Wyoming Highway 120 9 and the Wyoming-Montana state line; southerly along Wyoming 10 Highway 120 to the Greybull River; southwesterly up said 11 river to the Wood River; southwesterly up said river to the 12 Shoshone National Forest boundary; southerly along said 13 boundary to the Wind River Indian Reservation boundary; 14 westerly, then southerly along said boundary to the Continental Divide; southeasterly along said divide to the 15 Middle Fork of Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to 16 17 Boulder Creek; westerly down said creek to the Bridger-Teton National Forest boundary; northwesterly along said 18 19 boundary to its intersection with U.S. Highway 189-191; 20 northwesterly along said highway to the intersection with 21 U.S. Highway 26-89-191; northerly along said highway to 22 Wyoming Highway 22 in the town of Jackson; westerly along 23 said highway to the Wyoming-Idaho state line; north along 24 said state line to the Wyoming-Montana state line; north,

2 (xxx) To pursue entering into memoranda of
3 agreement with the states of Idaho and Montana to cooperate
4 in the capture, transport, exchange and release of gray
5 wolves into and out of those areas of the state where the
6 gray wolf is not listed as a predator as the commission
7 deems necessary to assure genetic interchange among the
8 populations of gray wolves within the three (3) states.

## 23-1-304. Classification of gray wolves.

(a) The commission shall by rule and regulation establish areas within the state where gray wolves are classified as trophy game animals and set seasons and bag limits within those areas. The areas designated, seasons and bag limits shall be set annually in a manner the commission determines, through rule and regulation, only as necessary to reasonably ensure:

(i) At least seven (7) breeding pairs of gray wolves are located in this state and primarily outside of Yellowstone National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway at the end of the current calendar year; and

2 (ii) If the national park service has entered into a memorandum of understanding with the commission 3 4 regarding the management of gray wolves within Yellowstone 5 National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway, at least fifteen (15) 6 7 breeding pairs of gray wolves are located within the state. 8 9 The commission shall promulgate (n) rules and regulations providing for issuance of annual permits to 10 11 landowners or livestock owners for removing wolves which are harassing, injuring, maiming or killing livestock or 12 13 other domesticated animals and for wolves occupying geographic areas where chronic wolf predation occurs. 14 permits shall be issued as long as there are seven (7) 15 16 breeding pairs within the state and outside of Yellowstone 17 National Park, Grand Teton National Park and John D. Rockefeller, Jr. Memorial Parkway the management objectives 18 19 described in subsection (a) of this section are met. 20 rules shall provide for suspending or cancelling permits if 21 further lethal control could cause relisting of wolves 22 under the endangered species act.
